Sir:-

I am in receipt of a letter from the Rev. Father Levern, Principal of the R.C. Indian Residential School on the Peigan Reserve, who asks to be supplied with certain equipment this Spring, in order that he may start to prepare a farm before the new school is in operation, which I think is a very wise plan. He asks for three sets of harness, plow with breaker bottom, disk, waggon and anything else that may be required. He asks for six work horses. I do not know that I am prepared to recommend the purchase of six horses, as I think four should be ample, but the implements asked for seem to me to be necessary.

I shall be glad to know if this equipment can be supplied to the school.



My dear Mr. Scott:-

Reverend Father J. L. Levern, Principal of Peigan Indian Residential School, had requested from the Department the purchase of a few horses and agricultural implements, all of which were to be used in order to prepare the land for next year.

If my memory serves me right, the Department advised Mr. Graham on June 13th to comply with the Reverend Principal's request. On July 25th, the Commissioner answered the Department that the above articles were not needed for the present year. Of course, he knows best.

On September 25th, Reverend Father Levern spoke of the necessity he had for horses and the implements to Mr. Christianson but on October 18th no news had been received as yet. The Reverend Principal insists upon the urgent need of horses, at least to bring over different things from the old school to the new one. Do you think that he could be accommodated and therefore given authority to buy a few horses for his present needs?

As already reported, the implements are not needed until next Spring, and it now appears that the Principal is not even in a position to take over the horses which I instructed the Inspector to buy while he was in the West. In referring to your letter No. 116-2-14 of November 9th., I note that you point out - "The Rev. Principal has urgent need of horses for hauling from the old school to the new." I am of the opinion that with the horses he has on hand he can find a way of getting along until Spring.

Dear Mr. Graham:-

I have the honour to report on the progress of the two new schools that are being erected on the Peigan Reserve.

The Roman Catholic School is pretty well advanced. The outside of the building was nearly finished and the lathers were at work when I was there and the plasterers arrived the day I left. The plumbing and steamfitting was also well under way, as they expected to be able to turn on the heat as soon as the chimney was finished which they were working at then. The outbuildings which I arranged for on my last visit were also well under way and should be nearly completed now. The Contractor expects to finish the school about the 15th of January.

The Church of England School is not as far advanced. They have, however, made good headway since my last visit. The walls were up as far as the roof, but the part housing the engines and so forth at the back of the school had not been started on, simply the foundation put in.

The barn and other outbuildings which I arranged for on my last visit were almost completed. The men expected to finish a day or so after I left. They have made a very fine job of the buildings and the Principal was highly satisfied with the buildings and the workmanship

the workmanship in general. Mr. Graham, the Contractor on the school, thought he would be able to finish up by the end of January. I doubt this; if he puts on enough men, he will no doubt be able to finish it by then, but the weather will be a big factor in the matter.

Regarding the implements and horses asked for by the Principal of the Roman Catholic School and authorized by the Department. The implements, of course, are not needed at the present time but the two teams of horses asked for, which I had your authority to purchase, will soon be required. However, I found that the Principal was not in a position to take the horses at the present time as I knew previously. He has only a small amount of feed and no place to keep them at the present time. I, however, picked out some horses and instructed Mr. Arthur to purchase them at such times when the Principal would be ready to take delivery of them. I did not think it wise to buy the horses now and take delivery of them and turn them out on the prairie.

I did not visit the Church of England School, but I was over at the Roman Catholic School and I had the Principal from the Anglican School up to the office to see me. On the whole, conditions are satisfactory at both schools.

Sir:-

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 20th. instant #116-2-14, in which you authorize me to purchase a wagon for use at the Sacred Heart (Peigan R.C.) Indian Residential School, and reply to say that this matter will be attended to, although I think that a wagon is unnecessary. The question of supplying a wagon was discussed with the Inspector who recently visited the Peigan Agency, and he told me that he thought they could very well get along without one. However, they took this matter up direct with you and I am now authorized to buy the wagon. I think you will admit this puts the Inspector in a very awkward position. It would be much better for the Inspectors not to say anything about matters of this kind, as they would not then be placed in the positions which they sometimes are. Personally I think it would be much safer to rely on the word of the Inspector than on that of the Principal or the Indian Agent. There is a tendency, as you know, on the part of the school authorities to get as much as they possibly can out of the Department when a new school is opened up. We know that they have a good wagon at this school at the present time.

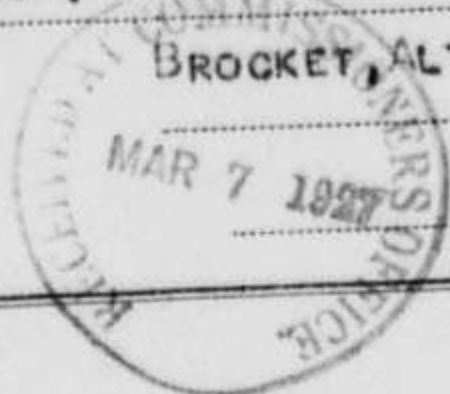
