In this connection, it is noted that Dr. G. M. Stultz is not prepared to accept the rates mentioned in official letter of June 13th, last. The Department will take steps to make early arrangement for future dental services at this school. In the meantime, if any of the pupils are in urgent need of dental attention, you may arrange with any local dentist to perform the work required, keeping all expenses for the purpose as low as possible. Only extractions or fillings are to be made. Accounts in duplicate, properly certified by yourself, in favour of the dentist who performs the work, should be forwarded to the Department for payment.

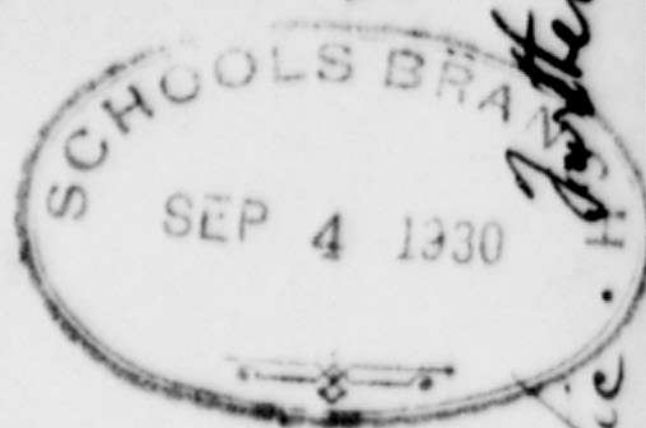

Reverend Sir,

The Department has received an account of Dr. MacInnis for the month of August, and I must point out that the expenditure authorized for removal of tonsils has been much exceeded. This will be apparent on reference to Department's letter of July 25th, which provides for the services of a surgical nurse for a period not exceeding six days. Before payment of the account can be considered it will be necessary for you to furnish the Department with the names of all the personnel engaged in the work and a statement of the part each person took in it. It will also be necessary to secure receipts for payments to be made to anyone except Dr. MacInnis. It might be an advantage if you would mention any difficulties you had in arranging this work, and the reasons which have lead to an increase in cost.

Dear Sir:

In reply to your letter of Sept. 5th. inst. I would like you to consider this letter as confidential. I have at least once in the past refused to sign the vouchers of Dr. McInnis.

As for the tonsils I talked the matter over with the Doctor and in fact he read the letters of July 3rd. and 25th. During the time of the operations ^{he} figured it out that should he take the fee of \$ 20.00 for each case, he would make more money than he would by that provided in your letter of July 25th. I felt then that there would be trouble but it was too late then to halt matters.

For my own part. Two of the Sisters including the nurse were called to Halifax for their annual retreat of ten days. I saw immediately that with over ninety children in the house, we could not give the necessary attention. Besides that I was nervous about leaving the children with anyone who was not a nurse, especially immediately after they left the operating room. Therefore I engaged two nurses. Dr. J.B. Reid brought a nurse with him ~~for the~~ to assist in the operating room. My sister arrived the same day, and since she is a graduate nurse I put her to work also. So in all we had two Doctors and four nurses, one in with the doctors, two to attend the children immediately before and after

the operation. The two nurses I engaged were on duty day and night. My sister the relieving for them. These nurses were kept busy from Tuesday morning till the following Sunday when they returned to Halifax. I paid them \$ 25.00 each from the School funds and charged it up to extra labor. The nurse Dr. Reid brought with him was on duty only during the actual time of operating, three days.

Now the way The Doctor worked it out was this: 31 cases at \$ 20.00 gives \$ 620.00 For Dr. Reid \$ 300.00 Nurses at \$ 5.00 a day \$ 65.00 Himself \$ 155.00 Balance \$ 100.00 to be divided ~~among~~ between himself and Dr. Reid.

When I heard that I made up my mind that I would take the money coming to the two nurses I had engaged and return the fifty dollars to the School fund. Otherwise I felt that there would be so much more to divide and I think I know where the larger share would go. I must say that Dr. Reid seemed quite satisfied to accept what the Dept. had stipulated.

My suggestion is that is that you pay Dr. McInnis five dollars a case \$ 155.00 Dr. Reid \$ 300.00 The operating room nurse I think should receive \$6_.00 a day or \$ 18.00 for her share of the work. If you could include the nurses share with Dr. Reid it would be convenient, as she works with him a good deal. I don't know her name. We should like reimbursement for the dinners, mid-afternoon lunches and my cigarrets. If I were as grasping as some people + would mean that.

Nothing was done and yet the Doctor who examined her before coming here passed her on. There are eleven for X-ray., nine girls and two boys.

The ones who were doubtful in the examination of last April have shewed marked improvement and the Doctor assures me that there is no danger in keeping them here as they are not spreaders.

Dr. McInnis completed his vaccinations during this month, so that every child here is vaccinated. Dr. Cunningham will be along today for the eyes.


