

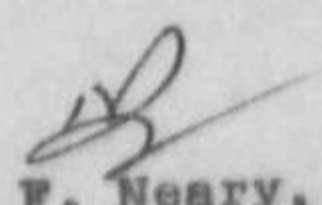

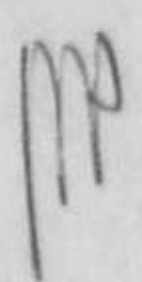

John Plaxton Company Ltd.

Reference your telegram of September 6th, 1949,
authorizing the extra work on replacement of rad-
iators and valves on the low pressure heating
system, in the amounts of \$325.00 and \$125.00
respectively, at the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Res-
idential School.

John Plaxton Co. Ltd., of Winnipeg gave the
estimate on this job, and when the work was started
on the pressure system it was found the cost was
lower than estimated.

Regarding Voucher No. 171, in the amount of \$416.45,
we would advise that it was found necessary to replace
one more radiator, which was cracked, than authorized.
This was done without the firm receiving the approval
of the Principal or this office. We would however
point out that it would have been necessary to have
the rad replaced before the heating season commenced
at considerable more cost to the Department, as the
men were on the job.

This firm has done a very satisfactory job at this
school and therefore we would recommend that the attached
Vouchers No. 171 and 172 be approved and passed for
payment.

Re MIXER REQUIRED FOR SCHOOL KITCHEN:

When allowing for the purchase of a mixing machine for the school kitchen, at the time estimates for this year were submitted, I tried to plan for the most economical type of machine which would meet the requirements.

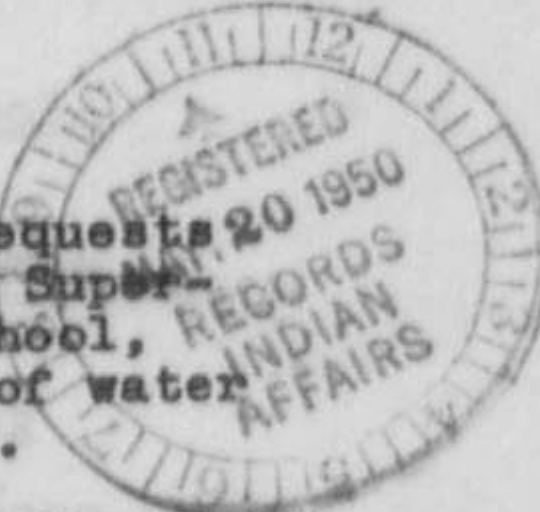

In our estimates for the present year, allowance was made for the necessity of replacing existing water piping in this building.

Present water pipes throughout this building are almost all the original iron pipes put in when the school was built. During the years which have elapsed since then, a great deal of corrosion has taken place. Also, a great deal of scale has built up on the inside of the pipes. In several places this has developed to such an extent that there is a serious threat that the water will soon cease to flow altogether. It can be understood quite readily how easily an emergency could be created if this happened in one of several places while school was in session.

May I request authority, please, to arrange for having all water piping which needs to be replaced removed and replaced during the coming holidays.

I believe that it is now considered economical to have copper pipes put in wherever possible. However, your Engineering Department will be much better informed than I, and will be able best to advise the proper procedure for putting our water system in first-class shape.

Re FIRE ESCAPES:

During my first term as Principal of this school I drew your attention to the hazards of fire in this school, with its present poorly-planned fire escapes. On the occasion of the first visit of the Regional Supervisor to this school, this topic was discussed quite fully.

It was pointed out that, since there is no direct exit from any one of the four large dormitories to a fire escape, the probability of the occupants of one or all of these dormitories being able to reach safety in the event of fire is a slight one indeed. The fact was also stressed that, because there is only one exit from each of these dormitories, it is necessary to leave that one exit unlocked while the dormitories are occupied. This means that there is free passage between dormitories containing young people of opposite sexes, many of them being physically capable of reproduction. That this fact is a constant threat to the morals of the pupils of this school should not need to be emphasized.

I am bringing this matter again to your attention with the sincere hope that your Department will not allow another school term to begin without having proper up-to-date escape equipment installed in this school. I do not feel that I can accept responsibility for the safety of children who are not supplied with a reasonable chance of safety in the event of fire.

Re ADDITIONAL SCHOOL BUILDING:

In our letter dated July 30, 1949, we mentioned the need for an additional building for this school, this building to contain a gymnasium, a classroom, a library and two reading rooms.

At present there is no part of this building (our present school) which is suitable for use as a gymnasium. Because of this there is no adequate program of physical education. Also, the lack of space for indoor sports results in disciplinary problems which could largely be avoided if there were proper facilities for recreation. The need for a proper gymnasium is great indeed.

We are sadly in need of an additional classroom, and there is no space available. We have no library, and because of this are losing a valuable chance to educate our Indian young people. There are no rooms in our present building where a pupil may retire to read or write. This is a tragic fact. Separate reading rooms for boys and girls are very, very necessary.

It is believed that these needs could all be met in one building. It is proposed that this building should contain a gymnasium (and possibly a swimming pool) on the lower floor. The second floor should contain the classroom, library and two reading rooms. It is expected that the cost of such a building would be \$25,000.00.

May I request permission to have plans prepared for such a building, please?
