Re: Buildings & Equipment.

Dear Sir:

Having completed an inspection of the building and fixtures, I am in a position to report that certain departments are in such bad need of repairs as to endanger the normal life of those parts. After consultation with Capt. Edwards and Inspector Hamilton of Winnipeg, it was decided that I should address this to your Department with a respectful request that some provision might be made to supply the materials. We should endeavour to do at least the greater part of the labour.

The entire building is in need of Paint. In places the wood has or is rotting from exposure to weather. A professional painter kindly gave us his opinion on each room throughout the building. (This was entirely free of any obligation.)

We could undertake to do the entire inside, and the outside up to the 1st. story windows. The Eaves and windows of 2nd. story and attic would require special scantlings, swings, slings etc. and would be too dangerous for boys. This work alone would cost over \$ 200.00, including all materials. The eaves troughs are off entirely in three places.

A Mr. Miller, Manager of the Linoleum Department of the Hudson's Bay Co., Winnipeg, while visiting us on holiday, went over our rooms at our request, measuring up the floors for much needed linoleum. He has taken the measurements back to Winnipeg and will work out an estimate on a special reduced rate.

We find that linoleum is essential for the following:

The floors need "Lionoil" or some such preservative. We have discovered a 45 gal. drum full of a floor oil, for which a local firm will exchange us Lionoil. This drum has been here, unused, for several years and is of a low grade.

A set of six steps on the Boys' side is almost on the point of collapse. They will not satisfactorily stand repair, but need to be replaced.

The boys have no lockers of any kind in their Playroom, only a common room 18' x 3' lined with rows of Hooks which are at a dangerous height. We can install individual lockers for 78 boys at a cost of under \$ 11.00.

We are in immediate need of 70 mattresses, single hospital type bed. These are essential to replace mattresses worn entirely through the middle from end to end.

We also need for this Fall, bed sheets throughout. We require at least 215 sheets. This means 530 yds. (with app. 2½ yds. to 1 sheet), of unbleached cotton sheeting 54" wide in Bolts.

We can find no copies of any requisitions for school supplies etc. for September, and Capt. Edwards has none on his files. Could you please let us know as soon as possible if any have been sent in to your office. If not, we shall fill out your requisition forms immediately.

We do hope that some representative from your office will be able to visit us early this Fall.

An attempt will be made here to secure the funds necessary from one of the other appropriations.

3. Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School

Accompanied by Indian Agent Edwards, I visited this school on August 31. The new Principal - Mr. Douglas S. Pitts - met us at the school and accompanied us on inspection of the main building and the outbuildings.

Although Mr. Pitts has only been at the school for the last month, he has effected many necessary improvements. However, it is quite evident that the former principal of this school did not make any determined effort to keep the building in a proper condition. Actually, the Cecilia Jeffrey School is a very substantial building but it certainly has not been properly looked after. For instance, - one or two of the boards in the platform at the entrance to the school had broken, and instead of replacing them a piece of tin was nailed over them. This, of course, has rusted and certainly does not present a very good appearance to anyone entering the school for the first time.

I am placing on the Cecilia Jeffrey file a memorandum regarding the expenditures that I authorized, in conformity with your letter to Indian Agent Edwards of August 22nd.

The Surveys and Engineering Branch have completed the repairs to the sewage system and it is hoped that this will not cause us any further trouble. I impressed on the

Indian Agent, Mr. Edwards, and also the Principal the necessity of cleaning out the system at regular intervals each year.

The barns have been very thoroughly cleaned and I authorized the purchase of new lumber to replace the old platform in the cow stable.

Mr. Pitts seems very much interested and is anxious to do as much work as possible without expense to the Department. As you are aware, he has had some years' experience in an Indian residential school and is more or less familiar with conditions. I feel that the Presbyterian Church has made no mistake in engaging him and Indian Agent Edwards is anxious to co-operate with him. I believe that we can expect good results from this school in the future.

MEMORANDUM FOR FILE:

Re: CECILIA JEFFREY INDIAN RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL.

I visited this school on August 30 and, accompanied by Indian Agent Edwards, inspected the main building and all the outbuildings. I had a copy of the Principal's letter dated August 9th and also a copy of Mr. Hoey's letter to Indian Agent Edwards dated August 22nd.

The following expenditures were authorized:-

1. Set of six steps for boys' wing.
2. Lumber for lockers in the boys' and girls' play-rooms. The labour for this purpose is being supplied by the school management.
Lumber for platforms in cow stable.
3. Linoleum for infirmary section of the school.
4. Paint to the value of \$100. This will be used in the interior of the building. The outside painting will have to receive consideration next year.

In the Principal's letter of August 9 he requested linoleum for several rooms in the building. There is no doubt this is required but it will probably involve a high expenditure. The Principal had not obtained any estimate of the cost of this linoleum and I therefore requested him to obtain estimates and supply these to Indian Agent Edwards, who will forward them to us for our consideration. The Principal also requested 70 mattresses. These are certainly necessary and Indian Agent Edwards will forward information regarding their size.

I intimated to the Principal that it was doubtful if we could even consider supplying the sheets that he requested.
