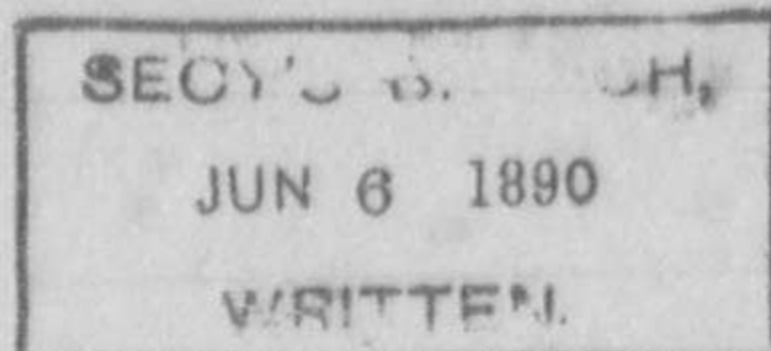

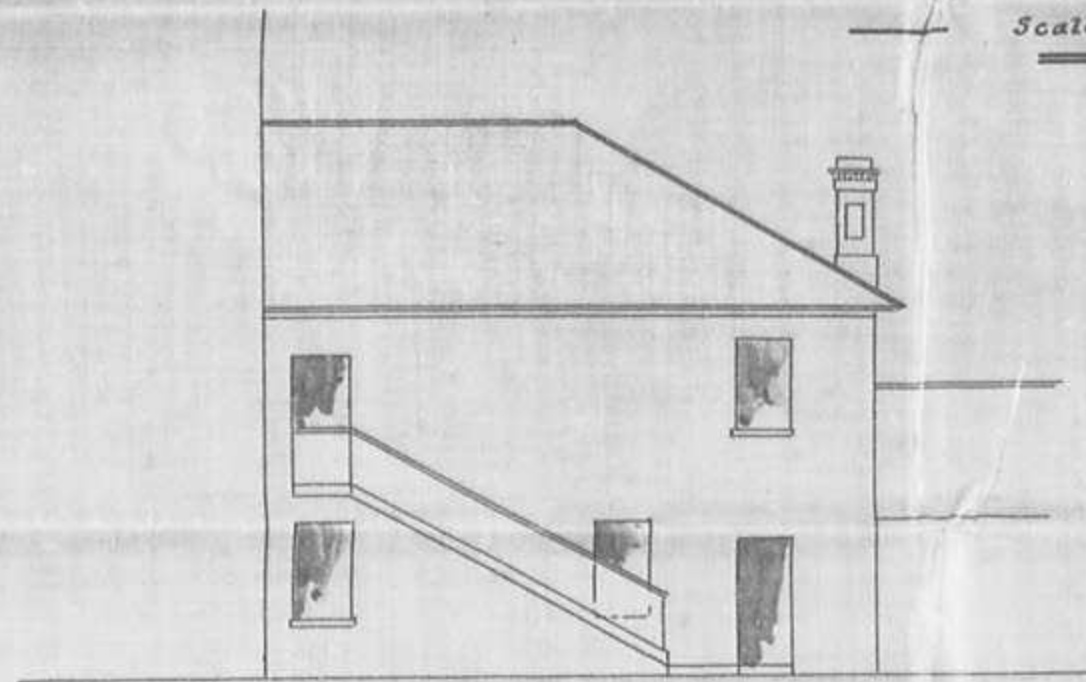

