POST DIARY.

Sunday, 27th. November 1904.

Weather:- Fine. Sunday routine.. P.

Const. Redington with horse #2425 to and from Burn's slaughter house this P.M. on duty.

Two halfbreeds, Pat Scullen and H. Pepper, were arrested on a warrant to-day charged with assaulting two men, Forbes and Scholreed, on the previous evening. Const. Large and Redington effected the arrests.

Monday, 28th. November 1904.

Case of Rex vs Hume, Wounding, was heard. Judge Scott stated that it was just a case of two boys playing and one accidentally got wounded with a knife and dismissed the charge.

J.D. Prosser appeared before Insp. Duffus J.P. charged with assisting a member of the R.N.W.M.P. to desert. He was found "Guilty" and was sentenced to 6 months imprisonment with hard labour.

Pat Scullen and H. Pepper appeared before Insp. Duffus J.P. on a charge of assault. They were found "not guilty" and the case was dismissed.

The arms, saddlery and accoutrements were inspected by the Orderly Officer.

S/Sergt. Busselle to Cochrane on quarantine duty this A.M.


Interpreter Brazeau with horse on patrol this A.M. to Mission Bridge and Shaganappi found all correct and returned in P.M.
