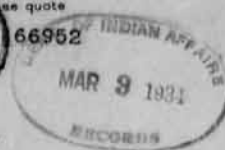

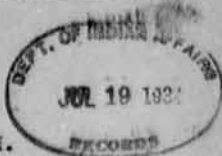



It is understood that several years ago the Department of Indian Affairs forwarded to the Archives a transfer dated the 4th May, 1904, from the Canadian Pacific Railway Company to His late Majesty King Edward VII covering certain lands in the Province of Alberta, viz., the North half, the South West quarter and the North half of the South East quarter of Section 27, Township 21, Range 28, West of the 4th Meridian.


