With reference to the enclosed account from E. C. Thompson for \$46.00 for breaking down wall, and grading in fill in front of the Residential School.



When the Day School was removed from its original location in front of the Residential School the cement wall of the basement which was left was found to be in such a poor condition that it was considered unsafe for the children; also, it was detrimental to the appearance of the Residential School. In view of these circumstances and the fact that the bulldozer was being used in the vicinity at that time, I took it upon myself to have the bulldozer knock down the cement wall and fill in the hole. This work required the use of the bulldozer for four hours at \$10.00 and the foreman's time for the same period at \$1.50 per hour.

If this work had been done at a later date the cost of conveying the bulldozer to and from the job would have increased this amount by an additional \$20.00.

Voucher is attached hereto and I would request that authority be granted for the payment of this account.

Re: Repairs to Basement Floors,
Alberni Indian Residential
School

With reference to the memorandum of the 29th ultimo signed by Mr. D.J. Allan, with which was enclosed a copy of correspondence from Mr. A.E. Caldwell, School Principal, and Indian Commissioner MacKay, on the subject of the above; our Chief Architect states as follows:

"It has not yet been definitely determined, notwithstanding the contrary opinion of laymen, whether the leakage of sub-floor water supply lines at the Alberni Residential School, which has now been stopped, was the sole cause of the dampness that appeared in the concrete basement floor slabs.

It is therefore recommended that no action be taken to permanently finish the floors, from which linoleum was removed, until the spring run-off has shown conclusively whether or not any moisture is liable to penetrate beneath the floor slabs through or under the concrete footings of the external walls.

If upon examination during that period no dampness is apparent in the concrete floor slabs, it is proposed that the slabs be prepared to receive flexible asbestos-asphalt floor tile laid in accordance with a specification which will be furnished by our Architectural Section.

If, on the other hand, it is found during the spring run-off that the floor slabs are again showing signs of moisture, it will be evident that there is an infiltration of water from the outside of the building and precautions would have to be taken to prevent such ingress before work in connection with the re-surfacing of basement floors is undertaken.

It is our intention to request Mr. Webb of the Dominion Water and Power Bureau, Vancouver, to keep himself informed in regard to the condition of the basement floor area and to assign one of his engineers to make inspections as necessary during the coming spring and to report to this office in order that we may issue instructions for whatever action is indicated to be carried out as soon as possible thereafter."



Sanitary Conditions

General conditions in this school leave little to be desired in the way of general cleanliness. It was noted however that the floors in the kitchen were all a rough cement finish, and no doubt a considerable problem to keep clean. The Principal informs me that these floors are washed daily and that the corridors in the diningroom are done at the same time. The floor space underneath the tables are washed once a week. The Principal complains that he has considerable difficulty retaining kitchen staff because of the cement floors. I have heard complaints of a similar nature at other schools where the kitchen floors are of the same type.



I am enclosing a copy of a letter dated Jan. 31st from Mr. A. E. Caldwell, Principal, Alberni Indian Residential School, regarding replacement of the worms that feed the coal in the automatic stokers of the school heating boilers.

Dear Mr. Garrard:

We find that we need replacement of the worms that feed the coal on the automatic stokers on both the heating boilers. One worm has completely gone and that boiler had to be discontinued today. The other is also badly worn and will not last long. In the meantime we are carrying on with this one boiler, which is nearly adequate as long as mild weather continues.

These worms are for the Iron Firemen Stoker, Size 2, Serial number C.A. 19077. The Agents are Canadian Sumner Iron Works, 3550 East Broadway, Vancouver.

May I request that both of these worms be replaced immediately as an emergency. The engineer is keeping the one stoker dis-assembled until the replacement is made.




