



Dear Mr. Glen,-

I dislike troubling you, but duty compels me to bring to your attention the condition of dwelling occupied by the Superintendent of Residential School at Brandon. This matter has been before the Department, to my knowledge, at least ten years and I feel that the time has come when action will have to be taken. The house is in such a condition that further neglect of the situation could not be considered. In saying this, I am mindful of the fact that your term as Minister has been brief and that you could not be expected to have many similar matters taken care of in a short time, especially under present conditions. I want that clearly understood.

If you could have the opportunity at any time to visit this home for yourself, you would agree that my remarks concerning it are most moderate.

I cannot see that the present building in its dilapidated condition would be worth repairing. I think it would be cheaper and better in the end to have a new building.

MEMORANDUM

Re: Water Supply - Brandon Residential School,
Manitoba.

Referring to your notation on copy of a memo-
randum from Indian Affairs dated March 11th, we have
now received a report from Mr. Gow on the water situation
at the above school.

Duplicate copies of this report dated March 25th
are attached. You will note that the difficulty exper-
ienced has been overcome by more careful organization
of the available supply from the two sources. Mr. Gow,
however, points out that the water supply is diminishing
and suggests that investigations proceed with a view
to obtaining a water supply from the City of Brandon
or from the Assiniboine River when the present supply
is reduced below the needs of the school.

As water resources over the southern sections
of Western Canada appear to be generally decreasing,
we would concur with Mr. Gow's recommendation that
steps be taken to find out if water can be obtained
from the City of Brandon and at what cost. If the
scheme should be feasible the matter of sharing the
cost with the Experimental Farm could be considered.
If water cannot be obtained at suitable cost from
Brandon, the Assiniboine River scheme could be
investigated.

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of March 14th with reference to the above mentioned subject and asking for a report on the reported partial failure of the water supply at the school. We had not intended making any report on the matter but in view of the inquiry from the Indian Affairs Branch it has been considered advisable to report upon the inspection carried out by this office.

This office was advised of the telephone message to Mr. Hamilton regarding the water supply and later, on March 4th, the Rev. Mr. Strapp called at this office in connection with the matter. Mr. Rose, an engineer of this staff, visited the school later and made certain inquiries with respect to the water supply situation. He found that the lower spring, which normally supplies the barns and farm buildings, also the basement and ground floor of the school by gravity, had early in January proved insufficient to meet the demand. An examination of the reservoir by the engineer of the school showed that it was empty and he accordingly opened the by-pass valve and allowed water from the upper spring reservoir to discharge back into the lower spring reservoir so that the gravity feed to the above mentioned services was almost immediately restored. However, this discharge was permitted to continue for an hour and forty minutes, thus depleting the upper reservoir and cutting off the gravity water supply to the two upper storeys of the school. Undoubtedly, much water was wasted through the lower reservoir during the hour and forty-minutes period. To supply the upper floors the motor-driven pump had to be put into operation and the upper floors supplied through the pressure tank. However, the next day a water supply had been built up in the upper reservoir and the gravity system was again in operation throughout. Since then the system has been operated without inconvenience but once weekly it is necessary to permit water to flow back into the lower reservoir from the upper reservoir for about forty minutes. It is found that this procedure does not deplete the supply in the upper reservoir but does augment the supply sufficiently in the lower reservoir to permit continuous supply for one week.

Admittedly, this is not a very dependable water supply but it has proven adequate to meet the present demand. During the past few years there have been critical periods as regard the water supply from these two widely separated springs and while normally the whole system is a gravity supply, a pumping system has to be maintained for fire protection and for such an emergency as happened recently. The equipment is available for meeting the emergency created by failure of supply from either reservoir but due to changes in personnel at the school, the procedure to be followed in such emergencies is not always understood, and some confusion results.

However, there is no equipment available for providing a water supply in the event of failure of both springs. There used to be several springs in the vicinity of the school - there are now only the two with any flow and they appear to be producing less water and at critical times only careful operation permits of a water supply being maintained over such periods. The Dominion Experimental Farm, which adjoins the school property, have had similar experiences and

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now also have to meet water shortages and dwindling supply from springs on their property. The Experimental Farm has made attempts to secure water from deep wells with indifferent success and the water has not been satisfactory. There would appear to be only two alternatives open to these two Government Enterprises to secure a dependable water supply - they can either connect up with the City of Brandon water system or construct their own pumping plant with the Assiniboine River as a source of water. Either alternatives would involve a large capital outlay but in view of the threatened failure of water supply at both sites, it would appear advisable to investigate these two alternatives.




