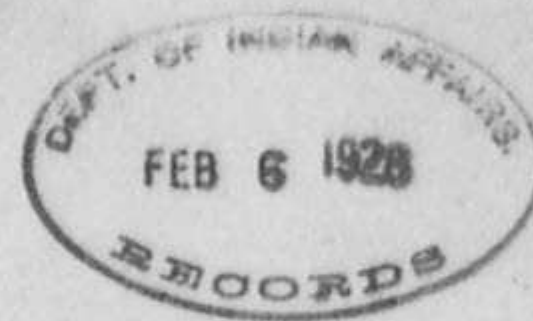

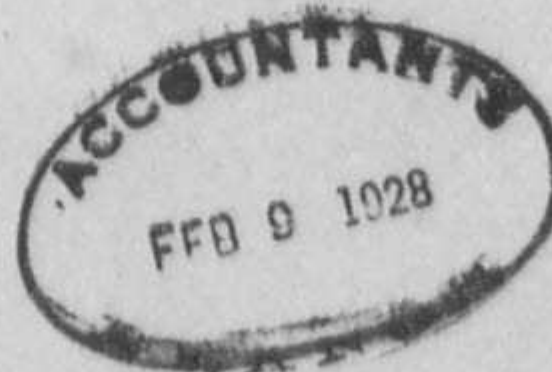

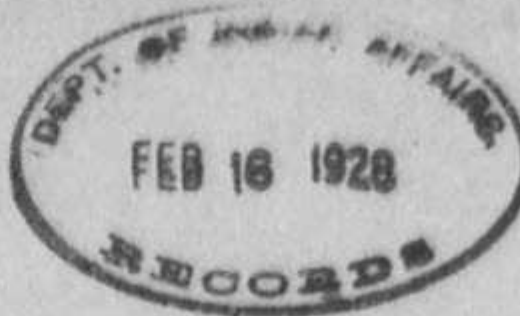

Referring to letter below, from the Deputy Minister of Justice, I have to say that it does not appear that Mr. A. G. Murray, K.C., of Fort Frances, was at any time authorized by the Department to prepare the leases which accompanied Agent Spencer's letters of the 1st instant. You will note that the Departmental letter of January 7th last addressed to Agent Spencer, instructed him to secure these leases, but it was never intended in so far as this Branch is concerned, that he should employ the services of a lawyer for the purpose.

At least Agent Spencer is not capable of drawing up a lease, and employing a lawyer on whose advice to follow it seems that Messrs. Murray & Co. have been prepared here.

I have to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 14th instant, in reference to the accounts presented by Mr. A.G. Murray, K.C. of Fort Frances, Ontario.

In explanation I have to state that on January 7th last, Mr. A. Spencer, Indian Agent at Fort Frances, was requested to give immediate attention to securing twenty-year leases on two lots adjacent to the property connected with the Residential School at Fort Frances. It was expected that he would prepare the leases himself, but apparently he did not feel competent to do so, and on his own authority engaged Mr. Murray.

In view of the circumstances I trust that you will be able to give favourable consideration to the taxation of the account.

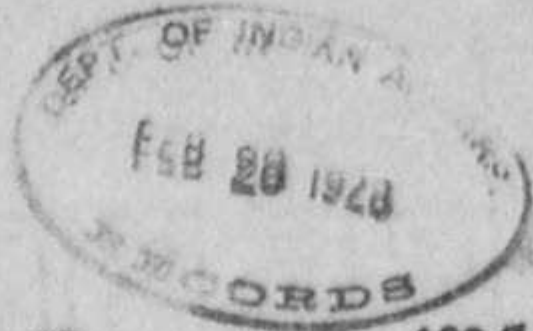



Referring to your letter of the 2nd instant, with which you submitted voucher No.436 for \$10.00 in favour of Mr.A.G.Murray,K.C. for drawing lease of land from Fred Arnold and Charles Jourdain to the Superintendent General of Indian Affairs, I beg to say that, in accordance with the usual custom, the account submitted was forwarded to the Department of Justice for taxation previous to the matter of payment receiving consideration. The Department of Justice taxed the account and it has been paid by cheque No.6102 for the amount stated, and the cheque is going forward, but the Deputy Minister of Justice has requested that you be advised that you had no authority to engage Mr.Murray without the approval of the Minister of Justice, and that in future no legal accounts incurred by you upon your own responsibility will be paid by the Government.

I am glad to inform you, that Mr, Speneer Has Promptly carried out your instructions in regard to the lots of Fred Allen and Charles Jourdain and has leased them for a term of 15 years to the Fort Frances Indian Residential School. I thank you again for that additional land which means so much. I beg to inform you that this spring I will fence these two lots with barb wire, and cultivate the portion already cleared containing approximately five acres. In regard to the rest of the land consisting of about 15 acres, it could not be used in any way for the present even for a pasture before it has been cleared, which will involve too heavy expenses for the school especially if the clearing is made all at once as it should be in order to have that land productive as soon as possible. Therefor I am Making application to the Indian Department to supply me the necessary funds for that purpose. As you have so promptly secured that additional land to encrease the farm of my school. 

He states that there are about 15 acres which cannot be used until it has been cleared, and he is anxious to have this done, in order that this land can be utilised for productive purposes as soon as possible.

Sir:

I have your letter of the 6th instant, informing the Department of the cost of clearing the land which was recently rented for the use of the Fort Frances Indian Residential School. It is noted that there is 12½ acres of land to be cleared and that the cost will be approximately \$300, also that there is a ditch required, which would cost about \$90.

The Department will approve of having this work carried out, and you may arrange to have the above quantity of land cleared and a ditch dug. The work should be performed by day labour, using the services of Indians as far as possible. You should keep proper time sheets, in duplicate, of the labour employed, which should be signed by the man engaged and certified by yourself. Should you require an advance to pay the labour, the same will be sent you upon receipt of a request stating the amount required. The total expenditure for the purpose should not exceed the estimate submitted by you, as mentioned above. This work should be started as soon as possible. The school authorities should assist in the labour as far as possible, without expense to this Department and the work should be carried out under the supervision of the Principal or yourself.

A supply of time sheets for the keeping of labour returns is being sent you herewith.

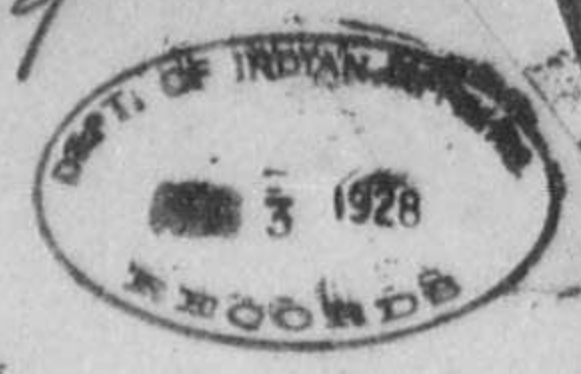

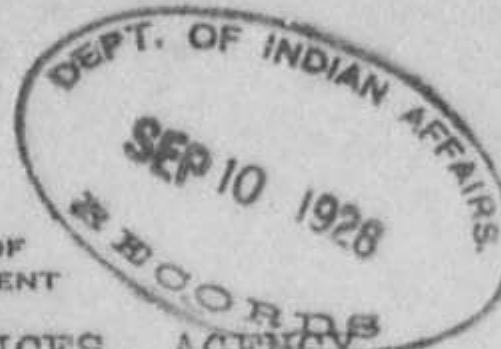
