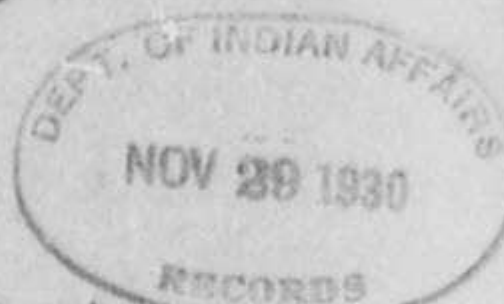

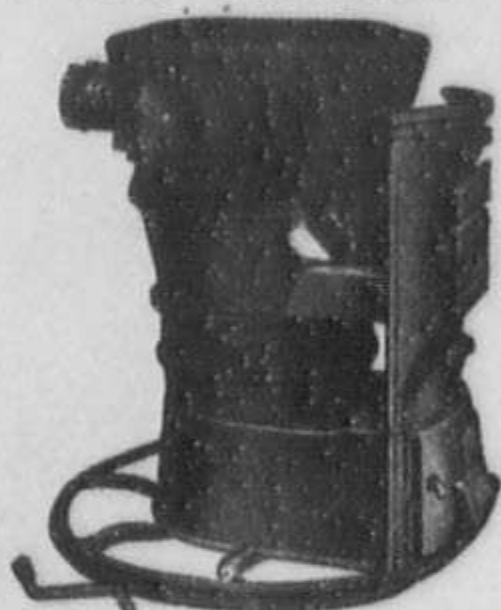

for repairs to the Kelvinator here.

Dear Sir:

For your information I wish to explain that the above account was incurred through some short-circuit somewhere in the wiring of the building.

We have two currents here, 110 volt and 220 volt, and through a grounding this current crossed over and burned the motor and fittings in connection with the Kelvinator.

I had an Electrician also the town Electric Power Superintendent go over the wiring to see if they could locate the trouble. They were able to rectify the trouble, but were not certain as to just what was the primary cause. They supposed that some of the insulation had been partially stripped through a sharp edge some of the conduit and that this had gradually burned through, and so allowed the heavy current to ground through the building.

It is difficult to place the blame as the men who made the examination felt they could not definitely state who was responsible.

I am very sorry that this occurred but it could not have been avoided as it happened suddenly and without any warning. Trusting this is sufficient information.

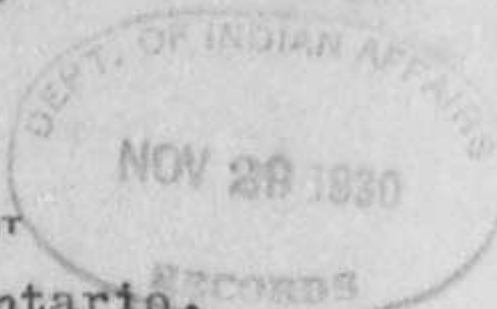

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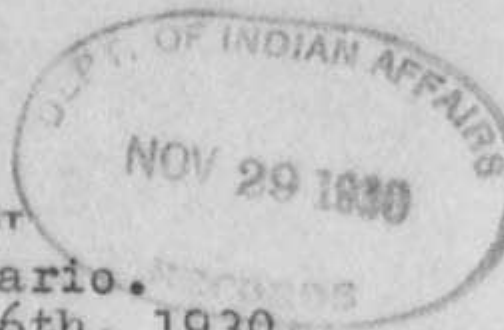

Dear Sir,

Referring to our letter of Sept. 11th.  
last and to yours of April 24th. The Grease  
Trap was installed as authorized, but this has  
not eliminated the trouble.

Mr. Rose, engineer for the Dominion Water  
Power Branch was here yesterday and suggests we  
ask Kelly & Kimberley to bore down through the  
Sump to see if it is possible to get into Gravel  
so as to get better seepage. If this can be found  
the sump can be dug deeper, but if not we would  
have to run a trench about four or five hundred  
feet and timber this, which could be used as a  
disposal bed, or another sump dug adjoining the  
present one divided with bulkheads so as to make  
an extra grease trap, to prevent Grease, Soap etc.  
going into the sump.

