

Extract from letter from Mr. J.P.B. OSTRANDER,

Original on 108-1-1

The only fire escape which had been in operation on the west side of the building, being that part of the building which is most likely to afford a means of escape from the dormitories, if there was a fire, had been eliminated by building at the foot of it an outer porch over the door to the boys' play room. I was annoyed when I saw this on my visit to the school on September 5th and drew Mr. Card's attention to it. He said he would have it moved to another window on the same side of the building where it would not have interference from the porch. The fire escape had not been moved when I again visited the school on October 10th. The broken panes of glass at the time of my visit on September 5th ran into dozens. Every building on the premises had some broken windows and some of them had many. None of these had been repaired on October 10th, in fact I believe even more had been added to the number in a little over a month. The school grounds are receiving no attention whatever and there are tall weeds in front of the main school building which have been growing all summer, and were still there on October 10th. All the buildings of the school needed painting but broken boards here and there and other damage resulting from carelessness and lack of discipline with the children have rendered the buildings unsightly and unfit for painting until considerable repair work has been done. The flooring of the boys' play room had dangerous holes in it and many boards of the flooring ready to break through at any moment. Mr. Kerley, the Agent, informed me that there has been flooring at the school for some months for repairs to these floors but nothing has been done to repair them. Some of the dormitory floors are practically worn through in spots, also, and much repair work is needed.

I have a letter from Inspector Ostrander regarding his recent inspection of the Round Lake School. He reports as follows regarding the fire escape:-

"The only fire escape which had been in operation on the west side of the building, being that part of the building which is most likely to afford a means of escape from the dormitories, if there was a fire, had been eliminated by building at the foot of it an outer porch over the door to the boys' play room. I was annoyed when I saw this on my visit to the school on September 5th and drew Mr. Card's attention to it. He said he would have it moved to another window on the same side of the building, where it would not have interference from the porch. The fire escape had not been moved when I again visited the school on October 10th".

Please let me know if it has been moved since October 10th. If not, you should arrange with the Principal to have the work done immediately.

The Inspector also refers to the fact that the flooring in the boys' playroom requires immediate repairs. Birch flooring was ordered on our purchase order No. 5422, a copy of which was sent to you in September. If this lumber has reached the school, you should arrange with the Principal to have the work done immediately. Please let me hear from you when the above-mentioned repairs have been carried out.



The jacket heater at the Round Lake School is damaged beyond repair and needs replacing at once.

As I consider that the damage to this piece of equipment must have resulted from mishandling by the school authorities, it having been installed only about two years, I have informed the Principal that I will not recommend that the Department pay for the new one.

He has agreed to pay for the new one from school funds but is unable to locate one anywhere in this province. The damaged jacket heater is called a Viking heater. It is No. V 80 and was supplied to the Department from Warden-King Limited, Montreal. The Principal of the School asks that the same type of heater be purchased and shipped to him at Stockholm, Saskatchewan, and he will pay the total cost in connection therewith.

With reference to the fire escape on the West side of Round Lake School, I beg to report that up to date this has not been erected. I sent the necessary piping from Broadview to Whitewood on Nov. 23rd. As it was impossible to get 28 ft. in one length I had two lengths welded and made a smooth joint. The Principal was notified, but the pipe is still in Whitewood. His attitude appears to be that this is all unnecessary. He stated that any fires had always started on the other side of the building. I pointed out to him that a fire might start anywhere and there was no such thing as too many fire escapes in a building of this kind. He also makes the excuse of not having enough help at the school. He seemed reluctant to move the porch and would prefer to extend a wooden platform along the side of the building beyond the porch. I pointed out that this would not be a safe arrangement as the platform should be of metal construction and not too long.

As regards the 2800 ft. of flooring authorized on Purchase Order 5422, being unable to purchase birch flooring, edge grain fir was sent to the school on Nov. 28th, and no attempt has been made as yet to lay this. Instead of being put in the school it was stored in the loft of the cow barn.

A saving of over \$200.00 was effected by the substitution of this flooring. Would it be possible to get authority to hire men and see that the fire escape is constructed and the flooring laid in the boys' playroom and girls' dormitory.

With reference to Department letter of the 6th ultimo, No. 108-1-5, addressed to Mr. W.J.D. Kerley, Indian Agent, Crooked Lake Agency, copy of which was sent to this office, in connection with the fire escape and the flooring in the boys' playroom in the Round Lake Indian Residential School, I am now enclosing copy of a letter received from Mr. Kerley referring to lack of co-operation on the part of the Principal of the school in carrying out this very necessary work.

I cannot understand the attitude of the Reverend Mr. Card, the Principal, in these matters. The floor in the boys' playroom is actually dangerous and might easily be the cause of a broken leg or some other injury while the boys are playing on the floor in its present condition. To store this flooring in the loft of the cow barn as soon as it was received instead of taking immediate steps to lay it would almost indicate that Mr. Card is not interested in the welfare of the pupils.

Much worse, in my opinion, is his failure to remedy the dangerous condition of the fire escapes. The building is an old frame building with poor heating arrangements and it would burn very quickly if a fire started. The only fire escapes in operation are in parts of the building where a fire is almost sure to start, making it very important to have a useful fire escape on the other side of the building. To have eliminated this fire escape, as I reported, subsequently taking no action to remedy the situation even after being supplied with good material, is inexcusable.

I think the Church Authorities should be informed, in no uncertain terms, that Mr. Card must comply with the Department's instructions where they relate to the health and welfare of the children, as well as the care of the buildings, immediately. Failing this he should be replaced by someone willing to assume some responsibility to promptly complete repairs for improvements where the welfare of the children is concerned.

However, from your reports, it is evident that the change in the fire escape and the flooring of the boys' playroom should be done immediately, and you may authorize Mr. Indian Agent Kerley to proceed with this work as soon as he can obtain labour. If he requires an accountable cheque for the labour, he should make application for same.


