Dear Sir:

Following his inspection of conditions of the Laundry Sump at the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian School, Mr. Rose has made certain suggestions, which, if carried out, may improve the existing unsatisfactory situation.

Mr. Rose states that the Contractor has been employed to pump out the sump and bore test holes in an endeavor to locate a gravel bed. If gravel is located, it is intended to open up the sump to obtain drainage to this gravel layer, and then test out the sump with clear water. With satisfactory drainage of clear water demonstrated it is then proposed to divide tank with a baffle to retain the grease in one part of the sump and keep the remainder more or less clear of grease and therefore, more effective for drainage. The accompanying plan shows the general location and plan for the proposed baffle and also for the trough connecting the two divisions of the sump.

Personally, I am not expecting that any gravel bed will be found; in which case it will be necessary to enlarge the capacity of the sump. This is proposed to accomplish by digging a tunnel and constructing a gallery, as outlined on the accompanying plan. Planking for the sides of this gallery should be spaced with a 2" interval, between planks and the roof must be made to withstand the earth pressure from above.

These suggestions, if carried out, should give a measure of relief, but at frequent intervals, it will be necessary to remove from the sump, the accumulation of grease. I would expect that in time even this enlarged sump would prove ineffective owing to the saturation of the surrounding sand with grease and etc. This School was apparently located without any consideration being given to drainage conditions. The only natural drainage leads to the source of water supply; i.e. Round Lake. The nature of the ground renders the disposal of the laundry sump underground, a very difficult matter. However, to lead the laundry drainage by drains to obtain surface

drainage would bring the outlet down fairly close to Round Lake; in fact, so close to the source of the water supply for the School, that contamination of the water supply might occur. It is for this reason that the idea of putting in a sump to get rid of the drainage from the laundry was first conceived, and experience has shown that the nature of the sand or soil, is not favorable for rapid drainage. I am hopeful, however, that with this enlarged sump, and with frequent clearing out of the grease from the first part of the sump, will give a more satisfactory service, than has hitherto been obtained.

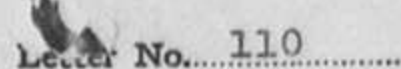

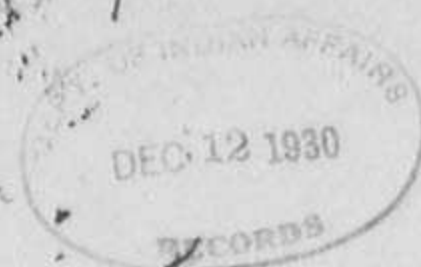
