The Electrical installation of Round Lake Indian School at Round Lake

was inspected on the 22nd day of Sept. 19 41.

DEFECTS:

Circuits overloaded. Outlets extended with flex cord and W.P. wire. Wires not properly supported. Outlets having live wires, loose and uncompleted at ceiling and wall outlets. Fuses plugged. W.P. wire used within buildings on branch circuits.

The above does not conform to the requirements of the Canadian Electrical Code and constitute a danger or a potential danger to life or property. The following changes must be made within 60 days from the date hereof:

Overhaul wiring. Tape up and otherwise complete free ends of wires at outlets. Remove flex cord used to extend outlets. Properly fuse all circuits and support and insulate all conductors in conformity with requirements for open wiring where necessary. Reduce loading on branch circuits to 640 watts or provide additional circuits if required.

Failure to have the defects remedied within the time specified may result in discontinuance of service to the premises.

I have your letter of the 24th instant enclosing report of the Acting Chief Inspector of the Saskatchewan Power Commission with reference to the electrical installation at the Round Lake Indian Residential School. His report reads as follows:

"DEFECTS:

Circuits overloaded. Outlets extended with flex cord and W.P. wire. Wires not properly supported. Outlets having live wires, loose and uncompleted at ceiling and wall outlets. Fuses plugged. W.P. wire used within buildings on branch circuits.

The above does not conform to the requirements of the Canadian Electrical Code and constitutes a danger or a potential danger to life or property. The following changes must be made within 60 days from the date hereof:

Overhaul wiring. Tape up and otherwise complete free ends of wires at outlets. Remove flex cord used to extend outlets. Properly fuse all circuits and support and insulate all conductors in conformity with requirements for open wiring where necessary. Reduce loading on branch circuits to 840 watts or provide additional circuits if required."



In regard to the defective wiring located by Mr. Carpenter at the Round Lake Indian School on the 22nd. of Sept. 1941.


I have been to the school as I was instructed and have listed all the material required and the cost to make the repairs needed. also I have listed the cost of labor.

The labor listed does not include the cost of repairing plaster that might have to be removed.

The Principal has mentioned to me about the heavy voltage loss at his residence, and I find that the line used to carry the power is no. 10 which is too small a wire for such a distance and no. 4 would be required to reduce the voltage drop. however I am listing the cost to make this alteration if you think it should be altered.

With reference to the above noted letter, I beg to forward herewith the estimate for material and labour received from Mr. A. Kendrick for the repairs at the Round Lake Indian Residential School, after he had consulted Mr. Carpenter, Inspector of The Saskatchewan Power Commission.

The total cost as listed is \$207.15, the item of \$78.60 for 1200 ft. of #4 wire leading to the Principal's Residence is not in Mr. Kendrick's opinion absolutely necessary or dangerous, but Mr. Huston requested him to include this, as though there is plenty of power generated at the school, the wires to the house being too small there is a heavy voltage loss, and the lighting not satisfactory.
