
Rev. and Dear Sir,-







Rev. Sir:

I have to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 10th instant, enclosing a voucher in favour of Yates, Neale & Company for \$18.69 covering repairs to laundry boiler at the Brandon Indian Residential School.

In connection with the payment of future accounts for expenditure at this school, I have to refer you to the enclosed memorandum dated March 16, last, regarding the new financial procedure and encumbrance system. I would refer you to paragraphs two and three, from which you will observe that no expenditure must be incurred, for which this Department will be called upon to pay, until the necessary authority has been granted. You should, therefore, before undertaking any repairs, alterations, etc., report the matter to the Department, giving full details as to the cost of material and labour, and receive authority before incurring any expenditure. It is necessary, under our new financial system, that an encumbrance be obtained before any expenditure is authorized. I would request that you be guided regarding all expenditure in accordance with the enclosed memorandum.

For your information, I may add that there is only approximately the sum of \$300 available in our Appropriation for the current fiscal year for repairs or work of any other nature at the Brandon Residential School. Our Appropriation has been so greatly reduced this year that it will be necessary for the school to pay the cost of replacements and repairs of a minor nature from per capita allowance or other receipts of the school. The account of Yates, Neale & Company referred to above, is returned herewith, as it is considered that the repairs made to the laundry boiler and stove, being in the nature of replacement, should be paid by the school.

Dear Sir:

I have your letter of May 19, #133-0-5, and I wish to thank you for your definite information as to the amount that is available for repairs for this school for the current fiscal year. This amount will not be at all adequate to meet the repairs that ought to be done but we will govern our requests so that we will not exceed this amount and will improvise for other repairs as necessity demands and a number of things of course will have to stand over until funds are available.

I am now making request for permission to send bills in favor of the Brandon Heating and Plumbing for the following items:

1. Leak accured in the hot water pipes running through the ceiling just over the girls study room, we had to have the plumber at once to open up the plaster, breaking through the metal lath in order to locate the leak and repair the pipe, this will cost approximately \$9.00.
2. During the scarcity of water in the wintertime we were without water supply in the hot water system in the Principal's residence for some days, when the water did come the pipe's were stopped up with the accumulation of the formation that had been gathering for many years, a roaring noise warned us of danger of explosion, we had to call the plumber in this emergency and the cost of this is also \$9.00.
3. The jacket heaters in the school have never been satisfactory. We have had to abandon their use and keep a fire in one of the furnaces to maintain our supply of hot water in the building. It is therefore, necessary to have a valve or valves installed to prevent the steam from going through the pipes of the whole building during the hot weather. The cost of this