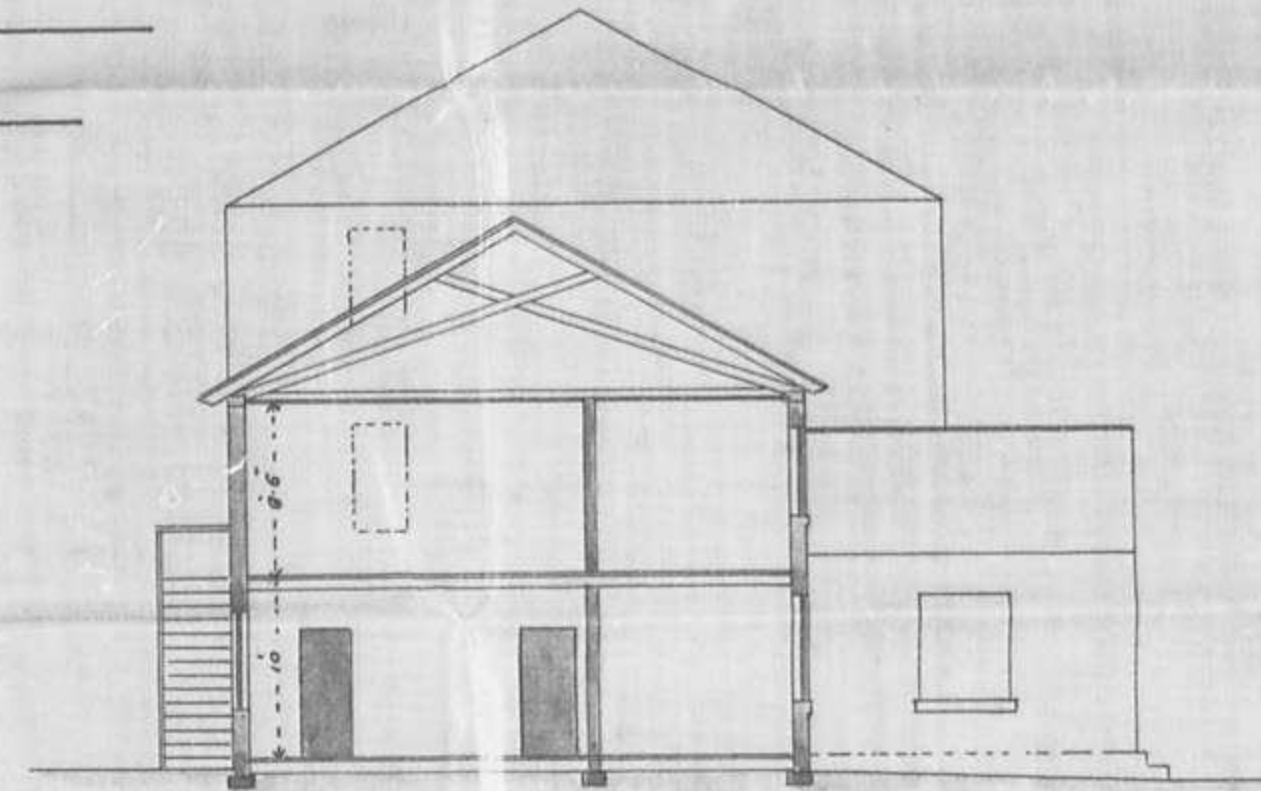

Proposed Extension.

