

In reply to your letter of the 25th instant,
I wish to say that three 36" looms have been ordered
through the Purchasing Branch. You should receive
them in a short while.

The military authorities have not yet released
any of the Moving picture machines and even if they had
I greatly doubt if they would be of very much use to us.
It must be kept in mind that these machines have received
very rough usage because of the conditions under which
they were used. They would probably cause our schools a
great deal of trouble. We have, however, put in our
estimates for the coming year sufficient money to purchase
a number of these machines. We intend to introduce them
gradually. I do not know as yet which schools will
receive these machines as this has not yet been decided.

You may spend an amount not to exceed \$40.00 to
procure Manual Training material for the boy's workshop.
