I am obliged for your letter of the 31st ultimo with respect to Indian water licences in British Columbia, from which it is noted three final licences were issued to the New England Company in respect to their holdings which are now vested in the Indian Department.

The Indian lists of January 2nd are being corrected by the addition of the three licences referred to, as follows:

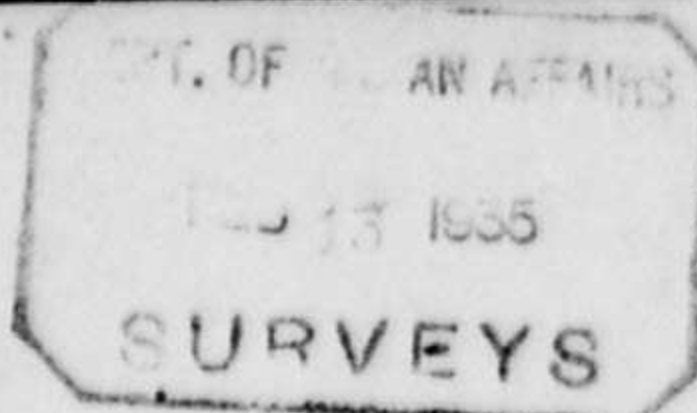

In reply to your letter of the 8th instant, relating to Water Licences in connection with St. George's Indian residential school, I have to advise you that as the Department purchased this property, the Water Licences are held to be vested in this Department. 3140

The departmental files contain a copy of Final Licence No. 4815, but Final Licences Nos. 3410 and 3685, do not appear to have been received in the Department. In order to complete the departmental files, it is requested that you arrange for copies to be forwarded. Departmental file also shows Final Licence No. 9006, dated 20th Nov. 1934, in substitution of Conditional Licence No. 8980.

Under date of 21st Sept. 1934, the Department was notified that the time for completion of works and putting water into beneficial use, in respect to C.W.L. No. 7857, Huckleberry Creek, was extended to 31st Dec. 1937. Under date of 17th Dec. 1934, the Department was notified that Conditional Storage Licence No. 7858, issued in connection with C.L. No. 7857 was extended to 31st Dec. 1937.

Dear Mr. Webb:

In further reply to your letter of February 7th, instant, concerning the water licenses connected with the St. George's Indian Residential School, Lytton Agency, B.C., I have pleasure in sending you herewith copy of letter dated 18th February, instant, No. 165-0-9X, received at this office from the Department at Ottawa.

It will be noted that the Department refers to license No. "3410", which appears to be a typographical error, the official number of this license appearing on the Comptroller's records as 3140. The Department's attention is being called to this.

I shall thank you to kindly obtain from the Comptroller of Water Rights copies of final licenses 3140 and 3685 to be forwarded to the Department as requested, and issued in the name of the Department. As this office has no copies of these two licenses, I would like to have copies also to complete our records, if convenient.

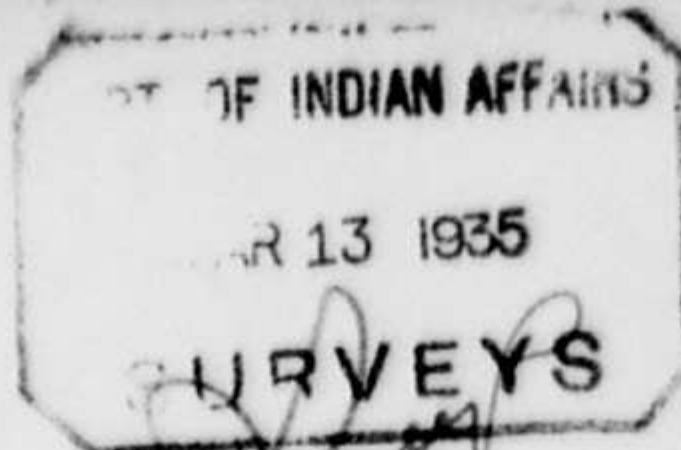

- (f) The period of the year during which the water may be used is 1st April to 1st October.
- (g) The area and description of the particular hereditament upon which the water may be used are as follows: Lots 11 and 12, Lytton and part Sections 13, 14 and 23, Township 15, Range 27 (275 acres irrigable).
The extent and location of the said hereditament are more particularly shown by cross-hatching in the said exhibit "A".
- (h) A concise description of the works is given in the said exhibit "A".
- (i) The other terms and conditions respecting the right herein determined are:-
 - (1) The total quantity of water used under the said licence in any season shall be based upon the number of acres of the above-described lands which are actually and beneficially irrigated; and the quantity of water used per acre shall be limited to such quantity as experience may hereafter indicate to be necessary for the production of crops in the exercise of good husbandry.
 - (2) Having due regard to the priority of the said licence, the said owner or occupant shall take and use the said quantity of water, on being so directed by a proper officer of the Water Rights Branch, at intervals of time, under such system of rotation with other water-users on the same stream, or otherwise, as may best meet the requirements of growing crops and at the same time secure an economical use of water.
- (j) The owner or lawful occupant of the particular hereditament in respect whereof the said licence is to be issued shall be the licensee under the said licence subject to the provisions of the "Water Act".
- (k) In addition to the quantity allowed for irrigation purposes 1000 gallons of water per day may be used for domestic use throughout the whole of the year and may be diverted and conveyed through the irrigation system. (Subject to riparian rights of Indians (if any)).

