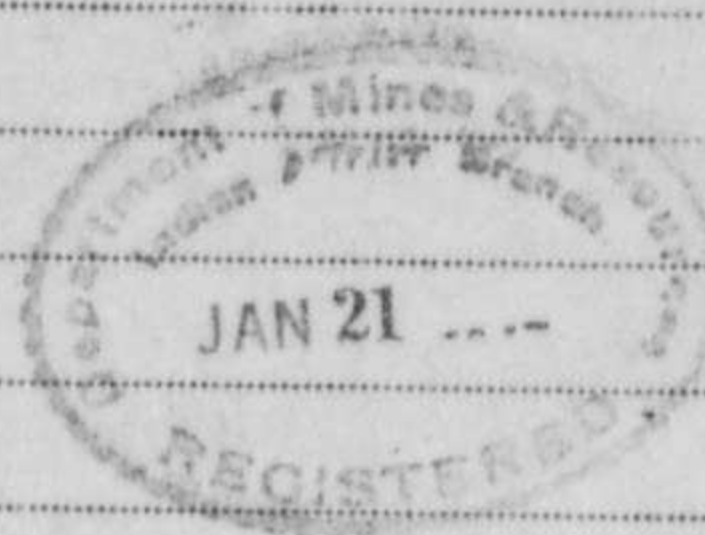

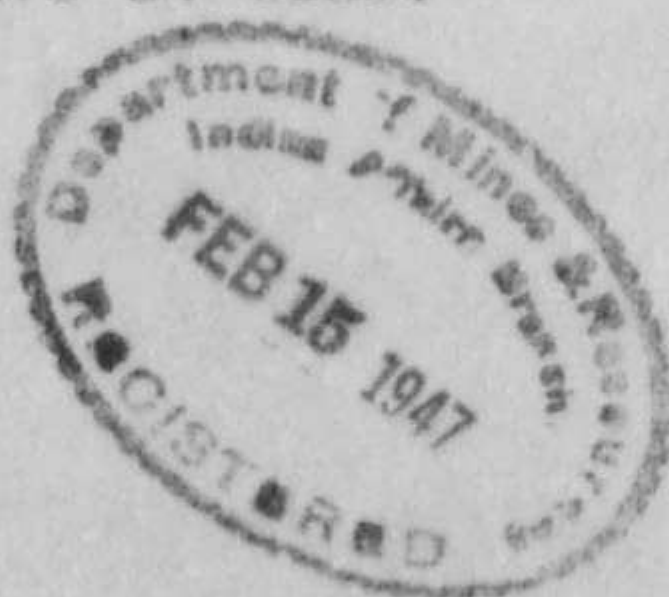

I wish to submit the following with reference to a proposed job of insulation at the Onion Lake R. C. Indian Residential School.

*OK
P.D.*
A 20' x 20', two story addition was built about 15 years ago. The lower story is used for a storage room and the upper for a sewing room. The building is too cold in winter and the sewing room most unsatisfactory for that reason. This could all be remedied by insulating the walls and ceiling. With this object in view, the Principal of the School, Reverend E. Pascal, asked Macleod's Limited, Lloydminster, for an estimate on the job. Macleod's have offered to do the completed insulation job for the sum of \$ 311.00, for both material and labour.

When I visited the School on the 5th instant, I was requested to communicate with the Department and ask for authority to have the work proceeded with. I am acquainted with the need for this work and would recommend that authority be granted to have it done.

Rev. Dear Sir,

Acknowledging your letter of January 24th., enquiring for an estimate of the cost of repairs to your 25 H.P. Fairbanks-Morse Type Y Style H.B. engine, it is very difficult from this distance to say exactly what the cost might be without a very complete list of the new parts required and some idea of the present condition of your engine.

A new crankshaft alone would cost \$484., and there may be a good many other parts required, such as bearings, injection items, fuel pump items, governor parts etc., all of which are fairly expensive. Labour may take a day or two, or as long as a week, depending upon the condition of the engine. Our regular charge for the services of a repair man is \$16.00 per day, plus travelling, hotel and living expenses, from the time he leaves our plant until his return. In your territory, it will no doubt be closer to have the service man from our Calgary Branch do the work.

We trust with the above information you will be enabled to arrive at an estimate of the cost, knowing perhaps much better than we do, the exact condition of your engine.