At the present time, the sump has to be  
pumped out after every wash day as the water will  
not seep away.

On the receipt of the written report of  
the Dominion Water Power Branch, we will forward  
it on to you, but on the advice of Mr. Rose we  
have instructed Kelly & Kimberley to pump out the  
sump and make the necessary borings. This will  
cost in the neighbourhood of \$25:00 or \$30:00.

We shall be glad to have authority to  
carry out the advice of the Dominion Water Power  
Branch.

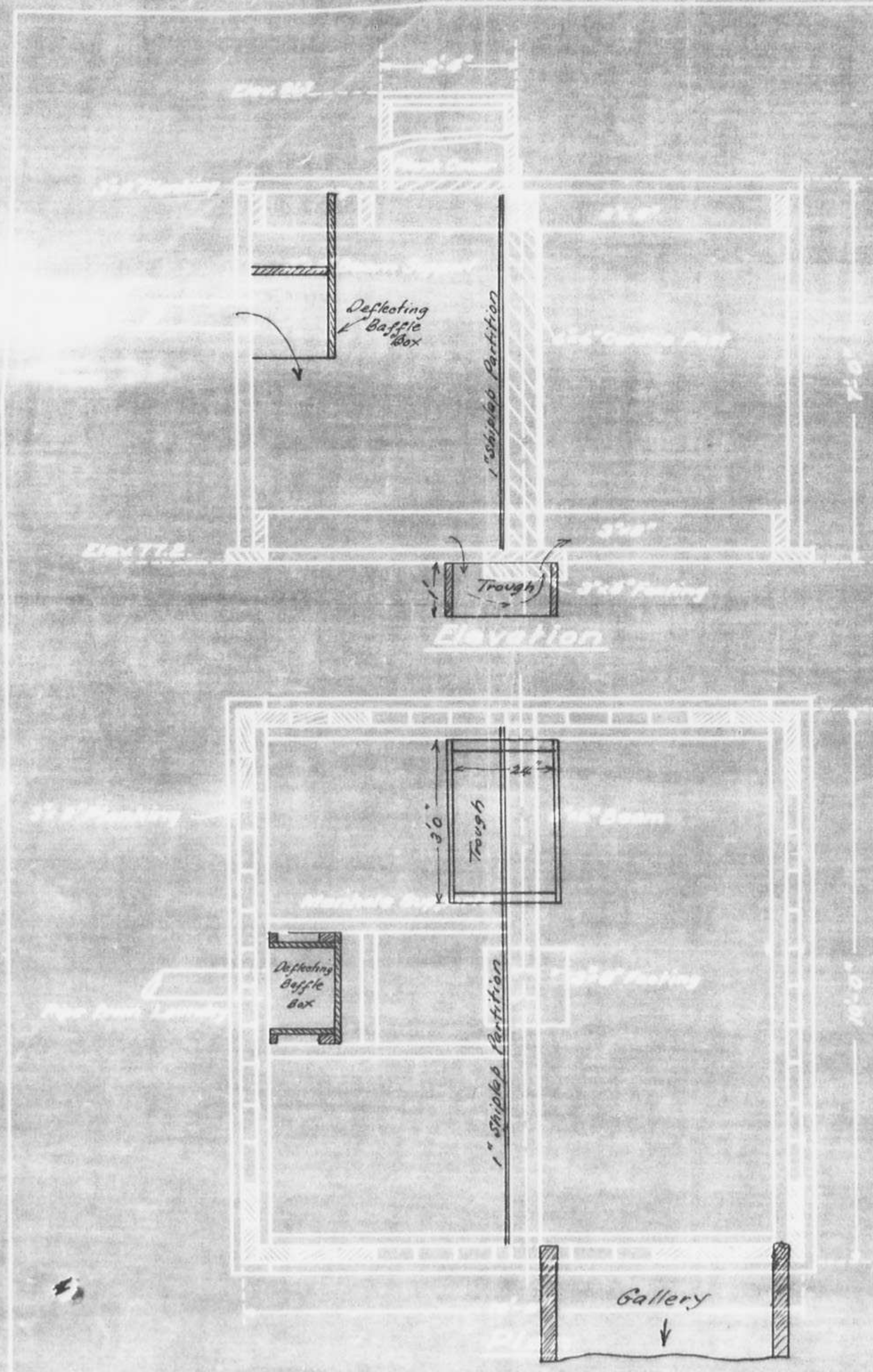

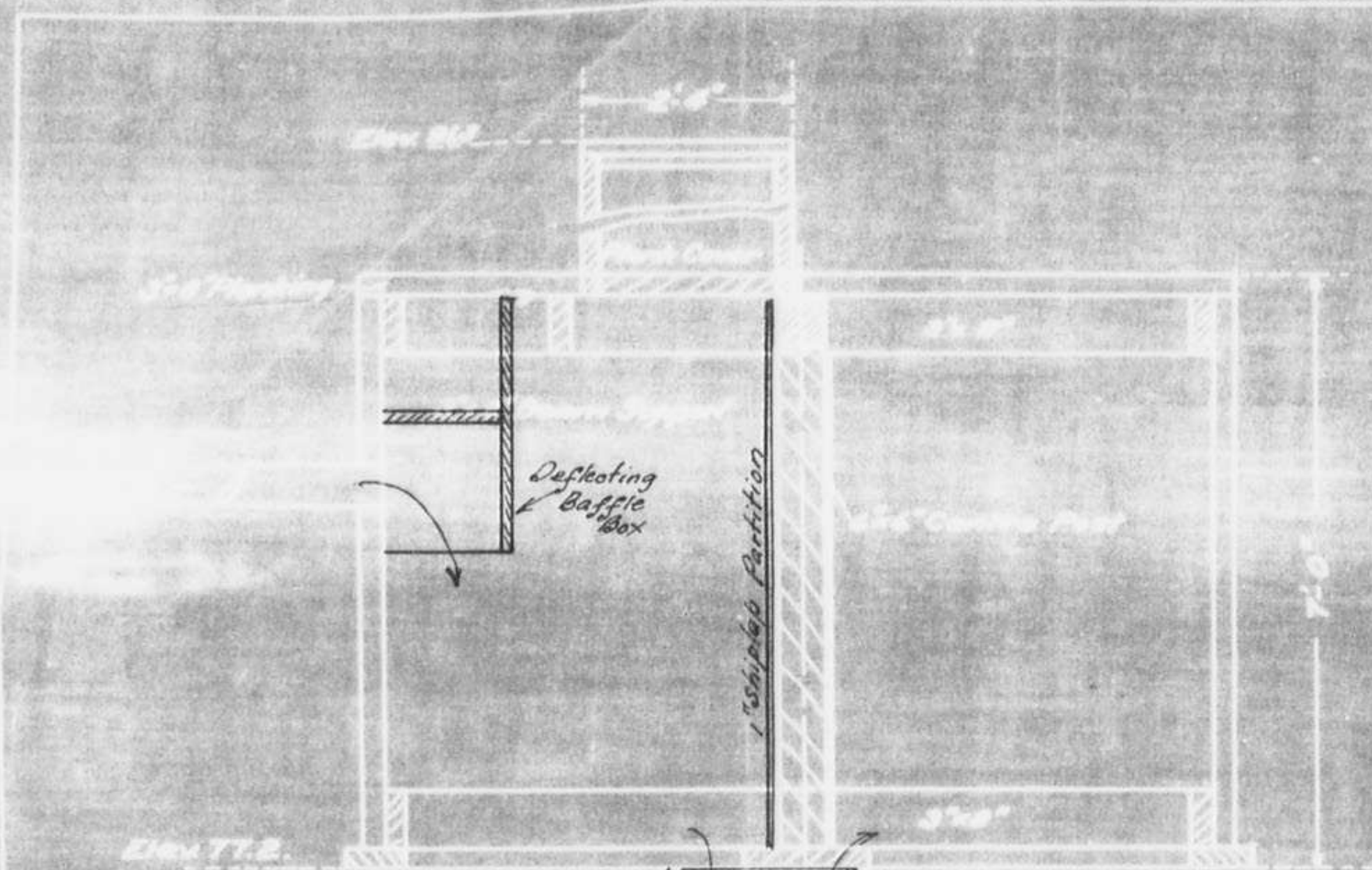

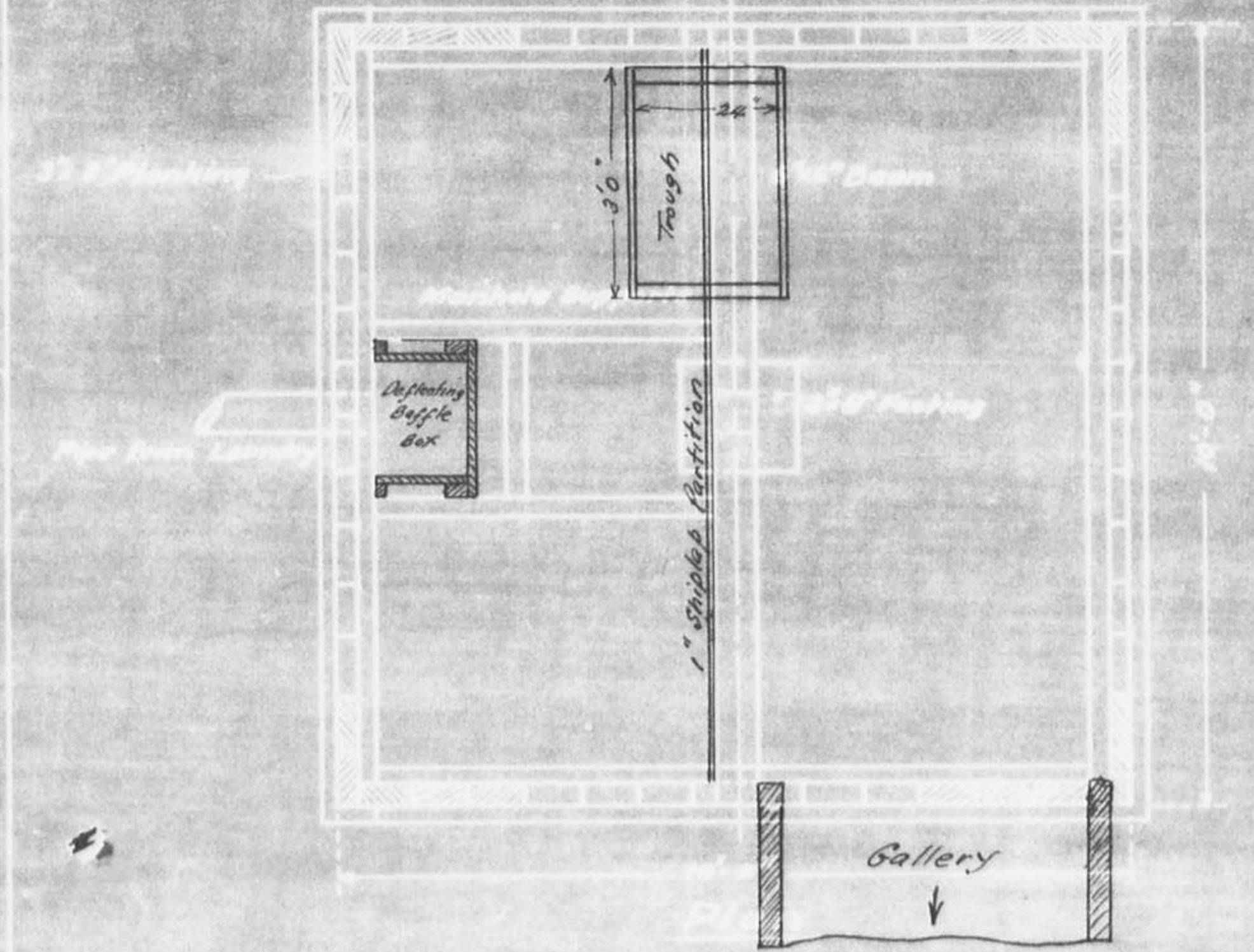
