Sir:

I have your 407-11A of the 29th ultimo, regarding the supplying of the farm machinery required for use at the Blue Quills Indian Residential School.

In reply I have to say that you may obtain prices, F.O.B., St. Paul, from the local agents of farm machinery firms in the district, as mentioned on the list which was sent you under cover of official letter of May 10, 1932, and place the order with the firm quoting the lowest price for the supplying of the following equipment:

- 1 - 16" Breaking Plow,
- 1 - 16" Disc,
- 1 - 20-run Drill,
- 1 - Set Spring Tooth Harrows.

Besides the firms above referred to, you should also obtain prices from the Cockshutt Plow Company, St. Paul, represented by James Fraser.

The usual discount allowed this Department should be granted.

After the purchase has been made, you should obtain accounts, in triplicate, covering the cost. These you should certify in the usual manner and forward for payment. I enclose Encumbrance Certificate authorizing the funds required for the purpose. Please state on each copy of the voucher which you submit that the expenditure has been authorized by E.R. #451.

The purchase and delivery of the above mentioned farm machinery should receive your early attention.

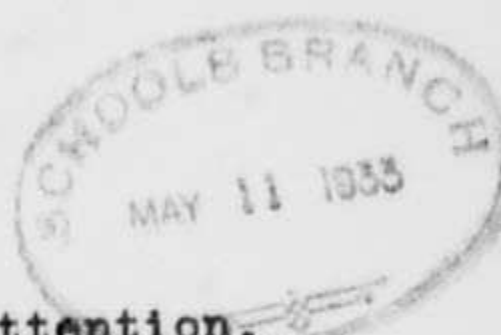

Sir:

I have your 407-11A of the 2nd instant, regarding the request of the Principal of the Blue Quills Indian Residential School to be supplied with a dual purpose Shorthorn bull.

In reply I have to say that you may arrange for the purchase, to the best advantage, of a bull of the type and age which you consider would be suitable. The animal purchased should be tested and be free from Tuberculosis. You should endeavour to obtain the bull at the most reasonable price possible.

513 I enclose Encumbrance Certificate, authorizing the funds, to an amount not exceeding \$150, in the above mentioned purchase. It is hoped that, if possible, you can obtain a suitable animal at a lower price. Please forward an account, in triplicate, properly certified, covering the expenditure incurred. I shall be pleased if you will give the purchase of this animal your early attention.

The Department will have no funds this year to purchase any further cows for this school.

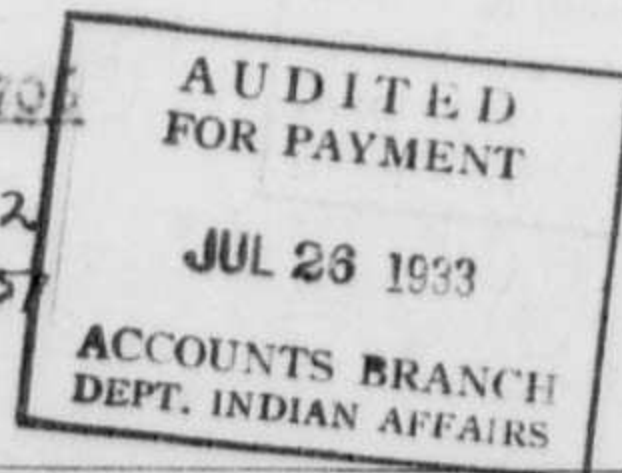

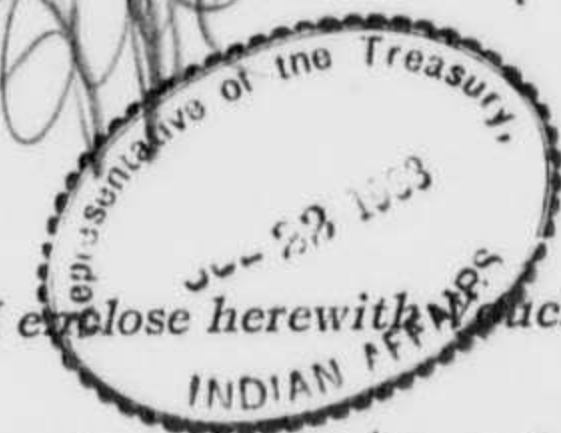

Dear Mr. Christianson:

In my estimate to the Department last year I asked for 6 work horses and 2 double harnesses that we may prepare our land for the seeding. These horses and harnesses will be absolutely needy soon next spring, and I would be satisfied if you could ask the Department that horses and harnesses be supplied to the school during April.

We have 130 acres to seed this year, but out of these 130 acres 100 have to be ploughed very carefully, as it will be the first ploughing since the land was broken. Just now I have only 6 horses for this work and it is completely insufficient. I hope that you will obtain from the Department horses and harnesses. I suppose that now you enjoy a very good health.

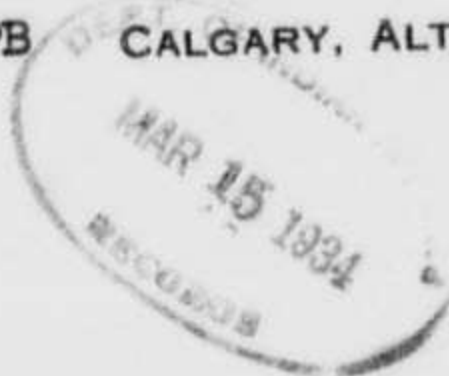

Sir:

I beg to acknowledge receipt of Department's letter No. 118-1-14 of the 19th instant in connection with the 6 horses and 2 sets of harness asked for by the Principal of Blue Quills Indian Residential School in the Saddle Lake Agency. In reply would state that to carry out the programme of the school re farming operations, the Principal actually requires the six horses and two sets of harness. I find that horses up in that country are worth about \$90.00 each. They can be purchased from farmers in the vicinity as no doubt most good farmers would be glad to sell a team of horses as cash is very scarce around St. Paul at the present time. I think it would be safe, if the horses were authorized, to let Mr. Gullion buy them, as I noticed the last time I was around with him that he was a fairly good judge of live stock. I would not have the time to go up there just now. The roads are impassible and I am very busy.

The harness could be purchased from the Great West Saddlery Company here and shipped from their Edmonton branch. Good harness can be bought for about \$35.00 per set.
