Dear Sir:-

Re yours dated July 12th. The Rev. Father Mackie informed me I should accompany him to purchase two horses and one cow for the Indian School at Shubenacadie. There was nothing to indicate what price they propose paying for the animals.

I purchased the two horses which in my opinion are nine and ten years of age respectively and practically sound. These horses were in good condition and had the advantage of being acclimated as well as used as a team.

The cow is a high grade Gurnsey possessing all the characteristics of an ideal Dairy cow. I consider the price of horses and cow are not exorbitant. In conversation with the biggest dealer of horses in Nova Scotia this date he informed me that he could not duplicate the horses for less money and the same applies to the cow.

Dear Sir:



Regarding the two horses and the cow at Shubenacadie, I have written Dr. Gough asking him to give me a statement over his own signature explaining the prices which he agreed to pay and giving me information about the just value and serviceability of the stock. I have his letter in reply which I enclose to you.

I very much regret that there is this wide difference in the values placed upon the horses. The difference between the values placed upon the cow is not at all serious. In view of the fact that Dr. Gough definitely states that in his opinion the horses were nine or ten years old, and that he placed the valuation on them at the time they were bought, and that they are apparently satisfactory for the work required of them, and that the seller parted with them on the faith of an agreement to pay him \$525.00 for them, and of the fact that the Government has taken delivery of them, accepted them and used them ever since, it would appear to me that there is nothing for your Department to do but to pay the price agreed on. Will you kindly advise me whether this view meets with your approval.

Archibald, of the Live Stock Branch of the Department of Agriculture, Truro, act in conjunction with him in making the purchase. Father Mackey states that, in company with Mr. Archibald, he has looked at a number of horses, and they both recommend the purchase of a pair of Clydes, 5 and 7 years old, mares, owned by Harry H. Gupzell, Wall Brook, Kings County, at a price of \$450. They are guaranteed to be absolutely sound and come the nearest to what is required for farm purposes.

As a wire is requested, authorizing the purchase, I shall be pleased to be informed at the earliest possible date if the purchase of these horses at the price mentioned meets with your approval.

I have your letter of the 14th instant, relative to the purchase of a team of horses for the use of the Shubenacadie Indian Residential School and enclosing a communication from Mr. C. A. Archibald, of the Dominion Live Stock Branch, Department of Agriculture. In this connection I have to confirm the following telegram to you of today's date:-

"May purchase team of horses from Guptell, subject to veterinary inspection, also harness, as per your letter fourteenth instant."

It is noted that the horses which can be obtained from Harry H. Guptell for the price of \$450 are Clydes, mares, 4 and 7 years old, respectively, and that Mr. Archibald is of the opinion they are good value for the price asked, viz.: \$450. They should be examined by a veterinary and the purchase made subject to passing his inspection that they are absolutely sound in all respects. The Department will also approve of you purchasing the set of harness for the sum of \$50. It is noted that this harness is in good condition.

We would be able to handle them here early in January.

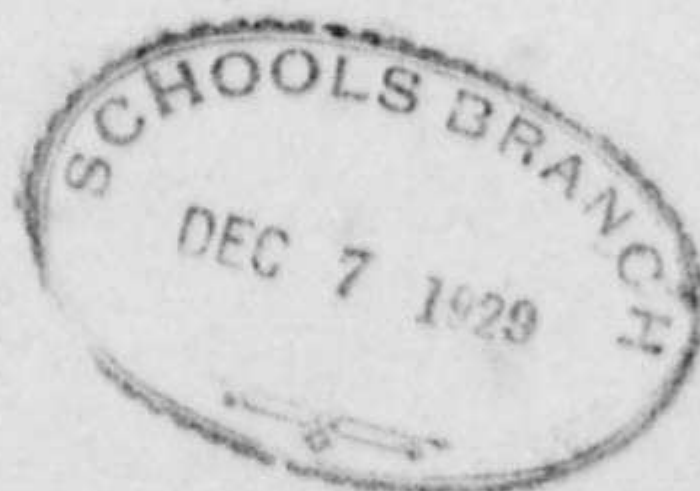
