I beg to report that on July 11th I gave this boiler a careful internal and external inspection and found all stays and plates in good condition. I then gave it a Hydrostatic test of 40 lbs. and found it perfectly tight.

I set the safety valves to blow at 15 lbs. water pressure.

Care must be taken to keep the internal wet legs clean and free from sediment, also the furnace crowns as there was a lot of sediment in them.

I have issued a certificate allowing a steam pressure of 15 lbs. and condition good.

BOILER No. 42028.

On the same day I gave this boiler a similar inspection and found it in first class condition. I set the safety valves to blow off at 15 lbs. The steam gauge is 2 lbs. heavy.

I have issued a certificate allowing a steam pressure of 15 lbs. and condition good.

BOILER No. 42029.

I also gave this boiler a similar inspection and found it in first class condition. There were some corrosion blisters on the tubes and furnace crowns which must be kept clean. The previous water treatment for the three boilers numbered above must be continued. I set the safety valves to blow off at 15 lbs. water pressure. During the Hydrostatic test the blowdown cock was leaking badly and needs regrinding. The steam gauge is correct.

I have issued a certificate allowing a steam pressure of 15 lbs. and condition good.

On the same date I gave this boiler a careful internal and external inspection and found that there was quite a lot of internal corrosion, some corrosion blisters on the furnace crown and tubes. These must be all cleaned off and when raising steam must be done with a slow fire and the water kept in the gauge glass nearly to the top. After steam is formed blow some water down to the proper working level.

I then gave it a Hydrostatic test of 200 lbs. and found it quite tight. The fusible plug must be renewed. I set the safety valves to blow off at 135 lbs. water pressure. The steam gauge is 2 lbs. light.

I have issued a certificate allowing a steam pressure of 135 lbs. and condition good.

X When this boiler is not in use it should be emptied and dried out to prevent corrosion.

AUXILIARY MACHINERY.

✓ The auxiliary machinery is in a very good condition. They have been kept in very good condition and will need no repairs. All the necessary guards have been installed.

✓ My attention was drawn to the large amount of fuel used during the season. The only solution is to install automatic coal stokers of the underfeed type which will make a considerable saving in the cost of fuel as well as greatly add to the efficiency of the plant.

Sir:

The Department has received the report of the Engineer, Public Works Department, B. C., on his inspection, in July, last, of the boilers and machinery at the St. George's Indian Residential School, Lytton.

Boiler No. 44564 - The Engineer states that care must be taken to keep the internal wet legs clean and free from sediment, also the furnace crowns, as there was a lot of sediment in them.

Boilers Nos. 42028 - These were found to be in first-class condition.
and 42029

The Engineer recommends that the fusible plug be renewed on Boiler No. 44006. He further states that the steam gauge is 2 lbs. light. When this boiler is not in use, it should be emptied and dried out, to prevent corrosion.

Please draw the suggestions of the Engineer to the attention of the Principal. He should arrange to have the recommendations carried out - any costs to be paid by the school authorities from per capita or other receipts.



Dear Sir-

Within the past year the School was obliged to replace the third hot water jacket and now the fourth one has cracked.

It would seem that something is radically wrong with this installation because the original heater installed when the school was built should still be functioning but together with it three others have likewise cracked and upto the present time these replacments has cost the school aproximately \$400.00 and now we are confronted with another expenditure of \$130.00.

Twice I have reported the fact of these jackets going in this manner and have asked the Department to bear the cost of replacement which was refused and the school was obliged to carry this extra out of Per Capita Earnings. Now, I am not worrying over past expenditures but as this is the fourth, in six years, of this nature, I think something should be done to remedy the cause.

I would suggest that the Department have a heating engineer look into the matter with the view of ascertaining why this so happens. I beleive myself that the Jacket installed is not of large enough capacity to handle the hot water needs of the school and constant heavy firing results in the cracking of the jacket. It is very evident that something is responsible for such repetitions and I feel the Department now should take steps to remedy the condition.

The hot water proposition in the school has always been a worry and since a constant supply of hot water is so very essential for the Clenliness and health of the children we should have an efficient heating plant in order that the Staff and Children should be sufficiently supplied.



With reference to your letter of the 28th ultimo, enclosing accounts in connection with the irrigation system at the St. George's Indian Residential School, I beg to say that, as you did not enclose a receipted account, the Department is unable to make a refund of the amount charged for oakum.

Our Accounting system will not permit our refunding to the school \$37.20 for trucking. It is presumed that this latter work was done by the school team.

On checking your pay lists it is found that they total \$409.93, and this amount, together with the amount paid for nails, viz., \$15.79, makes a total of \$425.72, a cheque for which amount is going forward.
