RE: LETTERS TO THE CORRESPONDENCE BRANCH FROM TEACHERS

Almost every day letters are received by the Correspondence Branch from teachers who neglect to state the name or names of the students to whom their letters refer. Before we can answer most of the questions asked, it is necessary that we know the name or names of the student or students concerned. As approximately 1700 students are enrolled annually with the Correspondence Branch and as approximately 300 teachers receive correspondence lessons for use as "lesson helps", it is quite difficult (and sometimes impossible) to locate the record card and the correspondence concerning any particular student or teacher unless his (or her) name is known.

In order that we may be able to answer correspondence more promptly, we request teachers to assist us by stating the name of every student about whom they write and also the grade and the school in which each is enrolled.

If students are enrolled for correspondence instruction in foreign languages only, they should be referred to as "Foreign Language Students" but if they are enrolled for courses in any other subjects as well as French or Latin, do not refer to them as "Foreign Language Students".

If teachers who are using our courses to assist them in their teaching write us concerning such courses, we should be pleased if they would state in their letters that they are receiving "lesson helps".

Teachers should not refer to correspondence students enrolled in their schools as "my students", "Billie", "Mary", etc., but should state their names in full.

Examples: Re: John W. Smith - Grade IX(X, or XII).  
Re: G. William Jones - Grade IX(X or XI) Foreign Language Student.  
Re: Grade IX (X, XI, or XII) Lesson Helps.

Teachers should sign their letters as follows:

*Roy W. Black, or (Miss) Ruth W. Black or (Mrs. R. W.) Margaret J. Black  
Teacher, Winnipeg S.D. No. 1. Teacher, Winnipeg S.D. No. 1. Teacher, Winnipeg S.D. No. 1.*

RE: LETTERS TO THE CORRESPONDENCE BRANCH FROM STUDENTS

When any correspondence student writes about his own course, he should indicate below his signature that he is a correspondence student, the grade in which he is enrolled, and also the name of the school which he attends or, in the case of home study students, the school district in which he lives.

Correspondence students should sign their letters as in the following examples:

*John W. Smith, or (Miss) Ruth W. Black,  
Grade IX (or XII) Correspondence Student, Grade IX (or XII) Correspondence Student,  
Winnipeg S.D. No. 1. Winnipeg S.D. No. 1.*

Students taking foreign languages with other correspondence subjects should sign their letters as above but those who are enrolled for a foreign language only should sign their letters as follows:

*(Miss) Alice J. Brown or George A. Brown,  
Grade IX (or XI) Foreign Language Student, Grade IX (or XI) Foreign Language Student,  
Winnipeg S.D. No. 1 (Home Study) Winnipeg S.D. No. 1.*
