Sir, -

Referring to ~~second~~ paragraph of Departmental letter No. 165-0-5, dated Sept. 11th.

I am now enclosing a rough sketch supplied by the Rev. Principal showing what he would recommend. ~~This, as you suggest, is to be below ground.~~ The estimated cost of the material alone will be around \$1200.00, but it will be impossible for the Rev. Principal to build this by day labor, as he has not got men available, but recommends that a contract be let for this.

I might say that this building is very essential, as it will provide for a gymnasium and play room for the boys during the winter months.

Then again the school is short store room, wood shed, blacksmith and carpenter shop, shoe repairing room and the present manual training room is far too small for the present number of pupils, and furthermore the school is short 2 bedrooms for outside staff.

The lay of the land lends itself very well for a basement that can be used for these purposes without very little expense.

With this addition the school will be well equipped, and I would like to recommend that this be erected with as little delay as

possible..






Dear Sir-

Regarding the rough sketch of the proposed new storage and repair shops for this school which I have just submitted to Indian Agent Graham and which he has endorsed and recommended having gone over the situation with me, I thought it best to make some further comment for ~~the~~ your information.

Regarding the basement which I purpose dividing into four parts one room 20x17 for the installation of the refrigeration plant taking out of the school basement as it is not proving at all satisfactory in its present position owing to it being of such handy access to the Kitchen. The milk butter bacon and ect being kept in it causes considerable opening of the door allowing the temperature to fall rapidly necessitating the constant use of the engine and the quick fall and rise is not the best for the keeping of meats.

The remaining part of this division 17x20 left as an open shed ~~is~~ to be used as a wood shed and to keep in it the axes saws ect in use rather than having them standing in the corner of the school base ment or in the corner of the fence.

The middle of this floor 35x35 to be used for storage of storm sash extra beds & bedding ect, now housed in the top dormitory and which we now need for children as we are now running 140 it is essential to relieve these rooms.

The remaining 20x35 to be made into two bedrooms for extra farm help now occupying one room in the school building necessitating the use of one bedroom in the residence to accomodate one of the teachers which at the present time is occupied by her.

The first floor divided into three shops shoe repairing, carpenters repair shop and manual training shop. The present room used for manual training is altogether too small necessitating the curtailing of instruction and repetition of classes.

Regarding the top floor. I have asked that the four walls be extended so that this can be used for a playroom for the boys. The roof has necessarily to be put on and with very little added expense the walls could be extended which would add to the looks of the building besides relieving the congestion in the auditorium also giving a playroom for each side.

I wish also by this means to keep in closer touch with the old boys having a club room which they could come to perhaps once a fortnight to play games and carry out the business routine of an organised club.

I feared that perhaps the Dept. would think that the proposition was too elaborate and not warranted but I am sure you can readily see its necessity.

Sir-

As the contractors are responsible for the upkeep of this building for the period of twelve months after finishing, I wish to make the following reports-;

Without exception the doors need repair what really is needed is well seasoned new doors throughout the building as in the majority they have so shrunk as to not latch when closed. If the key is used the doors are so far away from the jam that the locks are of no avail.

The concrete paint was all off in three weeks after the building was occupied.

The tiling in the scullery are loosening up and in patches are liable to fall off.

The baseboards in many cases has warped and with the quarter round has come away from the floors. This is general throughout the building.

The varnish on the outside doors has not stood the weather and these are ready for paint again.

The drinking fountains should also be replaced for as they evidently were of the very poorest.

In some cases the concrete is coming out of the stair steps.

The plaster is coming off in spots.

I trust that these will be attended to at the earliest possible moment especially the doors and tile in the scullery.
