

Dear Sir:

Attached please find a report of Dr. McInnis concerning children who have been bothered with running ears. With the exception of Wm. Guhue, Barney Clare, and Joe Knockwood, the Dr. attributes the trouble to enlarged tonsils.

We also have a number with decayed teeth, some had not been attended to last fall when the dentist was here and the others have come to the school since that time.

If this ear trouble is caused by the tonsils, would it not be possible to have these cases looked after without delay. There would not be more than six at most.

Since the local dentist is to do the work I do not suppose that it will make any difference whether it is done in small lots or not. If you have arranged a schedule of rates I believe the dentist would rather take them in small groups.

Will you please let me know what I may do in regard to tonsils and teeth.

In reply to your letter of May 5th, I regret that the Department cannot provide a tonsil and dental clinic for your school, at the present time. It would be pleased to do so, except that your pupils had the advantage of very considerable work of this kind last fall, and there are many schools calling for similar work where none has been done for at least two or three years. The funds provided by Parliament will not cover the cost for all, and preference must be given to those which have had to wait.




