

Dear Sir:

Rev. Father Mackey reports that Clara Ginnish a pupil of his school from the Burnt Church Reserve has been found to be suffering from advanced tuberculosis and should be removed from the school. The Department thinks it right that she should go back to people whom she knows. Kindly see if arrangements can be made for her accommodation with some Indian family at Burnt Church where there are no young children and where she would be reasonably comfortable. The report on her condition is not very hopeful. If no such arrangement can be made you may have to consider sending her to the sanatorium at Bathurst and you may do this without further correspondence if you find it necessary.

Father Mackey will receive a copy of this letter and you and he may arrange between you for the removal of the girl. The Department has read your letter of August 4th, 1932 in which you recommend her admission to school and judging from it would think her home conditions might not be at all satisfactory.
