

In reply to yours of Oct 6th 27 to Principals of Indian Residential Schools re fire protection and escapes - I beg to report for Alberni Residential School as follows -

1. Fire Alarm - There is no general fire alarm in the school - only small bells, similar to door bells in a private home. These are used by the children if they are sick or require to call a member of staff in the night. There should be a bell or alarm centrally located and sufficiently loud to alarm the whole school at once.

2. The only fire escapes except the stairs are brass rods, similar to those used by fire departments in fire halls. As the ceilings here are 12ft high it makes about 16ft- from where a child takes hold of the rod to the floor below. If they hold too tightly they are likely to burn their hands and let go or if too loosely they are likely to drop to the floor below. Even these rods change from one room to another at each floor. This would likely cause confusion if there was smoke or danger. I have taken Agent E. C. Hoel- and Inspector Gavins of Vancouver over the building and both concur with

me in this report that the fire alarm and the means of exit are both inadequate for the number of children and size of the building we have here.

3. Our hydrants, hose and water pressure are good.

4. Our fire extinguishers are only 2 quart size and in these large rooms would not do the work. I would like to suggest that these be replaced at the earliest convenience with 12 Booth & Boulter 2½ or 3 gal. extinguishers tested at 300-350 lbs.

5. Nearly all the doors in this building lock with a different key. Many

If these are necessarily locked at night and would cause delay and confusion in getting through the building.

I would therefore recommend that 12. fire axes with picks on the back be placed conveniently throughout the building so that they could be used to break down the doors or get at the source of the fire.

I would not like to take the responsibility of suggesting what kind of fire escape should be used or where it should be placed.

I would like to see the fire extinguishers and fire axes placed at our disposal at the earliest convenience.

Sir:

The Department has received a communication from Rev. F. E. Pitts, Principal of the Alberni Indian Residential School, relative to fire protection. I have to request that you will obtain an estimate of the cost of installing a fire alarm gong, which should be centrally located in the main building. Further, you should secure an estimate of the cost of erecting an outside wooden fire escape or a steel staircase, to be erected at a strategic point leading from the building and as convenient as possible to the exits from the dormitories. When we have this information, consideration will be given to authorizing the installing of the above equipment.

We are placing an order with the Pyrene Manufacturing Company of Canada, Limited, to forward, addressed to the Principal -

- 3 - 5 gallon Pump Tanks, complete with non freeze charges and
- 3 - 1½ quart Pyrene Extinguishers complete with non freeze charges.

The account covering the cost will be sent to you, and, upon receipt of the extinguishers, you should certify and send the account to the Department for payment. The smaller type extinguishers should be placed where there is danger from oil, grease or electrical machinery, and the larger sizes should be placed at strategic points in the building.

You should arrange to have the extinguishers now on hand recharged and put in good condition, purchasing any chemical required for this purpose. You may purchase and have delivered 12 fire axes with picks on back - these, also, to be placed at convenient points. When you have procured any refills necessary for the extinguishers and the fire axes, you should forward properly certified vouchers in duplicate covering the cost.

Please give these purchases your early attention and also forward the information requested regarding the fire gong and the fire escape.
