

I wish to refer to my letter of this file number of June 14th, last, concerning what stock and agricultural machinery is necessary to supplement the present equipment at the St. Cyprian Indian Residential School, on the Peigan reserve. I have to inform you that a recent requisition asks the Department to supply:-

1 wagon with box,	2 teams of horses with harness,
1 gang plough,	50 hens,
1 drill,	3 geese,
1 disc harrow,	2 brood sows.
1 drag harrow,	
1 tooth harrow,	
1 cultivator,	
1 hay mower,	
1 hay rake,	
1 binder.	

I may state that, in addition to this list, the church authorities have requested several small items such as forks, shovels, rakes, as well as a cream separator, a churn, etc., for the dairy. I should be grateful if you would let me have a recommendation. It might be well to have a list of their present equipment prepared.

Sir:

I have to acknowledge receipt of Department No. 116-1-14 dated the 31st ultimo with reference to stock, agricultural machinery, and tools required at the St. Cyprian Indian Residential Day School. Inspector Christianson informs me that all that the school has now in the form of outside equipment is a team of horses, an old wagon, and a democrat. I think, therefore, that it would be well to provide them with some of the articles mentioned in your letter referred to, such as:

- 1 wagon with box, 135
- 1 gang plow, 125
- 1 drill, 250
- 1 disc harrow, 80
- 1 drag harrow, 75
- 1 cultivator,
- 1 hay mower,
- 1 hay rake,
- 2 teams of horses with harness. 500

I do not recommend a tooth harrow and the purchase of a binder can be provided for but left over until nearly harvest time when we ascertain what has been the result of their farming operations. In regard to the poultry, this is a matter for the Department to decide but the request to be supplied with geese is unusual. If the Department desires, we could buy two brood sows



brood sows but this is a new requisition and I can recollect only providing the school at Morley with sows. Small tools such as forks, shovels, rakes, etc. will of course be needed and if the Department will sanction the purchase of what is required, I will undertake to see that they are bought.

We provided a Cream Separator, a churn, etc. for the St. Paul's and St. Mary's Schools, and if the Department wishes we could make the same provision for the St. Cyprian School.


