Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 30th ultimo and have to draw your attention to the fact that the school property which you have surveyed in the N.E.¼ Sec. 3-27-7-W.2.M., has no frontage on the public highway. You may note that the instructions sent you dated 26th June last, state that the area of the school property should not be less than ten acres; if necessary, this area may be exceeded to a moderate extent in order to give the property a frontage on the highway. It may also be possible to make the length of the property from North to South less than twelve chains. Be good enough to give this matter your attention with the view of affording this property the desired frontage.

## GORDON'S INDIAN RESERVE N° 86



Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of yours of the 7th of August last. I imagined I had replied to that long ago but I have just discovered my reply here among other papers on the Gordon Res. file, dated 20th Augt. 1918, as follows:

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of yours of the 7th inst. in re Road frontage of School property on Gordon's Ind. Res.

- In the survey of this School property I was guided by:-
1. An area of ten (10) acres,
  2. No boundary to be nearer than 66 feet to any building,
  3. The Rev. Supt. Atwater's wish to include a high and dry building site, as he expects to erect or have erected a new School building in the near future.

At present, by courtesy, the travelled road passes through this School land and immediately in front of the School building, but the graded road as (I am informed by Agent Mission) guaranteed by the Indians passes some 20 chains to the west of the School.

I did not locate and survey a road to and from the school as I was under the impression that the Church and School property were practically one and the same - merely under different Committees; and the East boundary of the School land is only five (5) Chains from the road allowance between sections two (2) and three (3) and the production thereof northward in accordance with the Surrender.

On consultation with Agent Morrison, it was decided a mere waste of time to "lay out and post the road allowances mentioned in the Surrender" because it is an impractical road location; and moreover, as previously mentioned, the guaranteed road <sup>passage</sup> through the Church property.

It is impossible to give the Section land a road frontage and conform with the three foregoing conditions.

If such a road, as you suggest, is necessary for the school, I beg to recommend that the Church and School Committees of the Church of England be requested to decide on a road or lane location for the school. I have the honour to be, sir

The attached description is for surrender to be obtained in the Gordon's Indian reserve in exchange for the S.E. 1/4 Section 3, surrendered by them and confirmed by O.C., July 28th 1914.

When survey was being made of the surrendered E. 1/2 Sec. 3 to be given to the Church of England in exchange for the E. 1/2 Sec. 4, it was found that the Indians had cultivated fields in the S.E. 1/4 Sec. 3 and therefore desired to retain this quarter and let the Church of England have the N.W. 1/4 Sec. 2 in lieu. The Agent stated that both the Church and the Indians were agreeable to the exchange.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto His said Majesty The King, his heirs and successors forever, in trust to exchange the same along with the northeast quarter of section three, for the east half of section four in the said township and range, upon such terms as the Government of the Dominion of Canada may deem most conducive to our welfare and that of our people.

AND We, the said Chief and Principal men of the said the George Gordon Band of Indians do on behalf of our people and for ourselves, hereby ratify and confirm, and promise to ratify and confirm, whatever the said Government may do, or cause to be lawfully done, in connection with the exchange of the said land.

Sir,-

In connection with the surrender of land on the Gordon's Indian Reserve No. 86, to be exchanged for land held by the Church of England, I beg to say that it has been found that the Indians have cultivated fields in the S. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 3, and therefore, desire to retain this quarter section and let the Church have the N. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of sec. 2 in lieu thereof.

In view of the above, therefore, I inclose a surrender, in duplicate, covering the N. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of sec. 2, Tp. 27, Rge. 17, W. 2nd M., to be exchanged along with the N. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of sec. 3, for the E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  of sec. 4 in said township and range, which surrender you are hereby authorized to submit to the Indians under and in accordance with the provisions of the Indian Act.

I am inclosing for your information copy of instructions for the guidance of Agents in taking surrenders, the requirements of which you will closely follow, especially so in regard to furnishing a list and certifying as to the number of Indians present at the meeting, the number voting for the surrender and the number voting against.

It will be necessary to have a full attendance at the meeting, as the assent of a majority of the voting members of the Band is required in order that the surrender may be submitted to His Excellency in Council for acceptance.

The undersigned begs to submit herewith a surrender, in duplicate, made on the 15th day of May, 1919, by the George Gordon band of Indians, of the north-west quarter of Section 2, township 27, range 17, west of the 2nd meridian, containing 160.5 acres, more or less, in the George Gordon Indian reserve, No. 86, in the province of Saskatchewan; the said surrender having been given in order that the area covered thereby, together with the north-east quarter of section 3, may be exchanged for the east half of section 4, in the said township and range, upon such terms as the Government of the Dominion of Canada may deem most conducive to the welfare of the band.

The surrender has been duly authorized, executed and attested in the manner required by the 49th Section of the Indian Act, and the undersigned would recommend that the same be accepted by Your Excellency in Council; the original surrender to be returned to the Department of Indian Affairs and the duplicate thereof to be kept of record in the Privy Council Office.

Herewith is a surrender, for acceptance by Council, of the n.w. $\frac{1}{4}$  of section 2, township 27, range 17, w.2 M., containing 160.5 acres, in the George Gordon Indian reserve, Sask., with a view to an exchange of land.

By an O.C. of 25th July, 1914, a surrender was accepted of the e. $\frac{1}{2}$  of projected section 3, with road allowances, comprising 360 acres. The two quarter sections comprised within this half section were surrendered for the purpose of exchange for two quarter sections belonging to the Church of England (e. $\frac{1}{2}$  of sec. 4, township 27, range 17, w.2 M.).

It has been found that the Indians have cultivated fields in the s.e. $\frac{1}{4}$  of section 3 and they therefore desire to retain this quarter section and to let the Church have the n.w. $\frac{1}{4}$  of section 2 in lieu thereof. The surrender herewith is to enable the exchange to be made.

The Indian Agent reports that there were 44 Indians entitled to vote, that 14 were absent from the meeting but that of the 30 present all voted in favour of the surrender.

The Committee of the Privy Council have had before them a Report, dated 18th June, 1919, from the Superintendent General of Indian Affairs submitting herewith a surrender, in duplicate, made on the 15th day of May, 1919, by the George Gordon band of Indians, of the North-west quarter of Section 2, Township 27, Range 17, West of the 2nd Meridian, containing 160.5 acres, more or less, in the George Gordon Indian reserve, No. 86, in the Province of Saskatchewan; the said surrender having been given in order that the area covered thereby, together with the North-east quarter of Section 3, may be exchanged for the east-half of Section 4, in the said Township and Range, upon such terms as the Government of the Dominion of Canada may deem most conducive to the welfare of the band.