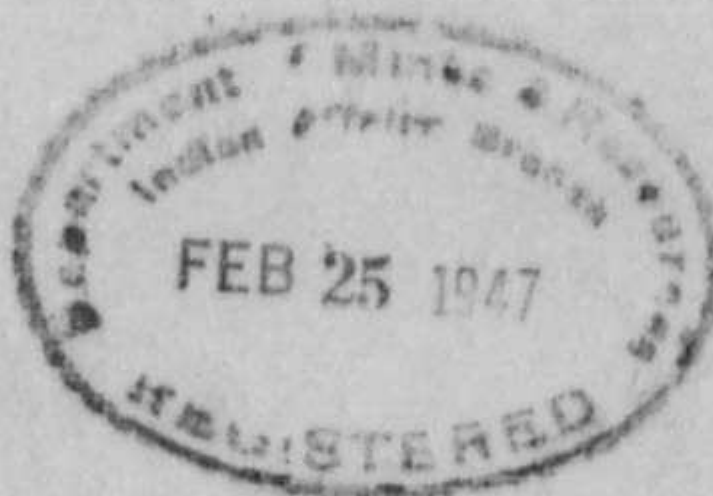

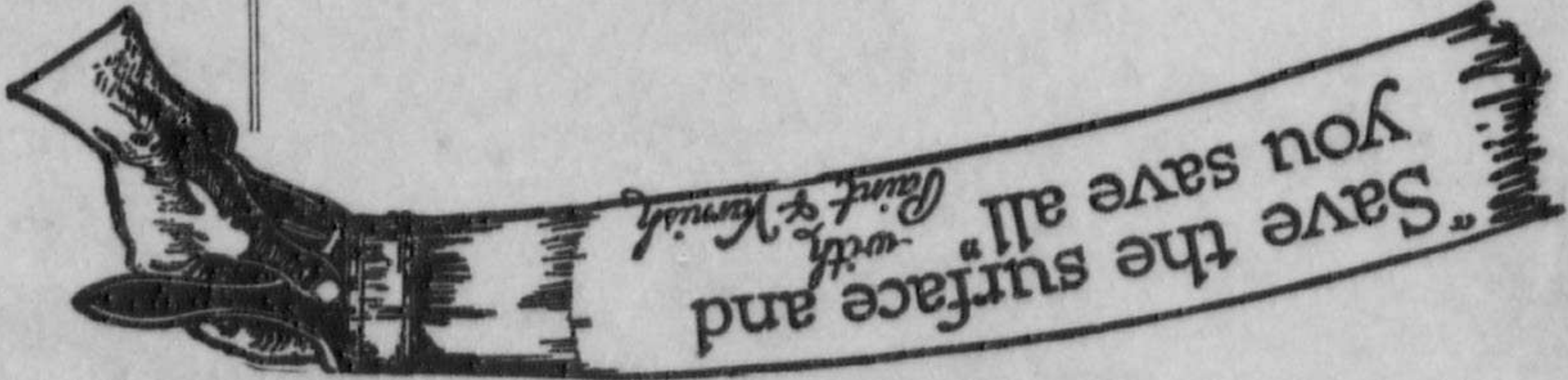

Dear Mr. Phelan,

On the occasion of my last visit to the Onion Lake School, the then acting principal asked for a new engine and generator, as the one that is now in use is very old and needs such extensive repairs that the purchase of a new one will be more economical and serve the needs of the school much better.

On my return to Winnipeg, I saw the manager of the Mumfor-Midland Engine Co. concerning the Lister-Diesel engine which they have for sale and he quoted \$2,734. for an 18 h.p. and 10 kgl. generator.

An outfit of this kind will advantageously replace the old engine now in operation at the school. It will also be more economic to operate.

As the winter season will soon set in, I hope that the order for the outfit will be placed without delay so that it may be in operation at least by the first of December of this year.



We have received a request for a new engine and generator at the Onion Lake R.C. Residential School.

It is stated that the one now in use is very old and needs such extensive repairs that the purchase of new equipment would be more economical and serve the needs of the school much better.

In connection with the above I would refer you to your letter of February 20th and our reply of February 27th, 1947. At that time we authorized the overhauling of the engine either immediately or in the spring. Has the engine been overhauled? If not, can this be done immediately?

It is my understanding that w
when Mr Cameron first took up the question of
repairs to the engine at Onion Lake R.C.
School, the cost of the crank shaft was approx:
\$500.00 and the installation charges would cost
approx: \$20.00 per day, and on this basis the
Principal was advised to proceed with the
repairs.

To date the engine has not been
overhauled, and the repairs have not been
carried out.

About a month ago I spoke to
the new Principal, who informed me that he was
having difficulty in this connection, and that
the Co: had advised him the cost of a new crank
shaft and installation would be in the neigh-
bourhood of \$1000.00. He stated that from
his experience with this particular engine over
a period of years, that the general condition
of the machine was very bad, and that even if
it were possible to have the authorised repairs
done, the engine performance would be far from
satisfactory, and a new engine in the long run
would be more economical.

I pointed out that authority
had been obtained for repairs only, but that
if in his opinion a new engine was necessary,
he should immediately make application through
the Agency Office to this effect, and submit
his reasons for the new request, together with
comparative costs etc: in order that I could
take the matter up with the Dept:

It is apparent from your a/m
letter that the Principal did not interpret
my instructions correctly.


