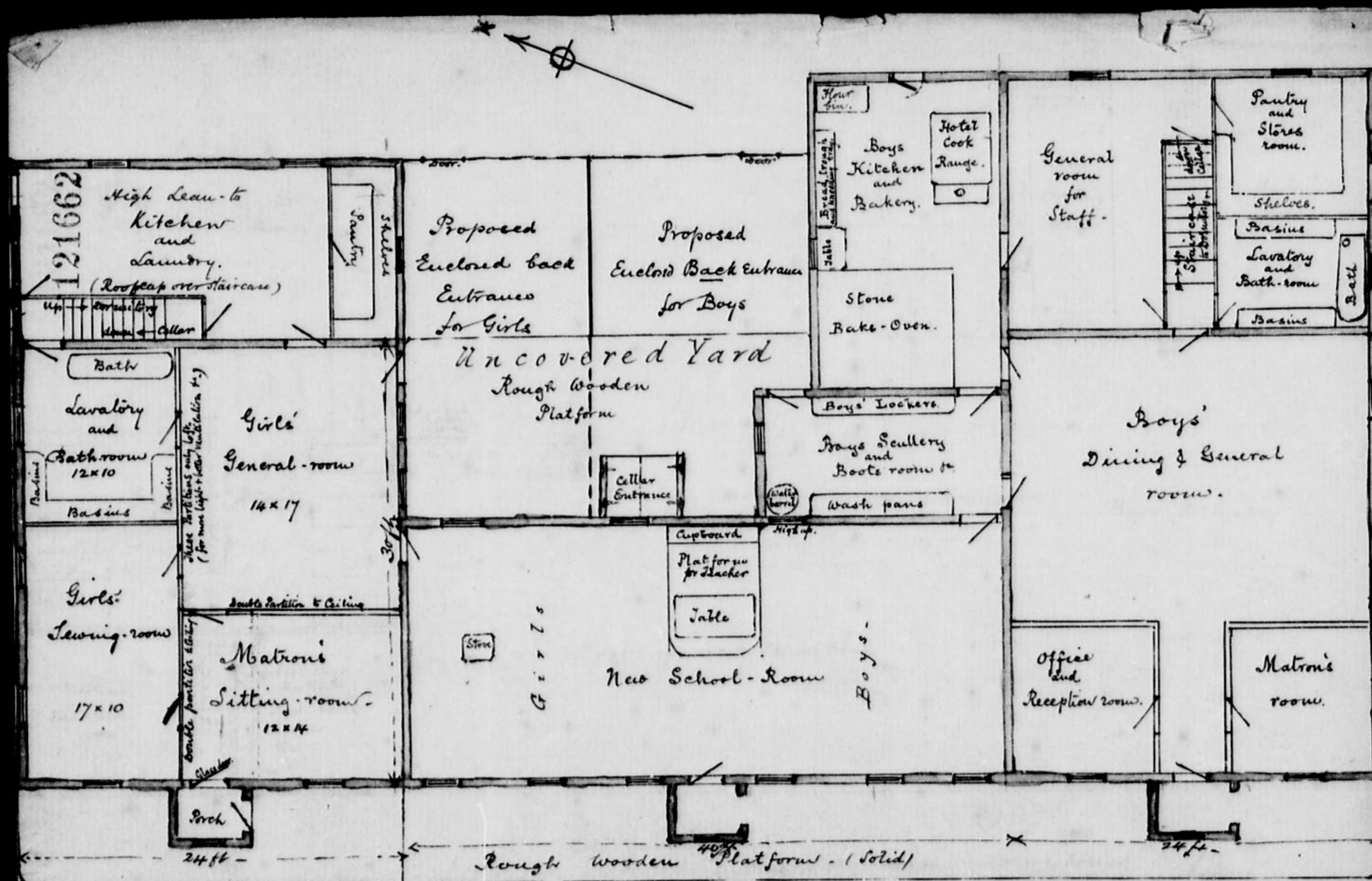

I shall be glad to submit a plan of my Hospital to you if you would care to see it. I have received advice from a leading Medical man in the Old Country in reference to its creation, & do hope that it may be of service to us in our work here.

You will be interested to know that there is a marked interest being taken in Spiritual instruction by some of our adults, & one young man of about 25 has asked for Baptism & I expect a similar request from another.

The Indians are more contented & willing to work than I have ever known them.

My dear W. Reed,

I meant to write and thank you for your letter of the 19th Oct. (written from Regina, long ere this, but have been anxious to send you a sketch of proposed Gil. Home, & an estimate by Underwood for the same, that you might be in possession of such particulars as you would need in case money should be available for such a purpose. You will notice that the lowest figure that Underwood can do it for is \$675. - I have had figures from two other men & I think that \$25⁰⁰ might be saved on Underwood's estimate, but not more. This does not include

cellar & fence & outhouse, which I would undertake myself. I should indeed be grateful if you could see your way by & by to granting the

amount of Contract (not exceeding \$675). - I can tell you what a boon such a building would be to us in our work, & to myself personally.