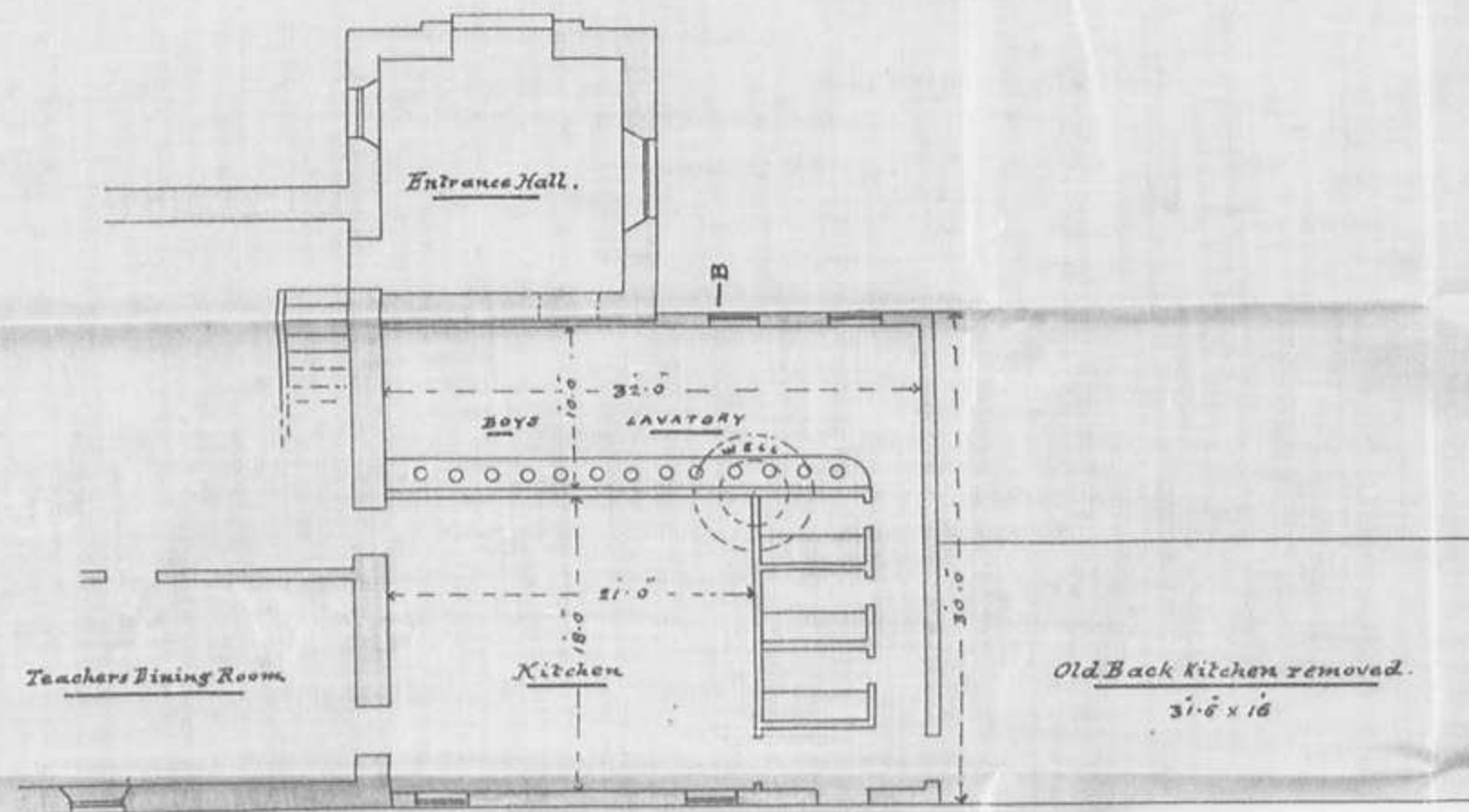

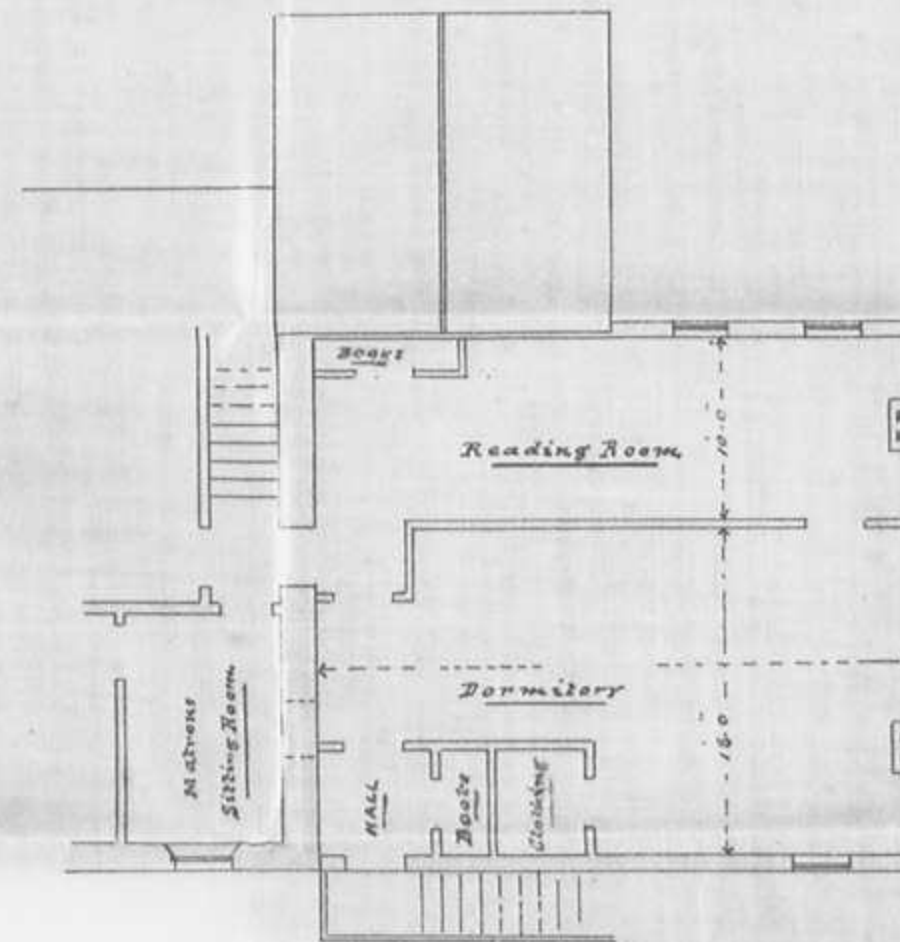
