Re: Basement Floors & School Walls

Dear Mr. Garrard:

I have a copy of a letter re the above matters from Mr. Arneil, Commissioner, forwarded by you for my information. I note that no action is to be taken with a view to correcting the floor conditions until the change is made in the water pipes and until the "Spring run-off".

Will you please advise Mr. Arneil and ask him to convey to the Director of the Lands and Development Branch, that the under floor pipes have now been cut off and it would seem that there is now no further possibility of moisture affecting the floors from that source.

As far as the Spring run-off is concerned, we have had an unusually heavy wet season. The school yard has been flooded in places since last November and there is no frost in the ground. I am attaching an item from the "Vancouver Province", which would indicate that moisture conditions at Alberni are such as to cause comment.

From March 1st it can be expected that these conditions will improve with the beginning of a dry period. Conditions for determining the moisture causes in the floors and walls could not be better than at the present time.

It will be most opportune to renovate the floors during the vacation months of July and August. May I request therefore that investigation of the conditions be made and remedial measures decided upon so that the work may be proceeded with.

I am enclosing herewith Report of the inspection, of Boiler No. 8960, made by Mr. J. E. Halsall, Boiler Inspector of the Dominion Department of Public Works, at the Alberni Indian Residential School, together with copy of Certificate of said Boiler.

Copies of the aforementioned enclosures have been forwarded to the Indian Agent concerned; and the Certificate has been sent to the Principal of the School for posting in the boiler room at the School.

The Agent has been requested to take up with the Principal the remarks in the Report on Boiler No. 8960.

I am advised that the reason the Certificates for the other Boilers were not submitted is due to the fact that these Boilers were only 50% completed as far as inspection was concerned as they were in operation and could not be closed down. Mr. Halsall intends to call at the School later on in the year when he will complete the inspection of the remaining boilers and machinery.



With reference to your letter of the 9th instant regarding the floors at the Alberni Residential School, the Lands and Development Services Branch early this week recommended that the following be installed:

"Asphalt tile is available both in "Greaseproof" and "Standard" qualities. Asphalt tile has excellent wearing qualities and is resilient, moisture proof and low in maintenance and repair costs. It requires no special standard of cleanliness and may be polished with any liquid wax approved for asphalt tile, e.g. "Glo-coat" which requires no buffing. Dark colours are recommended; they are cheaper and easier to keep clean. The application of aquella is optional, since the tile would be laid by an approved applicator, over waterproof primer and asphalt cement.

"Greaseproof" quality (which is higher in price) need only be used in the kitchens and dairy - a total of 72 square yards. Elsewhere "Standard" quality is recommended: both qualities in dark colours 3/16" thick."

In reply they were advised that we would provide the funds required for the purpose and I presume the local officials of the Lands and Development Services Branch in British Columbia will receive instructions in the near future to proceed with the work.

Re: Albarni Indian Residential School.


In accordance with our instructions, Mr. Gurney has investigated the question of covering basement floors of this building with linoleum, after applying "Aquila". In our opinion, Mr. Gurney's estimate of \$3000. is low and we anticipate that the same trouble would recur if great care is not taken.

The alternative of asphalt tile has therefore been studied, and accordingly, under authority of Mr. Hoey's Memorandum of May 19th we have obtained the following data.

Asphalt tile is available both in "Greaseproof" and "Standard" qualities. Asphalt tile has excellent wearing qualities and is resilient, moisture proof and low in maintenance and repair costs. It requires no special standard of cleanliness and may be polished with any liquid wax approved for asphalt tile, e.g. "Glo-coat" which requires no buffing. Dark colours are recommended; they are cheaper and easier to keep clean. The application of aquella is optional, since the tile would be laid, by an approved applicator, over waterproof primer and asphalt cement.

"Greaseproof" quality (which is higher in price) need only be used in the kitchens and the dairy - a total of 72 square yards. Elsewhere "Standard" quality is recommended: both qualities in dark colours 3/16" thick.

On the foregoing basis it is recommended that authority be obtained to have this work put in hand under Mr. Gurney at a cost of about \$3,800.

Colonel Neary, Superintendent of Education, recently wrote Indian Commissioner Arneil to consult the principal of the above school with a view to ascertaining if he would be willing to have asphalt tile floors in the basement rather than the battleship linoleum previously provided.

The following reply has been received from Mr. Arneil:

"With reference to Mr. Neary's letter of April 29th Mr. Caldwell has expressed the opinion that asphalt tile would be likely to withstand wear better than linoleum and that it could more easily be cemented to the floor surface than linoleum. He is under the impression however that some special soap and procedure is necessary to wash tile and that oil or grease may cause asphalt tile to deteriorate.

Dishwashing Facilities - Alberni Residential School.

You will recall that these facilities were the subject of comment in Inspector Davey's report of January 19, 1948.

We have now received a letter from J. L. Gibson, M. P. for Comox-Alberni, requesting that action be taken immediately with regard to the provision of more sanitary dishwashing equipment.

It is presumed that Inspector Davey's report referred to the provision of dishwashing sinks and that he did not refer to a mechanical or electrical dishwasher. It would be appreciated if you could obtain details on the type of sink recommended for this school and forward such details here in the form of a requisition which can be submitted to the Departmental Purchasing Agent. From past experience, it is likely that the purchase of this equipment will exceed your five hundred dollar purchasing authority.
