

I am in receipt of Mr. Mills' memorandum of December 13th in connection with an account from Letson & Burpee.

Indian Agent Todd submitted a voucher in favour of this firm on September 9, 1939, and the following reply was forwarded to him at that time:

"Purchase order form No. 24305 issued by the District Chief Engineer of the Dominion Water & Power Bureau, distinctly states that the cost of the straps would be \$16.80 f.o.b. Alert Bay. The account received from Letson & Burpee requests payment for sales tax, cartage and freight. In view of the statement made on the purchase order form that the price of \$16.80 was f.o.b. Alert Bay the Representative of the Treasury is not prepared to pay the account at the amount of \$19.04. A new account should be submitted for \$16.80 only."

You will note from the above, and this is confirmed in the copy of Mr. Webb's letter which you sent with your memorandum, that the original purchase order was issued for \$16.80 only. If Mr. Webb considers that the firm is entitled to \$19.04 he should issue another purchase order and send same to Mr. Todd who will then submit the account and the amended purchase order to this Branch.




Dear Sir:

Dear Sir,

With reference to Departmental circular 502/606, 150-65 of February 10th, 1938, it is necessary to advise that a 30' extension ladder at the school has developed a condition of dry rot, causing rungs to snap off and rendering the ladder unsafe for the evacuation of pupils from the school infirmaries.

This ladder was given for the specific purpose mentioned above and its replacement or an authorization to build a platform requested in letter to you of December 16th, 1939, is an urgent need.

Even should the platform be sanctioned, consideration of the purchase of a 40' ladder is requested for use as a fire emergency ladder. Should for any reason the fire escapes and back of the school be cut off by fire, it may be absolutely essential to use a ladder of this type to clear the upper dormitories.

The necessary tenders on this equipment are attached hereto.






The enclosed copy of correspondence received from Principal Anfield of St. Michael's School will be self-explanatory.