North Elevation

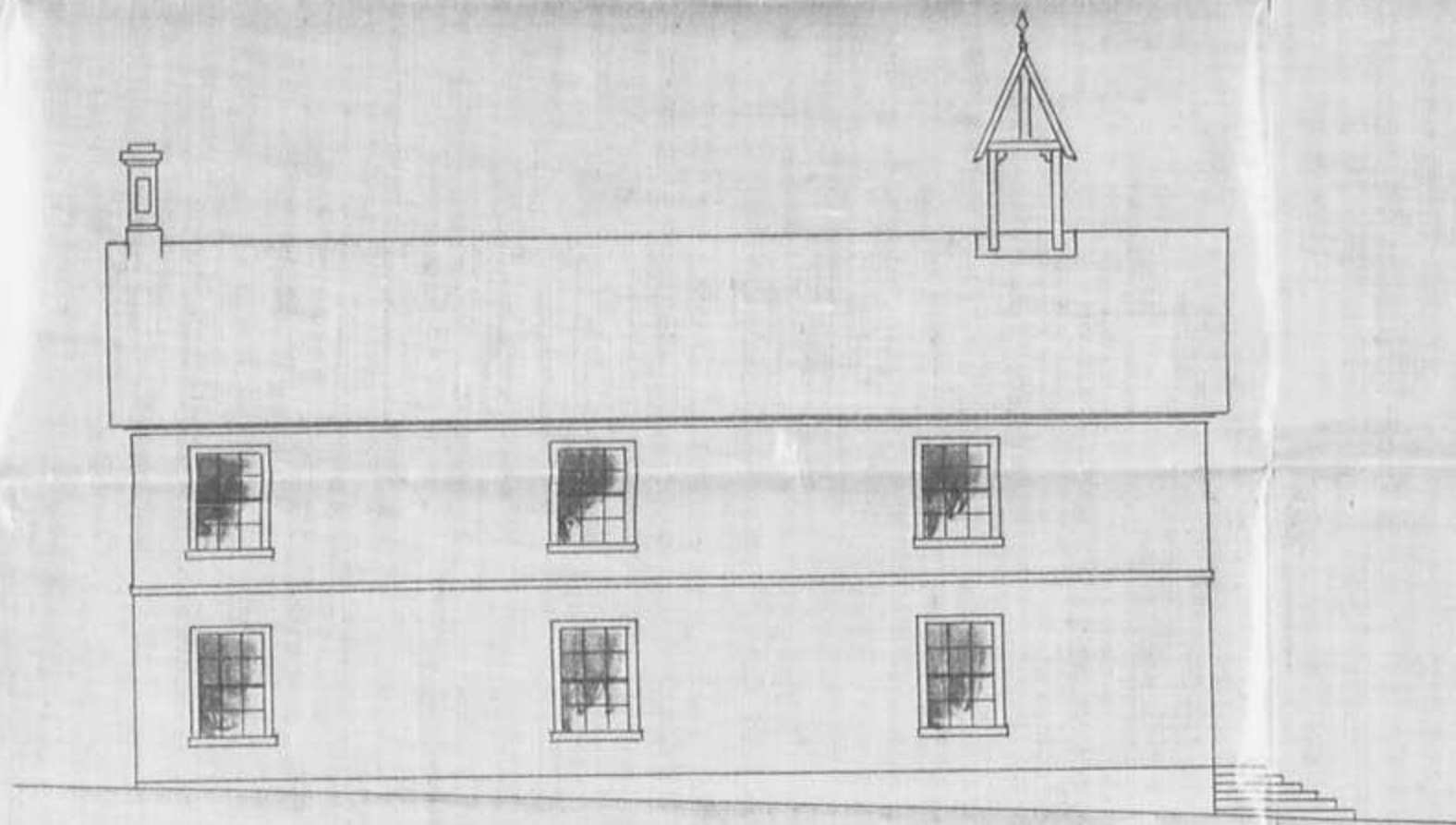

