





"Plans are being prepared for a new building, I am informed. I wish to say in the most emphatic way that school building should be condemned. It is not a fit place to house boys and girls.

SCHOOLS BRANCH

"During a cold snap recently, the Principal says the conditions were deplorable. The younger pupils were suffering from cold. It was utterly impossible to keep them warm. A new building should be erected at once or the pupils should be sent home.

Water Supply:-

For some time the past Winter water had to be hauled. However, at the time of my visit, there was enough water for domestic purposes.

Heating:-

Hot water is used. One of the tubes burst while I was there. The Engineer was able to fix it so that it worked. The whole heating apparatus is liable to go to pieces at any time.

General Remarks:-

There are twelve acres that divide the school lands. This should be bought and added to the present school property. I would respectfully recommend that the Department look into this matter before the erection of the new building."

Dear Mr. Orr,-

Referring to your letter of the 4th instant in which you ask for any necessary revision of the fair wages schedule which was prepared for use in connection with the proposed erection of the Indian Residential School at Ixton, B. C., I would state that in view of the fact that negotiations are under way at present for certain wages changes in this district, it would be better to use the General Fair Wages Clause in the terms herewith.

If your specification is not used by the first of May, however, we should be pleased if you would let us know and in that event it will probably be possible to use a fair wages schedule, as wages rates for the season are ordinarily settled by that date.






