My dear Mr Reed:

Albert Fiddler, the pupil referred to in the enclosed correspondence, is a bright looking boy of 17 years of age, tall and well built. He has been in school the last ten years, seven at day and Boarding Schools and three next December in the Industrial School Regina. The two letters enclosed will give you a good idea of his proficiency in English, as they were both written by himself. He is also a fairly good carpenter; but requires a couple of years more training to make him quite proficient in his trade.

He first made application for discharge. This I refused and after a long talk with him succeeded as I thought in convincing him to stay on. The Principal and Agent were both asked to see the parents during the time that Albert would be at home with the rest of the children from Pelly and to dissuade them from insisting on his ~~standing~~ discharge.

Albert returned here the day before yesterday and

and has just brought me these letters from his parents. He is determined to go home for the Winter, despite all my efforts to the contrary. He promises faithfully to come back next spring and stay on for another term of two years. It is undoubtedly in Albert's interest that his application be resisted and I have done so firmly; but on the other hand I fear a too rigid action in his case may alter his heretofore good behaviour, if indeed he does not desert from the school.

The Principal whom I have just also seen thinks that Albert might safely be given leave for three or four months from the 1st November next. He feels quite confident from his knowledge of the character of the boy that he will come back faithfully at the expiration of his leave, if granted.

In returning the papers will you kindly let me know what I had better do.
