Attention of the Supt. of Welfare & Training

Re: Edmonton Indian Residential School

Enclosed herewith please find two requisitions, one for parts required to repair plumbing and heating system, and the other one for showers and washbasins.

The Principal of the school submits a long list of supplies, which are required to bring the existing plant to proper efficiency. He states that if the material could be made available, most of the repair work required to be done, could be attended to during the summer holidays by the members of the school staff and with no additional cost to the Department. Many pipes show signs of being eaten right through, and in attempting to replace a section it gives way.

In regard to the showers and washbasins for the boys, it was noted on our first inspection of this school that the washbasins were in very bad condition, and it is understood that they were the subject of criticism by the Sanitary Engineer. The Principal would prefer two stainless steel troughs with overhead taps, so that the boys could wash their hands and faces under the taps and where there would be a continuous flow of water.

In regard to the showers in the washroom, there would originally appear to have been three showers, but two of them have completely disappeared and the one remaining is unusable. The Principal indicated that he had found these showers were indispensable. By using them it was possible to avoid the spread of skin diseases, and he contended that the showers were much more suitable than bathtubs. In this we were in agreement.

These requisitions are submitted in the hope that they will be favorably considered and orders placed for the supplies and articles mentioned therein.

a slightly higher price for the No. 3.





Dimensional Drawing




Model 40 for Regular Bowl

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## Construction








DIMENSIONAL DRAWING LP40

I am enclosing herewith a voucher in the sum of \$125.00 for the pumping out and cleaning of the Septic Tank at this institution.



When you stop to think that it had not been cleaned out for over five years, you can possibly imagine the accumulation of filth that had to be removed.

If you cannot locate the letter of authority I refer to, I think the Provincial Health Inspector's report & the recommendation of Dr. Stone and Mr. Inspector Gooderham would be sufficient authority ~~XXXXXX~~.
