
I have to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 2nd instant, informing the Department that a new fire box is required for the bake oven at the Mackay Boarding School.







In reference to letter 128-1-5 of June 11th regards wiring at the Mackay Boarding school, I beg to state that this matter has been unavoidably held up on account of my being absent in the north on annuity work.

However, on my return I handed the blue print of the school building to Mr. A.T. Engebretson of The Pas, Man., and asked him if he could give me an outline of the work necessary to put in the wiring.

He has gone ahead and made out a tender on the work, which I enclose, and the Department can see from it what work is required and supply their own forms for another tender if necessary.

There is another plumber in town named Chas Hill, I have not asked him for tender as I had no instructions to do so, but if tenders are asked for a copy could be sent to him.

Although I will be out of town a lot in the near future I will be home at some time every week and can follow out any instructions from the Department without much delay.





Dear Mr. Scott:

In letters just received from the Acting Principal of the Mackay School at The Pas, I am informed that on account of the floods the School will be unable to put up any hay except what can be salvaged from among the willows on the banks of the river and creek and am requested to give him authority to purchase fifty tons which he states he is able to secure from two reliable Indians at the rate of \$12.00 per ton, making a total outlay of \$600.00. As this offer was only available for one week I have sent a wire authorizing this expenditure but as it comes as a heavy and unexpected demand on our Society's resources and exceeds the credit set apart for this School for this year I am regretably obliged to write and ask if your Department will kindly come to our assistance in this matter by making a special grant of \$400.00 to help to meet the cost of the same.







A new lighting system is required at the McKay Indian Boarding School at The Pas. The present system of lighting is acetylene gas and is very unsafe. The cost of installing an electric lighting plant at this school would be approximately \$2,500.00, and the most satisfactory way of having the work done is on a proven cost plus ten per cent basis.

I understand that there are two firms in The Pas, capable of undertaking this work. They are: A. T. Engebretson, and Charles Hill. Will you please advise me the firm that may be employed to carry out this work? Money is provided