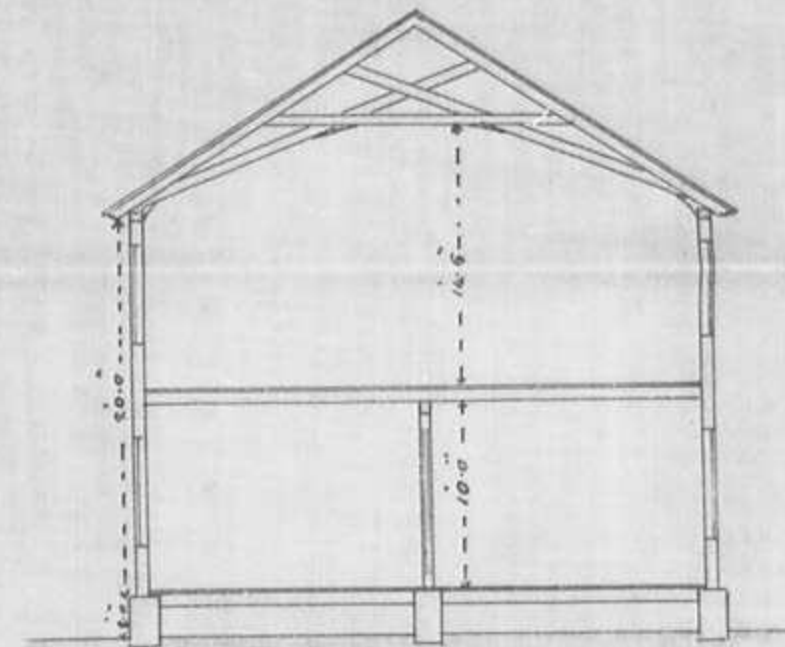

NEW DRILL SHED AND ASSEMBLY ROOM.