I hope to commence my Hospital in the Spring, & to build it without asking for any money from your Department. For this writer's

My dear Mr. Reed,

May I, without unduly encroaching upon your time, ask you whether it will be in your power to let me know definitely about ~~you~~ the proposed Girls' Home for this Reserve, within the next 4 weeks? ^{The} reason I ask is ^{I am, as you know, to be married to a lady Miss in Japan} that the excessive heat in Japan after the middle of July necessitates my leaving here by the last of May & returning by 30th July. Under these circumstances I am naturally very anxious about my Mission house, which of course I shall need by the end of July. Underwood tells me he could complete the Girls' Home in a very satisfactory manner in about 5 weeks. I am also expecting a grant from our Missionary Society to repair the Mission House which will take about a fortnight or so, so that time, as you will see, is very precious to me. If you are in a position to help us therefore sometime soon you know how grateful I shall be.

My dear Mr. Reed,

I am in somewhat of a dilemma. If you are not able to find funds out of the current fiscal year's savings - have you made any provision for the Girls Home in the estimates for the New Year? My position is just this, that I have nowhere else but the Mission where I could accommodate the girls, & though I have the same room as now available as a dormitory if necessary, I have no separate quarters for their general & dining room - nor any separate kitchen, & which is not serious, no means whatever of accommodating the Matrons. Should you therefore find it impossible to provide funds, I think it wise to advise me to let the girls go back to the Camp (which wd. be a thousand pities). I ought to hurry at once as the Matrons will require a long notice. It is unfortunate that I am obliged to start for Japan so early (30th inst) but it is unavoidable. Am I asking too much in a telegram of advice? The Matrons want to know before I leave.

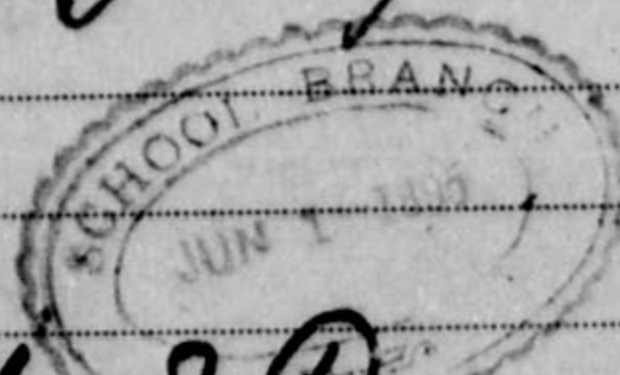

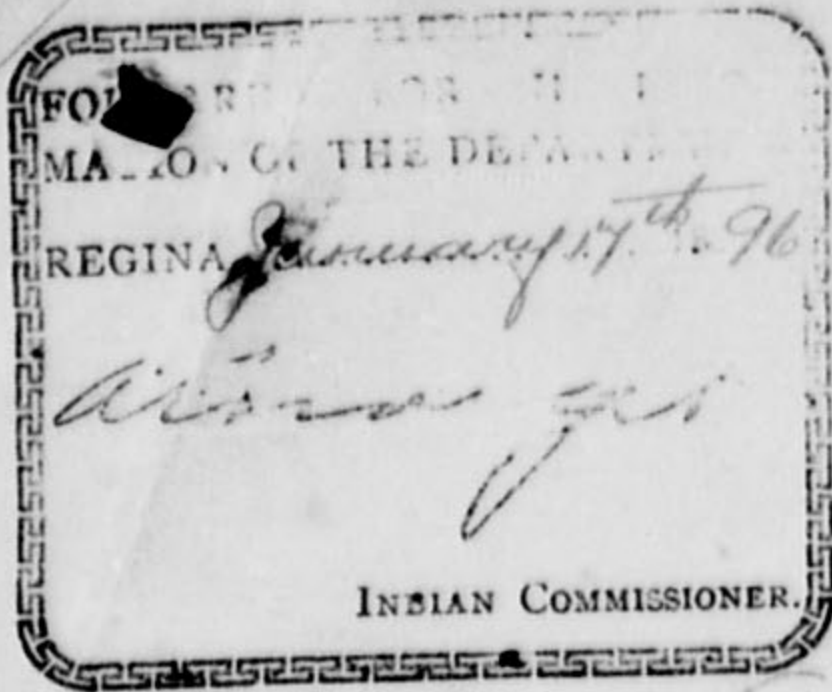

Sir:-

Referring to your Circular letter No 1221, dated the 3rd Ultio, I beg to inform you that the Sarcee Boarding School has no fire protection, except what may be afforded by a hose attached to a force pump in the Mission building, about one hundred feet distance. The hose, I am told, is not long enough to reach the school building though a stream of water can be thrown on the lower parts of the side of the school facing the Mission, the hose is without a nozzle also. If a longer hose with nozzle was on hand I believe the roof could be wet. There are only three buckets or water pails in the school and these are in constant use.

12 fire buckets have been ordered for this school.
