

AT THE GOVERNMENT HOUSE AT OTTAWA

Thursday the 15th February 1923

PRESENT:

HIS EXCELLENCY

THE GOVERNOR GENERAL IN COUNCIL:

WHEREAS the Department of Highways of the province of Saskatchewan has applied to the Department of Indian Affairs for 14.14 acres of land, in the Qu'Appelle Industrial School lands in Tp. 21, R.13, W2M., for roads as shown on the following plans,-

Rd. 1972-A, through the	N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 2	2.19 acres.
	S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 10	4.02

These lands are to be given in exchange for the portion of the Southern Qu'Appelle trail abandoned through the same lands, shown on Provincial Highway plan No. 799.

Rd. 1985, portion containing $\frac{4}{100}$ of an acre, in S.E. corner of Industrial School lands, in N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 2.

Rd. 1973, parcels in the S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 11, containing $\frac{83}{100}$ of an acre, comprising parcels B. and C.

portion in the N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 11 -	4.4 acres
portion in the W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 14 -	2.66 acres

AND WHEREAS the Indian Commissioner at Regina has recommended that the lands be granted to the Province free of charge, and the Provincial Government has agreed to fence the roads when demanded;

THEREFORE/

Decision affirmed 16 May 23

THEREFORE His Excellency the Governor General
 in Council, on the recommendation of the Superintendent
 General of Indian Affairs and under the provisions of
 Section 46 of the Indian Act as amended by Section 1 of
 Chapter 14, 1-2 George V, is pleased to authorize and
 doth hereby authorize the transfer of the above mentioned
 lands to the Province of Saskatchewan.
