Sir:

I have received your letter of the 10th instant authorizing the construction of the proposed domestic water supply system for the Kootenay Indian Residential School near Cranbrook at an estimated cost of \$5,660. and asking for instructions to be given to our District Chief Engineer to have this work carried out.

In reply I beg to advise you that I have telegraphed to Mr. Webb asking him to advise me who will be available to supervise this work. It is understood that Mr. Warren is now looking after the improvements to the sewage system at the Kuper Island School, after which he will deal with the water supply for the Sechelt Indian Residential School, authorized in your letter of the 7th instant, following that it was expected that he would proceed to Kincolith to install the electric lighting plant there, provided satisfactory arrangements can be made with the Indians, so that it would not appear that Mr. Warren would be able to proceed to the Kootenay district for some time to come.

I have not yet received a reply from Mr. Webb to this telegram, but will advise you as soon as I hear from him.



Dear Sir:-

In connection with your letter of the 8th July, 1930, dealing with the report of Mr. Assistant Commissioner Perry on conditions in the Kootenay Agency, authority was given to me to purchase forty new mattresses for the Cranbrook Indian Residential School. This matter, however, I beg to say was overlooked and recently I have been written to on the subject by Mr. Indian Agent Ryckman and Rev. Father Patterson, Principal of the School, who has informed me that twenty mattresses of 2½' wide by 5½' long and twenty 3' wide by 6' long will be required. Recently I obtained a quotation from the Simmons Bed Company, of Vancouver, quoting price of \$3.25 and \$3.50 each for mattresses of these sizes, the specifications being Sanitary Mattresses covered with A.C.B. Ticking 5" Box Edge filled with excelsior and heavy layer of cotton felt both top and bottom.

I would, therefore, be obliged if you would inform me if the purchase can be made at this time.
