Old Suns School.

This school is in a bad way for horses and cattle, a milching strain of cattle should be put here as milk should be the main article of diet in a school of this kind and the Holstein breed such as we put at Qu'Appelle and File Hills are the cattle that should be used and not the so called Shorthorn milching strain that we have put in at Elkhorn. Time will prove that no mistake was made in putting Holsteins at Qu'Appelle and File Hills, most of the Provincial institutions are using the Holstein breed and I think the matter has been thoroughly gone into by the Provincial authorities before making a decision.

If it is possible to have the present Kneading trough metal-lined, it would do, but if not, we should be supplied with an all-metal trough.

I have been requested to write you in regard to these matters at once. I regret that our Agent is away at present in Ottawa. If he is still there when this letter reaches you, I believe that he would endorse my requests. If the matter must be held in abeyance until his return, I shall ask him to go carefully into these matters with me.

Believe me, it our aim here at the school to serve the Indian Department and our Church faithfully and well, so that I feel that the considerations I am asking at the present time, and may be ask for in the future, are asked with this sole object in view, that we may be the better enabled to make this Institution first class in every way.

Principal reports that the school has two good milch cows and six grade cows. You were informed in my letter of January 4th that it is the Department's policy to ask school authorities to make replacements to stock. However, I am convinced that there should be more milking cows at the Old Sun's Indian Residential School; and the Deputy Superintendent General has directed that you be asked to make a report and recommendation. You should also intimate if it is possible for you to secure the proper type of milch cow in the West.

Sir:

I have the honor to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 11th inst. informing me that the Department had a request from the Principal of the Old Sun School to purchase ten additional cows for that Institution. You reminded me I was informed on January 4th last, that it is not the Department's policy to supply stock for schools, but that you are convinced that this school should have more milking cows than they have at present. I am taking from your letter that you propose to supply these cows outright, if you found they were necessary.

I visited this school last week, and I saw eight cows in the stable; two Holsteins that were recently purchased by the school, I was not impressed with them, in fact they are only giving a gallon each at a milking; and six grade cows, which are not of a bad type, in fact I would consider them an average-grade Shorthorns- two of these cows are about to freshen. This will add considerably to the quantity of milk. However, I do not think that even with this additional supply in prospect there will be sufficient milk at the school. I am of the opinion that with an additional three cows, this is all that will be needed at the present time. I am not prepared, however, to leave the choice of these cows to the school authorities.

I presume the Department are anxious to treat all alike, and I wish to inform you that it was only a couple of months ago the Crowfoot School authorities found it necessary to purchase a couple of new cows, and they paid for these out of their grant, and are prepared to buy another couple cows. When they hear the Government are doing this for the Old Sun School, they will naturally want the same treatment, and I think they should have it.

It seems to me these two schools have an ample

opportunity to build up a herd, and not call upon the Department to spend money in this direction; as a matter of fact they should be selling milch cows at these places, instead of the Department buying them for them, especially as these schools have been in operation for so many years. I would, therefore, recommend that three cows be bought for the Old Sun School and three for the Crowfoot School.

Sir:-

I beg to inform you that I am in receipt of a letter from Indian Agent Gooderham, in which he reports that one of the milch cows at the Old Sun School was slaughtered by the Government Inspector, and that no compensation has been received.

The Principal in writing to the Agent says "The animal which was slaughtered was a pure bred Holstein cow, costing the school \$100 about two years ago. We desire to get together a good herd of dual purpose Shorthorns. In a communication from our Commission I received the following instructions."

" Inform the Indian Agent in writing of the  
" slaughtering of the animal mentioned in the  
" report, and request him to take the necessary  
" steps, in accordance with the agreement of his  
" Department, to have this animal replaced by one  
" of the class you consider most suitable. I am  
" of the opinion that one of the Shorthorn class  
" would be the best one to secure."

The Agent goes on to say that he knows nothing about arrangements made with the Department, and that the animal mentioned by Mr. Gibney was not worth \$100 at the time it was slaughtered. I may say also that I do not know of any arrangement with the Department as mentioned by the Commission.



This matter was taken up with the Principal and he stated that the M.S.C.C. had the matter in hand and promised, if possible, to authorize an increase of the milch cows immediately. This is the only solution as the present herd is small and for the most part, very low grade.

I regret that the Agent found it necessary to report that the children at the Old Sun's School are getting no milk, or at least milk from only one cow, and that the herd is just as I have described it, a very inferior lot. The Church should be called upon without delay to remedy this matter. Keeping a lot of Indian children in a school and not giving them a proper supply of milk is to say the least, most unsatisfactory.

Our representatives properly point out that this is a serious matter and calls for immediate remedial action. I should be grateful if you would let me know what steps your Society is taking in this connection.

I might point out that last month the Department authorized Mr. Commissioner Graham to purchase one suitable animal for this school, to replace a cow that was destroyed by order of the Veterinary General. The reports indicate, however, that several head are necessary before a sufficient supply of milk is possible.


