Receipt of the wiring plan for the captionally noted school is hereby acknowledged.

A check of the materials on hand at this Agency discloses that additional equipment in the amount of \$225.00 will be required to complete the job in question.

Mr. Johnson, our Caretaker Grade 5 has checked the surplus electrical materials received at this Agency from Mount Pleasant Airport and he advises there is enough conduit to complete the work. Attached hereto you will find a list of the materials which will have to be purchases either locally or through the Purchasing Agent.

It will be noted that the Elliptical Angle Reflectors and Vapourproof Fittings are not included in the price list due to the fact that quotations could not be obtained up to writing time. However, it is anticipated that the total expenditure for requirements over and above stock on hand will be approximately \$225.00.

With referance to your letter of the 25th ultimo, the Department approves an expenditure not exceeding \$225. for securing additional electric equipment required to complete the work at the Shubenacadie Day School.

With reference to your letter of September 22nd submitting a tender from J.D. Barrett in which he offers to supply the balance of the material required for the plumbing and heating and also to instal the furnace for an amount of \$1736.67, in conversation with Mr. Morris yesterday afternoon he stated that it was his understanding that the work would be done for a considerably smaller amount than that quoted by Mr. Barrett.

The furnace being purchased will cost approximately \$800. and we were hopeful that the balance of the material needed and the installation would cost approximately the same amount. In view of the information given to us by Mr. Morris we would like you to review the matter and endeavour to obtain further tenders from other firms.

As a matter of fact, Mr. Morris says it was his understanding with you that the work could be done by day labour much cheaper than by obtaining a tender.





Further to previous correspondence respecting the plumbing of the captionally noted Indian Day School.

It has been found that we are short of approximately 574 feet of cast iron radiation to complete the job at hand. J. D. Barrett whose firm is doing the plumbing on day's pay, has advised us that he can supply the required radiation for \$475.44, however, it is possible that your Purchasing Agent can obtain a better price than this and if so, I would recommend that immediate action be taken to guarantee delivery at the earliest possible date.

For your information, I would like to point out that I have been in contact with Superintendent Daly of Lennox Island Agency and he advised me that there were no surplus radiators at that point.

May we be advised at your earliest convenience, whether to accept Mr. Barrett's tender for radiation or whether the Purchasing Agent will have an order placed with Crane's Limited or some other firm.
