





I have the honor to transmit herewith in duplicate the report (No. 11) of Inspector Pragnell on his inspection on October 4th, ultimo, of the Lytton Indian Agency, B.C.

In this connection I beg to offer comment as follows:

School - St George's Indian Residential, Lytton, B.C.

Concerning the reduction of cultivated acreage and the incident reported by the Inspector of "giving up the farm known as "the 47" --, the Department will no doubt be aware, from information in its file No. 165-0-9X, that Provincial Water Licenses are held for service on Lot 47, these being C.L. 7857, C.L. 7858 and F.L. 3685, the first two licenses were issued in the name of Harry Graham (Indian Agent) in trust for the Indians, while the F.L. 3685 is in the name of the New England Company. These licenses are (understood to be) vested in the Department as a result of purchase of property from the New England Company, according to information given in the Department's letter No. 165-0-9X dated 18th February 1935. My office records are not complete as to the official transfer to the Superintendent General of Indian Affairs.

Dear Sir:

Last August you were forwarded a copy of official letter of August 2nd addressed to the Principal of St. George's Indian Residential School, with reference to the decision that has been made to discontinue farming operations by the school on Lot 47. Information on file shows that Provincial Water Licenses are held for service on Lot 47. These being C.L. 7857, C.L. 7858 and F.L. 3685. The first two Licenses were issued in the name of Harry Graham (Indian Agent) in trust for the Indians, while the F.L. 3685 is in the name of the New England Company. These Licenses are vested in the Department as a result of our taking over the property from the New England Company.

Will the discontinuance of farming operations on Lot 47 have any effect on these Water Licenses? Please discuss the matter with the Principal, Rev. A. R. Lett, and advise the Department if any action will be required.

On May 4 Mr. S. J. Munroe, District Engineer, Canadian National Railways, called on me in connection with the damage claim of that Railway against the Indian Affairs Branch due to a washout in their track at Mile 95.97 near Lytton, B.C.

During the course of the discussion with Mr. Munroe, he asked what the Indian Affairs Branch proposed to do in the future to avoid any recurrence in the overflow of the irrigation flume. I assured him that the Indian Affairs Branch would continue to carefully patrol their irrigation ditch and flume from Botanie Lake to Lytton.

I think it desirable, therefore, that this should be drawn to the attention of Mr. Indian Agent Strang, whom, I am confident, will see to it that the closest possible inspection of these works will be maintained throughout the whole of each irrigation season.


