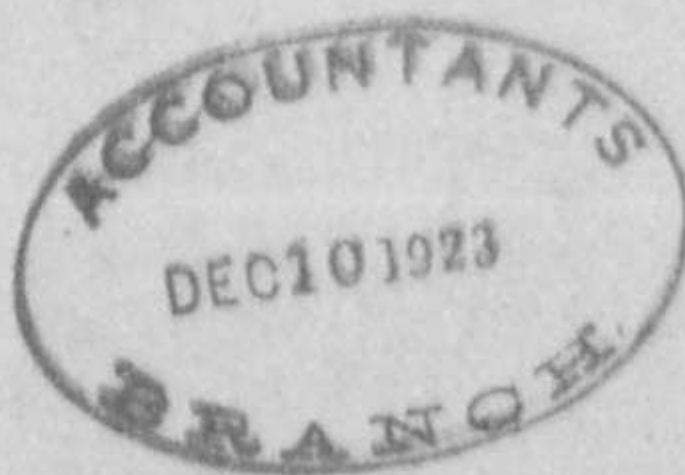

Dear Sir:

The enclosed statement is of the account that has been in question for so long. As you will remember, the Missionary Society under whose control we now work, refused to pay the bill. It was then referred to the Indian Dept, but as they had not been paying our drugs bill, it was still unpaid. I then paid the account myself, thinking that as we had not proceeded according to the rules of the M.S.C.C. we would have to lose the amount.

Now that you have again taken up the matter with the Indian Dept, I hope that you may get the matter settled.

Do you think we could ascertain from the Dept, if they will allow our School to purchase the same line of drugs as we have in the past, and will the Dept pay for them, when the same is requisitioned when we requisition our school supplies.

In returning the cement empty bags, for which we are allowed a rebate of twenty cents, on the price of the cement. We found that we had seventy one extra bags, and these Mr Downey will allow the same for which will still bring down the cost of the cement that we used at the Barn floor.

Will you please convey our sincere thanks for what the Indian Dept, have done for us, and we regret very much if we have over run the amount they promised us.

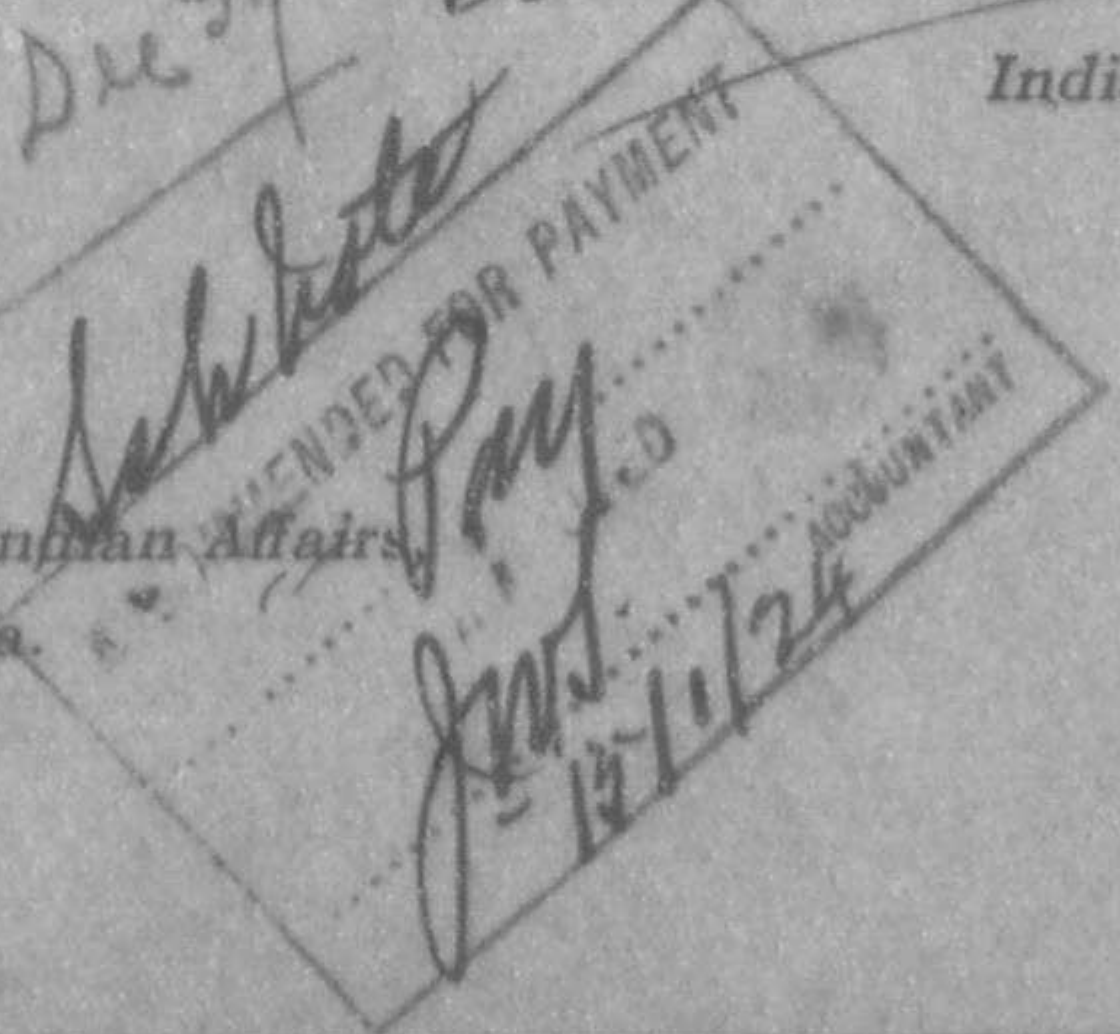



Dear Sir:

One of the pupils in our school who has been attending High School for the past term, and who, with others has had a bad cold for some time, still retains a very bad cough, and refuses to build up altho we are doing for him all we can. We have been hoping that when his cold left him he would recover his normal condition, but we are becoming alarmed about him, and I am writing to you for your advice.

It would seem best to send him at once to some Hospital where he would be treated especially for his trouble, which we believe is tubercular. Should he be taken to a local Hospital, he would only receive the same treatment that we are giving him here, and there would be the extra expense, and no advantage.

The boys name is Roy Richards. He has no home, and no relations to care for him. He came from away north of Fort William, and his parents are dead. He has an Aunt living in Fort William, who at times has sent clothes for Roy, but she has always warned us not to write to her regarding Roy because her husband would not like to know that she had any thing to do with this boy. Roy's Uncle, Rev. Edward Richards, died two years ago. He was a missionary in the North, and we had hopes that we could lead Roy on so that some day he could take a place, and carry on the work his Uncle was so interested in.

Roy is up, and out every day, and we will do all we can for him, but we would like to have your advice and permission to place him where he will get every chance there is for him.

Nearly all of the pupils in the Home contracted heavy colds during the past winter, even the staff did not escape, but all but Roy are well again, for which we are very thankful.
