

You will notice from the statement enclosed that the full amount came to \$1330.75. From this had to be deducted the amount of board which was credited to the school, of \$233.00, leaving a balance of \$1097.75 due for wages. I have paid out the \$800.00 advanced and sent to me by the Department, and Mr. Lett advanced the difference, of \$297.75, for which I am enclosing a voucher, No. 301K. Mr. Lett advises me that the Department has this amount to the credit of the buildings in Ottawa.

Sir,-

I am in receipt of your letter of the 26th November, with which you forwarded certain pay-sheets, etc., in connection with work on the cottages adjacent to Lytton Residential School. The paylists in question should be made out in duplicate in accordance with instructions contained in official letter of the 30th July. There is an error of \$20.00 in the addition of the pay-sheet for the 31st October. If you received \$297.75 from Mr. Lett to complete the payment of men's wages you should forward a receipt ~~from him~~ to be attached to the voucher, for that amount, which you submitted in his favour.

The expenditure authorized in the official letter of July 30th was \$3,000.00, but the accounts amount to \$1,876.22 and the pay-sheets to \$1,310.75, or an aggregate of \$3,186.97, which is \$186.97 in excess of the amount authorized.

Sir,-

I am in receipt of your letter of the 26th November with which you forwarded certain vouchers, one of which is in favour of Mr. Wm. M. Orr, amounting to \$108.40 and covers expenditure in connection with the erection of two cottages at St. George's Residential School, and in reply I may say that before dealing with the matter of payment, the Department desires particulars regarding the charge in the said voucher for eight railway fares from Chilliwack to Lytton and return. You should state whether Mr. Orr made the said trips purely on business in connection with the erection of the cottages or whether he went from Chilliwack to Lytton to transact private business. If the latter was the case it is considered that the Department should not be charged with his travelling expenses.

The question of the payment of the voucher mentioned will not be dealt with until your report is received.



Dear Mr. Scott-;

Re. your telegram concerning the possible postponement of the building of the New School. I answered same stating that "Delay would mean great inconvenience and grave risk practically impossible to wait" From the point of view of the former.

1. The school is now so far away from the farm that the boys are obliged to drive one half mile to do the milking. This means out of bed at five o'clock in the A.M. in order to be back for breakfast with the milk for seven.

2. In some cases when the farm work is being done on the north east of the farm the men & boys are obliged to travel about one mile to their work. This naturally curtails a great deal of lost time & money in the payment of staff whereas if the school were moved to the new site the greater part of this lost time would be taken up in actual work as the school would then be situated in the middle of operations. By this move being done it would not only save me the worry of seeing so much unnecessary waste of time but would also help financially.

3. I am now living one half mile away from the school having just completed the cottage which I spoke of occupying for the few intervening months expecting the School to be built on block or the greater part beginning next spring. This will continue for over a year or perhaps two the extra running entailed.

4. The constant fear of staff resigning owing to the unalterable inconveniences through unsanitary conditions & lack of equipment.

5. Having to haul water to auxilliate the present exhaustive supply, & very often necessitating the carrying of water to flush closets in the dormitories.

Grave Risk.

1. Overcrowding of dormitories and the evils attached to it.
2. No separation older from younger pupils. We have what we might call divisions in the boys dormitories but the girls are all together.

3. No isolation for sick. Contagious diseases must needs be let run riot.

Cold building. Drafty, Heating system overradiated. Children at the present time have heavy colds & do not seem able to shake them. Two children are in the hospital having developed pneumonia.

5. Insufficient water for sanitary purposes & fire protection. Being irrigation ditch which is full of disease germs keeping us in constant dread of disease outbreak.

6. Insufficient sanitary equipment



Co. asking them to refrain from putting anything into the way of the Dept. which might hinder you from building the coming spring. The Bishop was not a little disappointed at the state of the buildings on the whole especially noting the foundations of the old part of the building. No doubt you have heard something from him by this time. The N.E.CO. appointed him visiting Bishop before he left England & as this will be his Diocesan School he is interested in its welfare.

I do hope you will be able to go on with the building next spring we need it so badly from so many viewpoints. The building of a New School would relieve us all of so many difficulties and risks to the health & morals of the children.

Sir,-

Referring to your letter of the 11th instant, I beg to say that the voucher for \$277.75 which you submitted in favour of the Rev. A. R. Lett, of St. George's School, Lytton, as an advance on wages paid carpenters in building cottages in connection with the school, has been paid. The paylists for wages have been credited against the advance, but I may say that the note on the paylists in regard to \$233.00 for board of men is not sufficiently explicit. Kindly report in the matter stating whether the amount was deducted from the men's wages and paid to the school, or whether the men were boarded at the school without charge. The matter should be made perfectly clear.


