With further reference to your letter of the 26th of October last, Ref. 116820-22, respecting certain lands at Battleford required for an Indian Industrial School, I am directed to say that the Surveyor General, to whom the matter was referred, reports as follows:-

"It was understood here that the reposting of the lots in the townsite of Battleford was to be limited to the lots which had not been disposed of, and D. L. S. Laurie, who re-posted them, was so instructed. The information supplied to him was obtained from the Patent Branch and did not indicate that the lots reserved for the Indian Industrial School had been disposed of; they were accordingly reposted by Mr. Laurie in conformity with his instructions.

"Mr. Laurie's work being completed, it is too late to instruct him that he is not to plant any stakes within the boundaries of the lands assigned for the use of the school."

I am to add that, of course, it is not proposed to interfere with the lands held by your Department under Order in Council for Industrial School purposes.

Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 16th Oct, last, No. 82-44 I beg to inform you that the Surveyor (D.L.S. Laurie) was instructed by the Surveyor General of the Department of Interior to post the lots in the town site of Battleford which had not been disposed of. The information supplied to him, it appears was obtained from the patent branch, it did not indicate that the lots reserved for the Indian Industrial school had been disposed of; they were accordingly reported by Mr. Laurie in conformity with his instructions. Mr. Laurie's work being completed it is too late to instruct him not to plant any posts within the boundaries of the lands assigned for the use of the schools.

There is no intention, whatever, to interfere with the lands held by this Department under Order in Council for this, or for the purposes of any other Industrial school.

The Principal of the school should leave all posts planted by Mr. Laurie in the ground which do not interfere with his agricultural or other operations. Where necessary he may have the posts pulled up.

The Deputy Minister of Interior, in a letter of 17th ult. to this Dept., stated that a communication had been received from Hon. Walter Scott applying on behalf of his Govt. for a grant of the fractional S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 22, Tp. 43, R. 16, W. 3rd M., and also for the fractional N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 15, same Tp., for the purpose of establishing thereon an institution for the care of insane persons.

By O.C. of 1st Oct., 1890, certain lands - containing an area of over 300 acres - in Tp. 43, R. 16, W. of 3rd M. and also town lots in the town-plot of S. Battleford, were set apart by the Dept. of the Interior for the Battleford Ind'l school. The N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 15, Tp. 43, R. 16, W. 3rd M. applied for by the Premier of Sask. forms part of the lands set apart for the school by the above mentioned O.C. It has never been used, however, by the school, and is not required by it. It is on the north side of the river and the school is on the south.

The report to Council herewith for the Minister's signature provides, therefore, for the relinquishment of the quarter section to the Dept. of the Interior, to deal with as it sees fit.

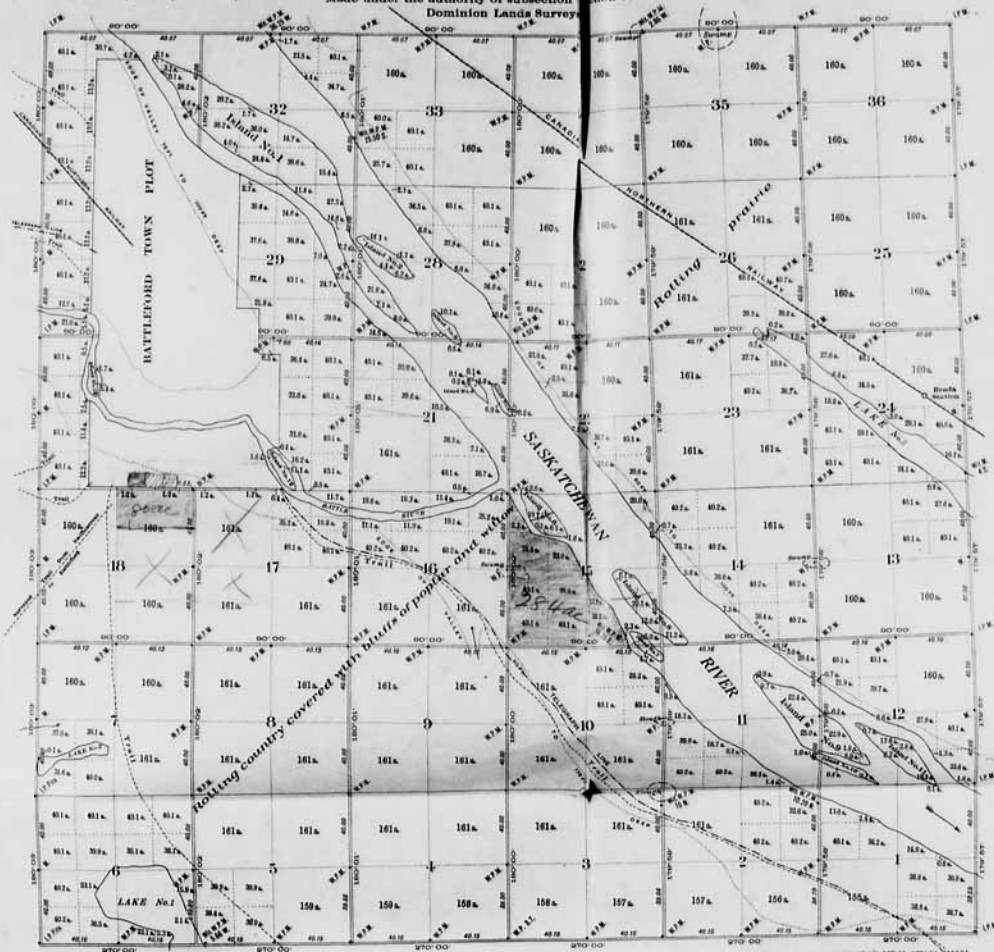

I would like to draw your attention to the fact that my present house, which is in a delapidated condition, is situated near the edge of a very steep bank which is undermined with springs, and large pieces of it are continually falling away. At the present rate, it is only a matter of a few months, and possibly weeks, until the house is liable to go over the bank. Should the Department see fit to grant me a new building, I would recommend that there should be sufficient ground secured, on which to build the balance of the Agency buildings, such as the Clerk's house, Office, Warehouse, Blacksmith Shop, etc. These will be needed in a very few years. At the present time the Agency buildings are very much scattered and some of them are located in the middle of the surveyed streets.

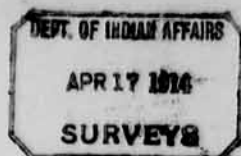

Please draw Mr. Scott's attention to the remarks of Agent Rowland in regard to the advisability of securing sufficient land on which to locate all the Agency buildings at Battleford.

If the Agency headquarters are to remain at Battleford, we will have to build a residence next year for the Agent, and in the near future other buildings, which should be grouped about the Agent's residence conveniently.

Steps should now be taken to secure the necessary land. It might be well to ask Inspector Chisholm to report what area will be required, and where it should be located for Agency purposes, keeping in view the most central position for the Agent's headquarters.
