

Sir:

In your letter, No. 2543-W "A", of February 14th, you enclosed a report from District Engineer Webb, with reference to the water supply at the Alberni Indian Residential School. This report showed that Mr. Webb estimated the cost at \$1,360.

No action was taken at that time, but, on September 24th, a telegram was received from Indian Commissioner Perry, stating that Mr. Webb recommended immediate action along the lines suggested in the report mentioned in the first paragraph of this letter. The matter was taken up with the Minister and the following telegram was sent to Mr. Perry on the third instant:-

"Authorize Dominion Water Power Branch to install water supply, Alberni School, at cost not exceeding Thirteen Hundred Sixty Dollars. If labour or materials are required, consult Reese H. Hague, Alberni."

I am now in receipt of a copy of Mr. Webb's telegram to you, of the 17th instant, and it appears that the cost of installing a suitable water system at the Alberni Residential School will exceed the original estimate of \$1,360 by an amount of \$69.89.

I would appreciate if you would authorize Mr. Webb to proceed with this work at once, making purchases from the best sources of supply and engaging the necessary labour. No doubt, Mr. Webb will be able to do this.

MEMORANDUM:

The Honourable the Superintendent General,-

Owing to a severe storm last February, there was a serious break in the water main supplying the Alberni Indian Residential School (Electoral District of Comox-Alberni), B. C.

Temporary repairs were made at that time, but the Indian Agent now advises that further work will be necessary in order to insure this school having an adequate water supply for the winter.

Mr. C. C. Webb, District Chief Engineer of the Dominion Water Power Bureau, has visited Port Alberni and has recommended an installation costing \$1,360.

The installation will have to proceed at the earliest possible date, as, if delayed until later in the season, no work could be done owing to high water. Funds for the purpose are available in the Appropriation for Indian Education, and I should appreciate your concurrence in authorizing Mr. Webb to proceed with this work.





With further reference to my letter of even date enclosing payroll for the month of November for E.H.Tredcroft amounting to \$178.34 for 29 days in November. Mr. Tredcroft worked one day in October making a total of 30 days employment as authorized, on the pipeline repairs Alberni Indian Residential School.

Due to the inclement weather the work took slightly longer than was anticipated. While at the school, at the request of the Indian Department officials I had Mr. Tredcroft look into the matter of developing a water supply for fire protection as the domestic source is insufficient. Mr. Tredcroft stayed three days after his authorized time to complete this report and the report on the work which he carried out. With your approval I will pay him from Indian General funds for the three extra days at the same rate at which he has been employed.

Sir:

Your telegram of the 21st inst. is acknowledged with respect to payment to Mr. E.H. Tredcroft for work on the Alberni pipeline repairs. It is noted the Indian Department suggest that this should be paid from advance of \$1430.00 as part of labour costs, in view of the fact that allowance was made for supervision in Mr. Warren's report of February 9, 1935. Unfortunately the total expenditures on this project to date amount to \$1427.46. The amount provided in the estimate was \$1430.00. The three days pay due Mr. Tredcroft for November 30th and December 2nd and 3rd, amount to \$18.11.

It will therefore be impossible to complete the payment from the appropriation. I think it would be advisable to take the remainder of the monies due Mr. Tredcroft from the Indian General Account which is an advance against minor general investigations and studies throughout the province.

Please wire the decision of the Indian Department as I have a report to submit on the repairs to the domestic water supply system and wish to close out the account under E.R.3855.

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
