



Enclosed please find the account of the Halifax Infirmary, and Doctor Arthur L. Murphy, for tonsil work, authorized in your letter of September 21st, 1938. Six cases only were done. Doctor MacInnes, in his examination of the children, found that sixteen should be done. We took eight to the Infirmary, but two were not done - one on account of a slight infection of the throat, and another on account of a cold. About the same time, we had an epidemic of whooping cough, and considered it not advisable to have the other ten done. No doubt in the next examination they will be included in the number for tonsillectomy, along with a few of the new ones who have come since the last examination. As it is near the close of the year, it might be that your funds for this work have been spent, if so, will you let me know and we will pay the account from school funds, with the hope that the school will be reimbursed later.