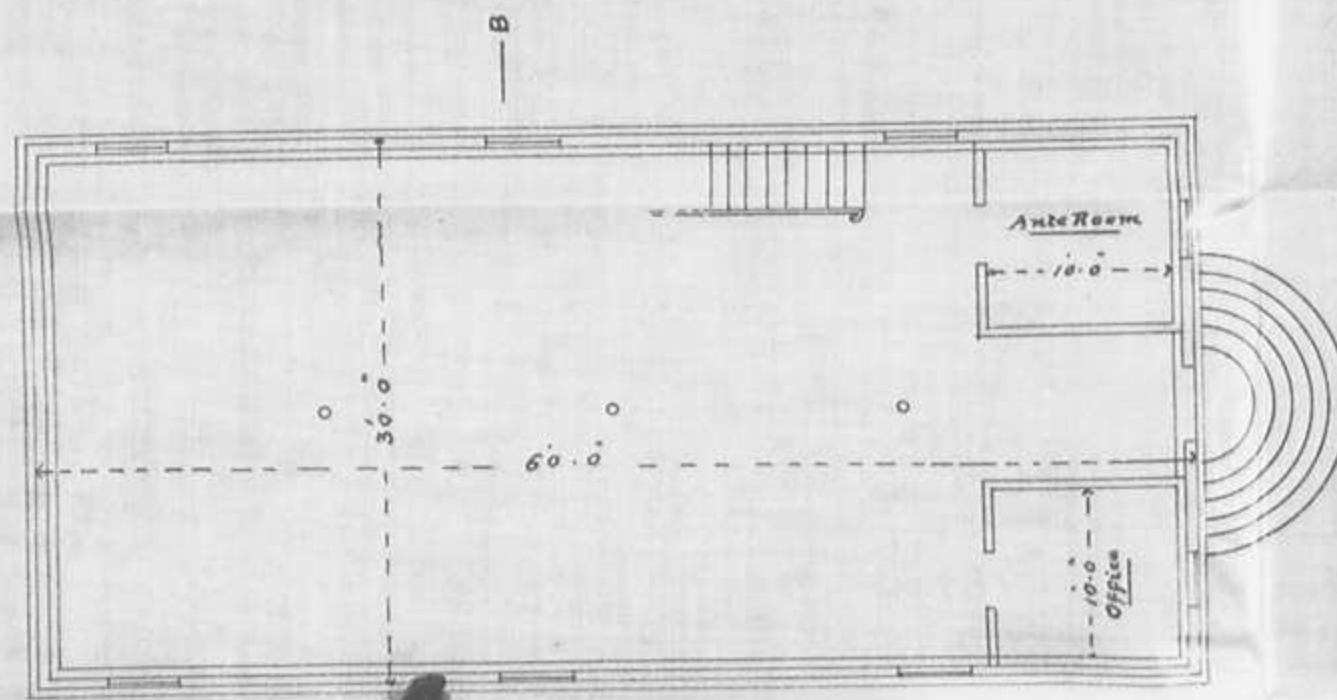

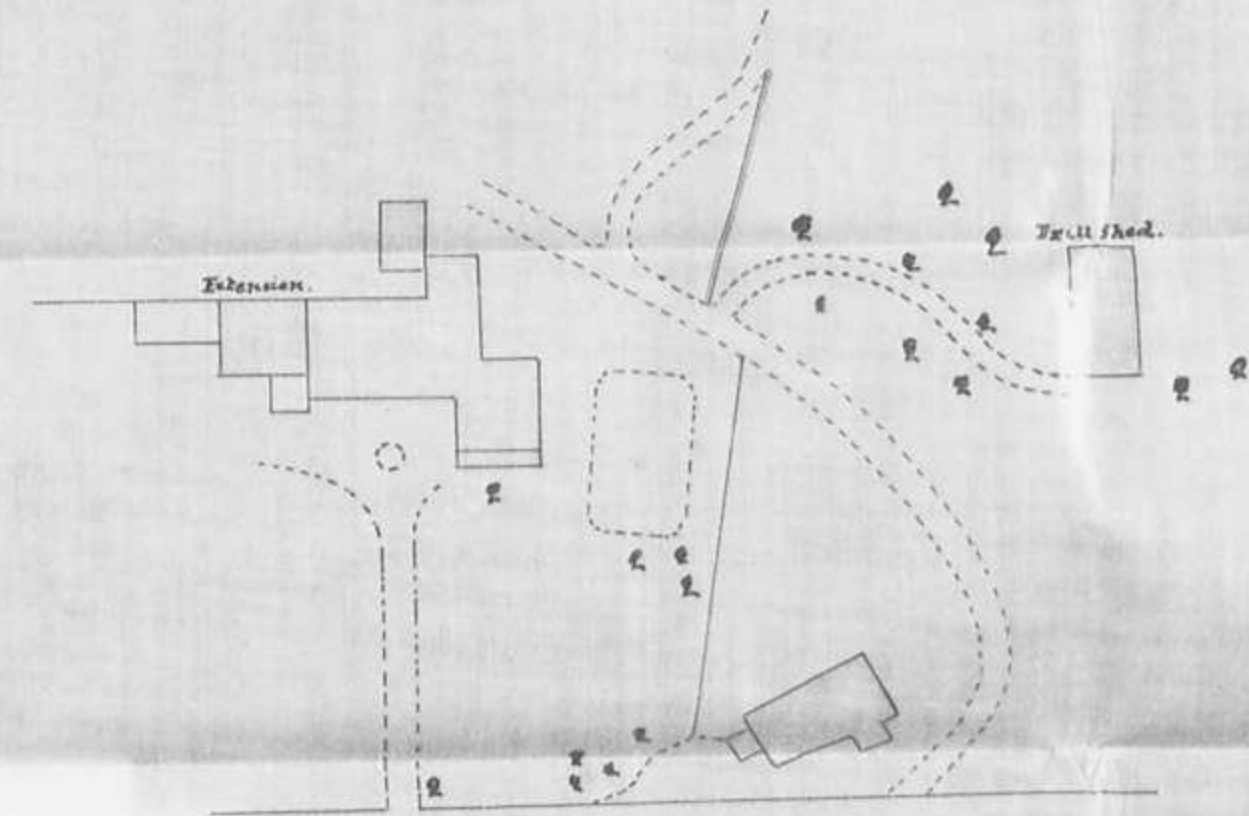

Particulars of Buildings in course of Construction
at the Shingwauk Home

Extension

(Place ^{the} accompanying)

The New Buildings on the West side of the Home consist of a Kitchen, Boys Lavatory, and Bath Room on the ground Floor, and a Reading Room and dormitory for 8 or 10 beds on the first floor. The present kitchen will in future be used as a Dining Room for the Employe's and the new one will be more roomy and airy than the old one. The present bath Room leads out of the Dining Hall, a most inconvenient arrangement, in future the Bath Room and Lavatory will adjoin. The Well has been sunk, and has 6 feet of water in it. The walls will be half Timbered to correspond with the Hospital and Industrial ^{all} our new Buildings, Stone Foundations. The present Back Kitchen will be moved back 30 feet and brought in line with Main Buildings as shown on Block Plan. On the First Floor a reading Room is provided with direct access from the school Room, also a Dormitory for 8 or 10 beds. Only last month we had to refuse applications for 6 children from Moravian town as we had not beds for them. The contracts are let and the buildings should be finished in about six weeks or two months - The estimated cost is \$1.349 as per accompanying ^{the} detached Estimate.

This Building is being erected on a convenient site to the east of the home. The length is 60 feet and the width 30 feet, a Framed Building on Stone Foundation. The Lower Floor will be used as a Drill shed and Gymnasium and will supply a want which has long been felt more especially during our long Winters. The upper Floor will be used as an Assembly room for the Weekly meetings of the "Onward and Upward Club", Sunday School, Prize giving etc and temporary^{ly} as a School Room. Hitherto Meetings have been held in the Dining Hall, a most inconvenient arrangement. The Estimated cost is \$1,238 as per detailed Estimate enclosed, the Contracts are Let and the work should be finished in about six weeks.

