
This fee is not subject to the usual deduction of 10% as it is a specific arrangement for an individual job.

You are being supplied with an additional copy of this letter and it is desired that you will discuss it with the Reverend Canon Vale and Doctor Gawley. If you can make the necessary arrangements with them and if it is the opinion that the work should be taken in hand now, you need make no further report if the work is not expected to exceed three days. It is understood under this arrangement that the dentist will be called upon to spend the whole of three full long days, but it is not necessary that he should do it on three consecutive days.

In making up his accounts the dentist is only required to specify the number of days' work he does and add on the face of the account form a list of the fillings, extractions, etc. which he has done. There is no object in making a long list of the pupils' names, though the principal will, undoubtedly, wish to preserve such a record.

To make this plan a success the principal must see that the pupils are organized into proper groups so that the dentist's time will not be wasted. In most schools the medical officer carries out the preliminary inspection and the dentist is only required to do the actual work. There is room in these proposals for any minor variation of the plan proposed which will meet the local situation.

Dear Sir:

In reply to your letter of July 9th enclosing Dr. Gawley's estimate of dental work at the Chapleau Residential School, I wish to inform you of a new arrangement that the Department is bringing in for work of this kind. It has been found more satisfactory for all concerned to employ a dentist on a daily basis and the fee offered by the Department and accepted everywhere by dentists, is \$30, per day which covers professional attendance and supply of ordinary materials. The class of work required is extractions and repair of cavities with a cheaper grade of filling. The amount of work estimated by Doctor Gawley, from experience in other places, would seem to require about three days. Whether it should be done now or after the beginning of the new school year is not apparent to the Department, but might be decided between yourself and the principal of the school.

By this method in the course of a year or two the dentist finds himself able to get the children's teeth in a fairly good state of repair, after which only one or two days' work per annum is required. Many dentists have been somewhat reluctant to accept the fee offered in the beginning but after a year's trial have expressed themselves as not only satisfied but interested and anxious to co-operate in keeping up the dental condition of the pupils. Where the dentist lives a long way from the school it is the custom to pay his travelling expenses, but this would not be the case at Chapleau.

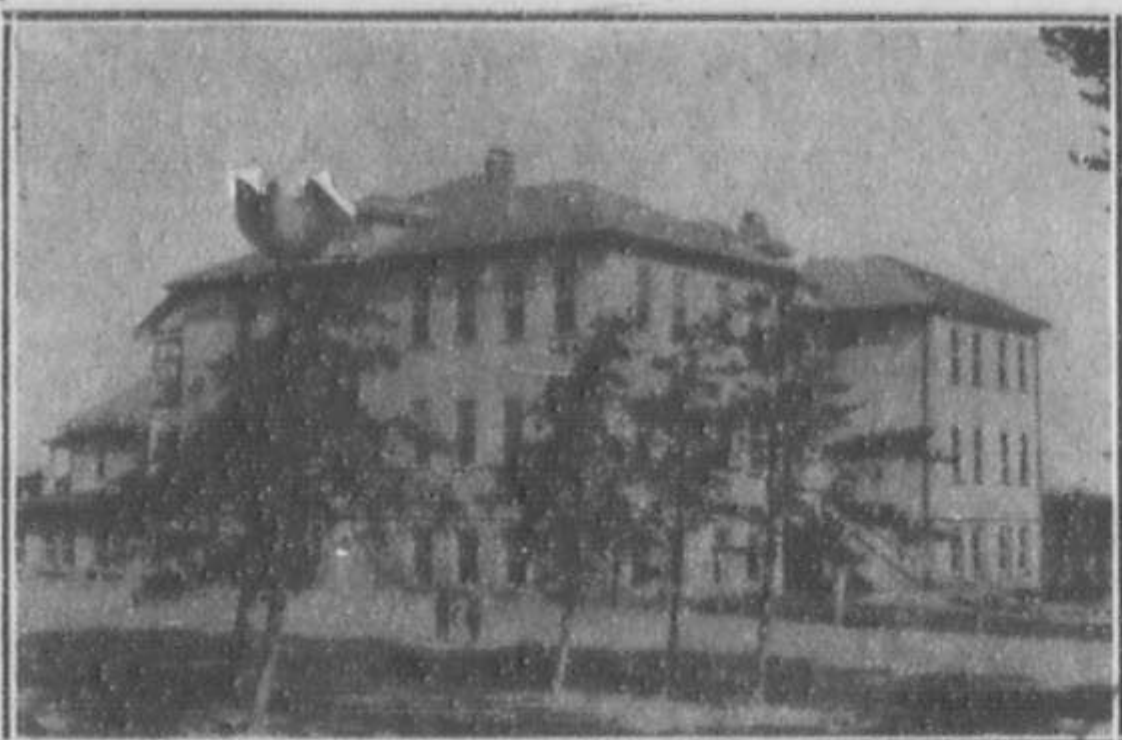

In reply to your enclosed letter from Mr. A. J. Mackenzie. I have studied it carefully and gone over the slips of the children of Chapleau School and I would make the following observations and suggestions.

I like very much the idea of attending the school children regularly each year - and I think under this arrangement it would be quite possible to handle the work in two days and would be pleased to look after them on such an arrangement.

In reference to this year's work - as you no doubt realize it is well over two years since these children have been looked after as far as teeth are concerned and thus are many fairly large cavities. I have worked it out as follows.

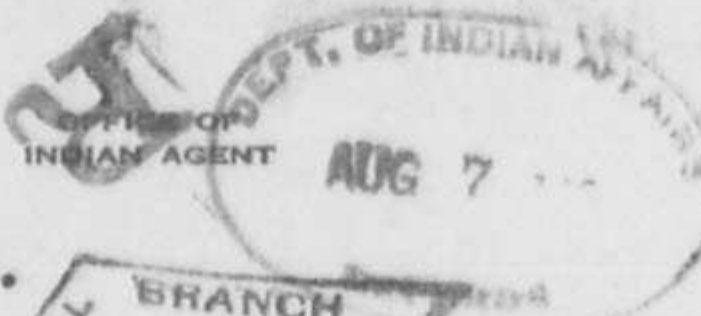

With reference to your letter of the 25th instant regarding the trouble you are having with cockroaches, I beg to say that Bulletin No. 112 of the Department of Agriculture suggests the following:

"Cockroaches may be readily controlled by means of sodium fluoride. This material should be lightly dusted in places frequented by the roaches such as about sinks, baseboards, cupboards, hot water pipes, etc. The sodium fluoride adheres to the legs and antennae of the roaches, and in cleaning themselves the insects are poisoned by it. Sodium fluoride retains its effectiveness and may be left undisturbed as long as convenient or until the cockroaches have completely disappeared. As this chemical is somewhat poisonous reasonable precautions should be taken to prevent children or domestic pets from gaining access to it.

Two other materials which form the basis of many proprietary roach powders and which often are recommended, are pyrethrum and borax. Pyrethrum insect powder is less effective than sodium fluoride, it loses its effectiveness quickly on exposure to air, and has to be used in larger quantity. Borax, also, is less satisfactory than sodium fluoride. It is easily obtainable, however, and mixed with equal parts of powdered sweet chocolate, is a fairly effective remedy. Superheating and fumigation with hydrocyanic acid gas are also effective in destroying cockroaches. In the case of hydrocyanic acid gas fumigation, however, our experiments indicate that a concentration of gas produced by using $\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. of calcium cyanide per 1,000 cubic feet, although effective against nymphs and adults, does not destroy the eggs."

The cost of the ingredients required will be quite small, and it is considered that you should purchase same locally.
