There is an unusually number of workers that depends on relief for the winter and there was not much to do during harvest. The crop was small, except the wheat that was fair. Therefore the Rural Municipality & Village of Lebach and Fort Snodgrass would be relieved of a certain amount of relief that would be given to some other that cannot work and needs assistance.

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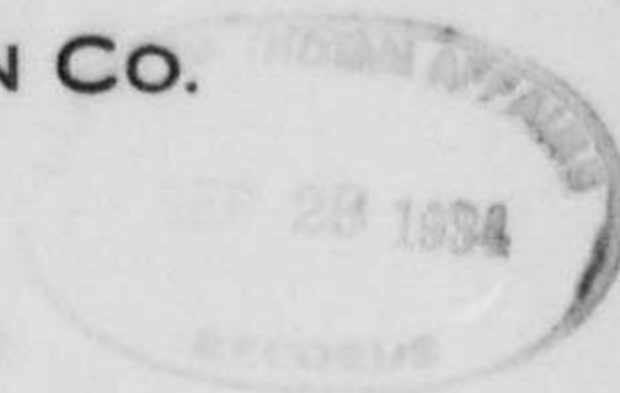

Dear Sirs:

I understand that tenders are being called for the construction of a new Indian School at Lebret, Saskatchewan, and that it is probable that the work will proceed immediately the contract has been awarded.

The Department of Public Health of this Province is endeavouring to control more closely the discharge of waste water into the Qu'Appelle Lakes and to see that suitable treatment is provided for such liquid wastes.

The discharge of waste liquids from the Lebret Industrial School has not been satisfactory for a number of years and it is the desire of the Department that provision be made when reconstructing this school for a new system of sewage treatment and disposal.

Of late years sewage from the school has been discharged through a septic tank and into an underground field which for a long period has been inoperative and the partially treated liquid has found its way out on the ground surface through a ditch into the lake.

I would be glad if you would advise the Department as to the maximum number of pupils and staff who will be using this building and I would appreciate receiving copies of any plans which have been prepared providing for an adequate and efficient system of treatment of the sewage and of the discharge of the effluent into the lake in such a manner that no possible criticism can be made.

Mr. R. H. Murray, the Director of the Division of Sanitation of this Department, would appreciate the opportunity of discussing the subject with your representative should any of your technical staff be visiting Regina.