AN INDIAN MISSION.
Rev. E. T. Wilson, the Indian missionary of Sault Ste. Marie, Ont., with his two red-faced boys, Willie and Ijosie, returned from England on the Sardinian and left this morning by the "Soo" train for their Western home. The party were in the city early in the spring and took part in several missionary meetings. From here they proceeded to England, where they spent three weeks. "We had a very pleasant visit," said Mr. Wilson, "and were kindly received and substantially aided in our mission work. Our friends raised £200 for my schools at the 'Soo,' in Manitoba, and the one I propose opening at Medicine Hat, and the Missionary Society has promised a like sum to be forwarded me soon." Mr. Wilson said he and the boys had the pleasure of seeing the Queen as she drove into Windsor castle on her return from Balmoral. Through the kindness of an official they were allowed to stand quite alone inside the entrance, and as her Majesty drove in "she bowed to the party and smiled very sweetly on the boys." The little fellows were dressed in blue, trimmed with scarlet, and wore sashes and low-crowned soft hats with yellow bands. They wore neat watches and chains, the presents of English friends, and one was carrying back to the wilds a real American baseball. They had not forgotten their natural gait in their journeyings, for their little calf shoes toed in like the moccasins of old chiefs as they walked up the platform to take the train.

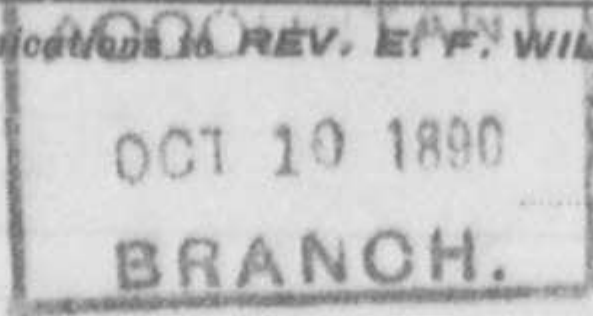

I have the honor

to inform you that owing to the scarcity of funds with which to carry on my now somewhat extensive work I have judged it expedient to reduce the number of our pupils & staff at the Shingwaik and Wawanosh Homes during the winter months.

I am in the meantime representing to our Board of Domestic & Foreign Missions the necessity of these Homes for Indian Children which have been established at Sault Ste. Marie - at Elkhorn - & at Medicine Hat being placed on a more satisfactory basis as regards their support.

The result is that steps are now being taken to form an "Indian Auxiliary" in connection with the Board of Domestic & Foreign Missions - having its local committees at various points in Algoma, Manitoba & the North West. Through which such work as I am engaged in will be more adequately supported & better supervised.

The Department will I think be prepared to congratulate

me on the prospect of this plan. ~~Wick~~ ¹⁸⁸⁴ stated
being carried out & will I also I think approve
of action in reducing our expenses this winter
so as to get things into better shape.

We have accommodation now for 74 boys
at the Shipwreck & 26 girls at the Wawanoosh -
one hundred pupils in all. And I hope the
Department may see its way to provide for 100
pupils at these Homes from the 1st of July next
at \$60 each per annum instead of for
77 as at present.

My next step in the Building line will be to erect
a new Wawanoosh Home and laundry near to
the Shipwreck - & dispose of the present girls'
buildings which are at the inconvenient distance of
three miles. The upper part of "the Hall" (60 x 30)
which we have erected this summer will serve
very well as a school room for both boys & girls.

The new Wawanoosh Home should I think have
accommodation for 50 girls, and I hope the
Department may make us a Building Grant this
coming Spring sufficient at any rate to enable
us to make a commencement.
