Dear Sir:

Confirming the writers conversation with yourself and Captain Edwards we enclose our billing to cover the repairs to Kelvinator Refrigeration System at the Cecila Jaffray School. We also attach a duplicate of our previous charge for repairs to this machine in July.

As explained to you this equipment is out of date and having had many years use feel confident in assuring you that this charge has been the result of ordinary wear and tear and has not been occasioned by any lack of care on the part of those responsible for its operation.

The major part of expense in each case has been the re-newing of the refrigerant gas which in this second instance had to be replaced in its entirety as all of the gas leaked out when the machine broke down.

While we have repaired this radiator and cooling coil to the best of our ability would like to go down on record to the effect that there can be no guarantee made against this breaking down at a future date and we would strongly recommend that you consider in the near future the purchase of more modern equipment. Present day machines use methyl or freon gas which is harmless and the S.O.2 is gradually becoming obsolete.

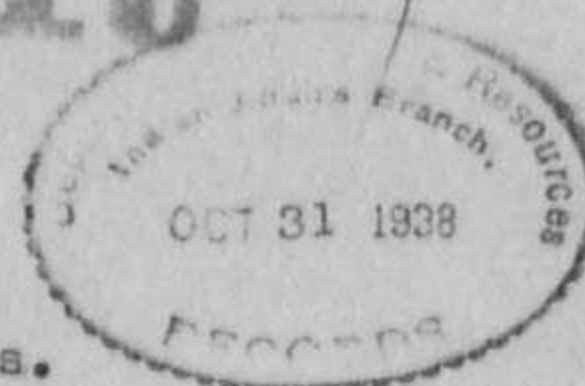





Dear Sir,

I have received a copy of the Grand Jury's report, which has been handed to me by the Local Registrar of the Ontario Surrogate Court.

In connection with our Department the report states as follows:-

"CECILIA" JEFFREY INDIAN SCHOOL.

"Upon visiting this institution we were met by Principal Byers, who conducted our tour of inspection in which we found the following recommendations to be in order.

"In the sleeping quarters of both the boys and girls, new mattresses are badly needed for the beds; this is considered by the Grand Jury as an absolute necessity for sanitation. Upon enquiry we found these mattresses have been in use for some ten years.

"In this school we found 132 pupils, 67 girls, 67 boys, with some 17 of a staff. We make a special mention of the splendid art exhibits and manual training exhibits of this school and also desire to congratulate this school on the production of such a splendid Indian band.

"In the general line up of this school we found that the entire building, both interior and exterior is very badly in need of paint and should be taken care of at the earliest possible date. The condition of the present school is such that a complete paint job should be a profitable investment as there has not been a drop of paint put on the building since it was built ten years ago. In addition to the walls and woodwork inside being in a deplorable condition, the exterior woodwork is beginning to decay for want of paint preservation. This we strongly feel is a matter that should be looked after by the Department of Indian Affairs without delay.

"We found the children clean, happy and well governed in all departments."

"Visiting this school we were met by Father J. Laheras (J. LeMire) who conducted our tour at this point. We found the same condition in this school, as in the other school, in so far as need of paint is concerned. This school also must have paint inside and outside without delay for the preservation of same. We found 94 children in this school. Visiting the kitchen and dining room we found the ceiling in bad condition, the plaster being cracked. However, the beds and mattresses in this school are in fine shape, the mattresses being new.

"One point which we have to draw your attention to is the fire escape which is unsafe owing to the fact that it passes several windows from a point above and for that reason if a fire should break out on the first or second story the escape would be cut off by the fire going out of these windows on the way going down. The landings of the fire escapes are also in poor condition and would recommend that your fire Marshall view this and place his report with the proper authorities. At this time we might also point out that the appropriation of the Department of Indian Affairs is made in March of each year and would therefore suggest that the foregoing request be placed prior to that date."

The Grand Jury's report is signed by the Foreman, Mr M. S. Taylor.

Immediately I received the report I got in touch with Mr Dubois, the Fire Chief for the Town of Kenora, who annually inspects these schools in my company, and renders a report and recommendations for anything he thinks should be done from a fire protection point of view, and he has promised to visit the Kenora R. C. Indian Residential school with me and go into the matter of the Jury's recommendations, and after his inspection he will give me a written report which I will forward to Ottawa as soon as received.

The question of painting is not quite as represented, Father LeMire has done a considerable amount of painting and carpentry work, this was paid for by the School authorities and not the Department, but further painting is necessary.

As regards the Cecilia Jeffrey School, the need for mattresses and painting has been taken up with the department before, but we are informed there are no funds available for this purpose this year.

As all estimates and so forth for the Residential Schools, are in the hands of the Inspector and do not go through our office, I do not like to interfere, although any requests made by the Principals are of course forwarded to the Department either through the Inspector or direct to Ottawa.

He claims that any protection would have to be supported from the ground and not attached to the present escapes as they would not carry the extra load. He did not offer any definite structure. Any suitable protection would probably cost \$200.
