Re Dental Services Mohawk Institute.

Rev. Mr. Snell has advised me of the proposed suggestions for the curtailment of dental services.

While the installation of a dental clinic at the school has some advantage over our present arrangement, it will not, in view of the amount of work needed to "put the pupils teeth in good condition", accomplish that which the department desires viz. economy and less outlay.

The examination of the pupils during last month showed 77 requiring dental attention in varying amounts. The preparation of a cavity for amalgam and insertion of filling will average twenty minutes, or three per hour. This is averaging simple and compound cavities. The amalgam work alone among these 77 pupils would take approximately six days to complete it, working seven hours per day. Porcelain work averages a longer time, and there would still be extractions and the odd root treatment, therefore, if the department really want to put the teeth of these children in "good condition" it would be impossible to do so in two days work.

It has been the practice under our present arrangement to give the children proper attention with the minimum expense. There is no other board or department paying less for dental service. The Workmen's Compensation Board allow from \$1.00 to \$4.00 for an amalgam filling, and \$1.00 for extractions. The Board of The College of Dental Surgeons in submitting the schedule of fees for the Workmens Compensation Board advised the profession that these fees were considered to be only two-thirds of an average fee set by an average dentist in regular practice. The Ontario Government in administering dental relief allow \$1.00 for extraction of the first tooth, and 50 cents for each subsequent tooth. Your department is paying 25 cents per tooth. I have merely mentioned the foregoing schedules to show that the department ~~are~~ is receiving dental services at the lowest possible outlay.

To lessen the cost, your department has suggested the use of composition for fillings. The cost of a filling is due to the time taken in preparing the cavity. The same preparation holds for either amalgam or composition. The cost to the dentist of either of these materials is

the same, and because composition is not considered a permanent material, its use is confined in regular practice to some cases for the temporary teeth. The preparation of a cavity for an indian is exactly the same as for any one else, therefore, I cannot see how the expense in this regard can be lowered.

When I took on this work for the Mohawk Institute, my first examination revealed the mouth conditions of these children ~~was~~ in a most deplorable state, and since that time there has been a gradual improvement with a lessening in the volume of work required. My last examination made last month, showed only \$65 in cost of services needed, which included four new pupils. The balance of \$170. was work which had accumulated over the past two years, and \$10. for examination, making a total of \$245.00

If your department would, at this time, make a special concession to this school, and permit me to clean up this outstanding work, and further, authorize the regular examination next October, in order to include any new pupils entering the school during the coming summer, I believe it will be possible to continue the work, thoroughly and completely under our present system at approximately the same outlay that a two-day clinic at the school would incur.

However, if your department are still desirous of installing a clinic in the school at this time, I shall be glad to continue to give of my time and talents to the best of my ability. I presume the department would arrange for the purchase of the necessary equipment, chair, engine etc., and would suggest that the more modern the equipment, the more efficiently the work can be carried on.

Reverend Sir:

The Department has received a letter from Doctor F. W. Landymore on the subject of the proposed dental work for the pupils of your school. Doctor Landymore goes to a good deal of length in describing the work he has done in the last three years and what is now required, but he does not convince the Department that an outlay of \$1200. in three years is reasonable expenditure for dental attention to 150 pupils. As an example I may quote an Agency where there are about an equal number of pupils all in day school. About ten days dental work has been done for these children during three years and their teeth are in such good order as to lead the dentist to invite comparison with white children under provincial care. If two days is not sufficient during the present year, the Department is prepared to allow three, but Doctor Landymore must find his own equipment and materials. Much of the letter which he writes has no reference to the matter under discussion as the Department is not concerned with any arrangement made by the Workmen's Compensation Board, or any other organization. It has arrangements similar to those proposed in this case with many dentists who appreciate the work and take pride in it.

Dear Sir,

I have taken up the matter of Dental <sup>work</sup> further with Dr. Landymore and he is willing to undertake the work on a time basis as you suggested. Owing to the expense involved he will be unable to instal equipment at the school for the work but will do it at his office giving three full days as convenient.

It is only fair to point out in connection with the comparison with dental in day schools on a Reserve that there would be very few new pupils as compared with the Institute and that the greater part of the work required each year is for new pupils admitted in the Autumn. It would be much less, once the teeth were put in good condition, if we had practically the same pupils year after year.

I have your letter of June 11th, and observe that Doctor Landymore is willing to undertake the dental work for the pupils of Mohawk Institute on the basis supplied by the Department. I think you will find this to be quite satisfactory, particularly if you are able to detail some member of your staff to act as assistant in the clinic room and another to attend to the children after they have received treatment. In referring to work done in certain day schools an Agency was mentioned which has a greater number of pupils attending the school given this service than there are pupils in the Mohawk Institute. Another point of similarity is that each year there are new cases coming up for attention, not only among the younger children, but among older children whose parents have just returned to the Reserve. It was not possible to obtain the maximum benefit the first year this arrangement was adopted, but as the clinic became better organized, better results were obtained and I feel sure that you will be well pleased after this method is given a good trial.



I have received your letter No. 32-0-13, 10th inst. In reply I may say that I am sorry I neglected to quote the authority for the general examination. This was authorized in your letter No. 32-0-13, Oct. 23, 1930, which provided for a semi-annual examination. We have been proceeding under this authorization for the past four years.

It should also be mentioned that this service, at \$10.00 is very reasonable. Dr. Landymore spent, at each semi-annual examination, three afternoons of three hours each. It is evident that the actual work of repairing the teeth is much expedited by this previous examination as none but those needing attention need be sent to him.

I trust, therefore, that the Department will not only pay him the small fee involved, but also authorize the continuance of the examination. I do not see how we can get satisfactory results from the time authorized for work on the children's teeth without the previous examination.
