

We now have final accounts covering the above contract and find that we will be short of funds. The present standing of the project is as follows:

Accounts on hand for payment	\$3,808.88
Holdback due Contractor on 10 percent fee.	<u>\$ 19.08</u>
Total	\$3,827.96

We have received \$2,000.00 out of the estimated requirements for 1948-49 of \$3,850.00. There is a balance on hand of \$1,238.98. Our requirements will therefore be as follows:

Balance on hand	\$1,238.98
Additional funds required	\$2,588.98

The minimum requirement is \$2,588.98, but we should have \$2,700.00 to take care of any engineering expenses which may be outstanding. We have the Contractor's final accounts for payment, and would appreciate hearing from you at an early date. Payments against the contract (Engineering expenses not included) will total \$5,906.90 from the beginning of work in February to completion this month.

Re: Irvine and Reeves Contract,  
Plumbing and Heating Repairs,  
Alberni Indian Residential School.

A contract was let to Messrs. Irvine and Reeves of Port Alberni, B.C., early in March of this year for plumbing and heating repairs, Alberni Indian Residential School. Efforts to secure a firm price contract were unsuccessful due to the fact that in repair jobs of this nature it is difficult to determine, beforehand, the exact amount of work necessary. There were two bids on a cost plus basis, and upon the advice of our engineer, Mr. Gurney, it was decided to let the contract to Irvine and Reeves on the basis of cost plus ten per cent (10%). On February 19th of this year, a wire was received from our engineer, Mr. Gurney, stating that Irvine and Reeves estimated the cost would be \$4,500.00 and the contract was drawn up on the basis of that amount.

Section 3, Clause (a) of the Contract reads as follows:

"To pay the Contractor the cost of the work as defined in Schedule A hereto attached, which cost as so defined is hereinafter referred to as the cost of the work, but unless authorized by the Minister not to exceed the sum of \$4,500.00, which sum is hereinafter referred to as the estimated cost of the work".

We now have final accounts from the Contractor showing that work performed by Irvine and Reeves will total \$5,906.90. The increased cost is due to factors outside the control of either the Contractor or this Division. There was a sharp rise in tradesmen's wage rates, and in the cost of material subsequent to awarding the contract, as well as additional items which could not be anticipated but which became evident as the work progressed.

We will therefore require approval for the amount of the increased cost (\$1,406.90) over the original estimated cost of \$4,500.00 before final payment can be made on the Contract.

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

THE GOVERNOR GENERAL IN COUNCIL

The undersigned has the honour to report:

That in the 1947-48 estimates of the Indian Affairs Branch, Department of Mines and Resources, funds were provided for carrying out repairs and replacements to the plumbing and domestic water systems in the Indian Residential School at Alberni, British Columbia;

That drawings and specifications were prepared by the Department, and calls for tenders were issued, as a result of which two tenders were received, both quoting a price of cost plus ten per cent (10%) for materials and labour. It was recognized that due to the character of the work, the total cost would not be known until operations were underway;

That upon analysis, it was considered to be in the best public interest to accept the tender submitted by Messrs. Irvine and Reeves of Port Alberni, British Columbia, whose approximate total cost of the work was Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$4,500.00);

That approval of the acceptance of the said tender was issued by the predecessor of the undersigned, and a contract was awarded to Messrs. Irvine and Reeves limiting the cost of the work to the approximate estimate of Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$4,500.00) plus a fee of ten per cent (10%);

That as the work progressed, additional essential repair items became necessary which together with increases in the cost of labour and materials, and including the Contractor's fee of ten per cent (10%) has increased the cost of repairs to the school to Five Thousand, Nine Hundred and Six Dollars and Ninety Cents (\$5,906.90) which, after making provision for supervision, will involve a total expenditure to the Department of Six Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$6,300.00);

The undersigned, therefore, has the honour to recommend that the work having been completed by the contractor, and accepted as satisfactory by the Departmental supervising officer, that authority be granted for payment of the additional cost not exceeding One Thousand Three Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$1,350.00), the approximate amount by which the total cost exceeded the expenditure originally approved by the then Minister of Mines and Resources, the said additional expenditure to be met from the appropriate vote of the Indian Affairs Branch 1948-49 estimates (Vote 772, Indian Education) Department of Mines and Resources.

Re: Equipment of Alberni Indian Residential School

Upon leaving the Alberni school, Miss McCready wrote and asked if it would be possible for an increase grant to be given to this school to cover the salary of a second cook in the main kitchen, as one cook is doing the cooking for 240 children and finds it difficult to keep the necessary food records needed in the survey because of lack of time. It is almost impossible for one cook to prepare the food for this number of people without any extra duties.

There is a bread slicer in the school but it is antiquated and unsatisfactory; thus it is not used and the bread is sliced by hand. The slices are not uniform in size and therefore it is difficult to keep proper records of size of serving of bread eaten.

An electric mixer for a school this size is very desirable for mixing cakes, cookies, mashing vegetables, etc. It is impossible for women or children to mix or beat the quantity of food that is required for 240 children.

I believe Miss Lock spoke to you about these requirements on the telephone last week. No doubt you have given them consideration and will be writing us regarding them shortly.



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