3. Pending the issue of the licence hereby authorized to be issued, the terms and conditions of this order shall govern the respective rights of the record-holders and claimants affected thereby.

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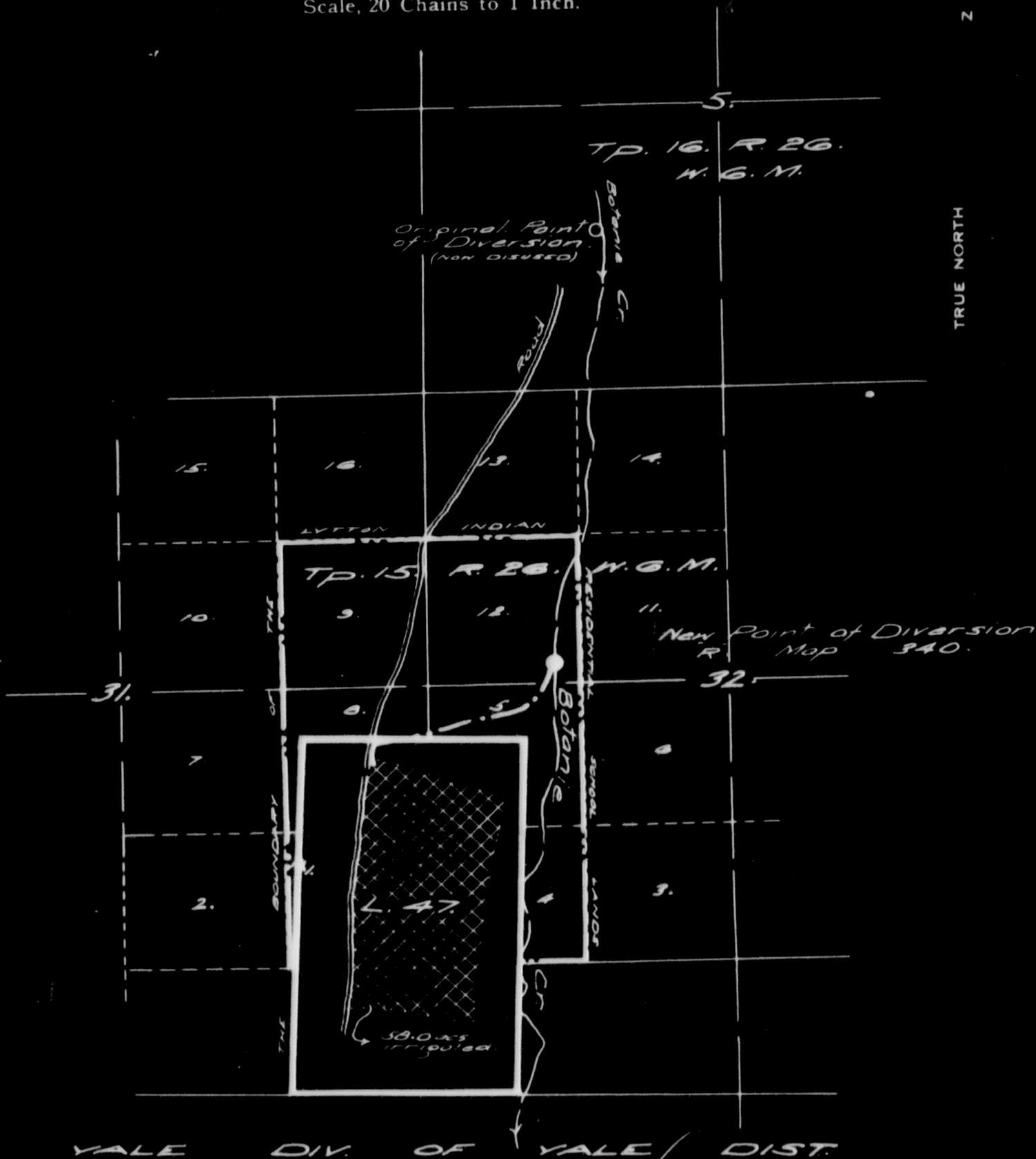
